



## The Two-Time Loser

It is something of a change to find pur reading of the book reviews, at at least one of the military hisportions of World War II - one Alan Clark, author of "Barbarossa; The Rus-gian-German Conflict, 1941-1945," --- has been obstinate and original enough to try to defent Hitler in his rolal of

After World War II had ended in a German defeat, the professional military caste of Germany almost inevitably began the construction of its own alibi. After World War I, the alibi was, of course, either the Kaiser, and his poor military judgments, or the civil politicians, who supposedly stabbed the German army in the back.

This time, with that obvious madman. Hitler, in the story, the construction of the alibi was easier. The German generals could have won the war, if they hadn't been frustrated by Hitler's insane military decisions. This was the theory Barry Goldwater seemed to be buying, in his ill-fated interview with that German magazine a year ago this summer. And it is a theory just about everybody else has seemed to endorse; too, leaving the famous German general staff and its reputation almost uninvolved in the great defeat.

From what we gather from reading about Mr. Clark's book, he doesn't succeed in making any flawless general out of Hitler. We doubt that anybody could do that. Some of his hunches and instincts may have been infernally clever, and others may have been dis-

What we propose as a judgment, however, is this: That the German general staff could have lost and would have lost World War II even without

The German general staff could have and would have lost the war all by itself because losing wars is the natural and inevitable talent of anything so highly organized and concentrated and dedicated to rule and rote.

Such a sweeping judgment, which could be austained, we think, by analysis of the conduct and outcome of two world wars, is a possibility to keep in toying with the idea of introducing a similar centralized efficiency into our own military set-up, or begin to be fascinated by the idea, any time now, of making a new generation of German generalship the guiding spirit for giving training and strategy to NATO forces in Europe.

### Corbusier's Windows

All the hymns of praise for his greatness and freedom of concept as an architect which have greeted the death of Le Corbusier raise the envy of ordinary mortals who are seldom privileged to leave much more than a single gravestone lingering after them. An architect has his chance to leave

his mark, his individuality, the stamp of his own particular genius upon the ages. And, if he selects the right building material in the right climate, and doesn't run into too many renewal About Corbusier, there is no doub!

that he did have freedom of thought and concept in his designing and in his theories, and no doubt at all that he did more to inspire contemporary architects than any other person. It is also magnificently true that, in the relatively few instances in which he himself was able to get his theories translated into buildings, the result has been beautiful.

But, if we are not mistaken, we have detected that, in some of the masterpieces of his early maturity, there is a concentration upon maximum light, through that maximum use of glass for which he was once famous, and that, in some of the masterpieces he created when he was at the full tide of his powers there is almost solid concrete with the only windows included resembling the apertures in the walls of

medieval castles. So it seems that the great master specialized in the maximum window and the minimum window inside the same career, and could thus be accused, by those with stilted, prefabricated minds, of some inconsistency.

Which time was he right? Such a question is impertinent, and the real point is that he made beautiful use of large windows and beautiful use of small windows and, being an architect, was able to leave behind him rather permanent memorials to his own devotion to each.







Community Colleges yesterday informed the three state community colleges that they have been accepted into the state system or higher education. The decision for acceptance had been made the previous day at a mesting of the Commission for Higher Education.

Fiscal responsibility for the thirtse schools was technically saumed on Sept. 1 by the State of Connecticut as a result of the meeting. The state is now empowered to acquire all assets, debts, obligations, liabilities, property rights and actual property of the schools.

Further overtones of the transfer include the provision that the state treasurer shall succeed to the administration of any trust created for the benefit of any of the colleges, that the governor shall approve the transfer of employee into the state system and that the governing authority of each college shall present a proposed educational program for the soming school year within the limits of the budget voted by
