times se for from the sun as the earth? And if the sun is the source of this radiation, shouldn't we on earth receive much more radiation than is received on Mars? And if this is true, why does Mars receive so much more radiation than do

The answers to these questions involve the atmosphere of the planet. Results telemetered back by Mariner IV indicated that the atmosphere of Mars has a surface pressure of about one per cent that of the earth. If this one per cent recording is correct, then the surface pressure on Mars is comparable to the atmosphere at a terrestrial altitude of 100,000 feet. The dense atmosphere of the earth intercepts the high-energy

primary cosmic rays and by suc-cessive bombardments in the atmosphere, may give rise to a million secondary cosmic rays which penetrate the atmosphere and come down to the surface to impact all living things. As you read this your body is subject to a large number of secondary cosmic rays, but their energies are low compared to energies are low compared t ate so many secondaries, for there are not enough air par

ticles to offer targets to the primaries. This means there are not enough particles to absorb

this vast energy in the primarie and the result is that those par ticles which strike the surfac Martian atmosphere, instead of acting as a shield against cosmic to augment the volume of high

> profound effect on the potential life on the planet, for with the high-powered radiation reach-ing the surface of Mars, organisms on the surface may have evolved quite differently than the life we find on the earth. The vegetation we believe might be on Mars—the messes and lichens-may have developd an immunity to the energetic radiations which impact the Martian surface and with this Martian surface and with this immunity may come a freedom from mutations due to previous high radiation dosages.

> Scientists believe it is possible that life forms on Mars may have evolved quite differently from those on earth, even to possessing a different genetic and cellular base structurs.

> While we have been talking primarily of the cosmic rays, the same thing holds true for the intermittent flows of high energy protons coming from the

sun. Because these are radia-tions, they too can affect mu-tations, which could give rise to life forms different than those There is one sobering over-tone to this problem of intense be landing on Mars to explore the planet. Curiously, these astronauts will have to be pro-vided with more protection than we furnish them in explor-

If these radiations are detected by Martian orbiters, then instrumented probles must be landed to provide some quantitative indication as to the intensity of this radiation, so that when a manned landing is attempted the astronauts will be protected from this hazard. It is conceivable that one of the first objects to be landed on Mars will be a radiation shelter
