Pleas Court Upholds TPC

The Town Planning Commission was upheld in Hartford County Court of Common Pleas yesterday on its March 15 decision, granting Chorges Motors a change to Business Zone II for three parcels, including its present showroom and garage, on the west side of Oakland St. Judge William Tierney denied an appeal brought by six residents of Oakland and Edward Sts., and ruled that the change from Residence Zone A was not spot zoning, would not create an increased traffic problem, would not reduce the value of surrounding property, and would not interfere with the town's comprehensive plan. Early in 1964, the Court of Common Pleas had granted an appeal by the area's residents, and had reversed a decision of the town's Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA), which had granted Chorges a variance to enlarge its service area. Chorges, six months later, applied to the ZBA for another variance, under which the building was turned down. It subsequently applied for and was granted the zone change. The properties for which the zone change was approved are owned by Louis Chorges and by Chester and Charlotte Brunner, and include Chorges Motors and the double building to the north, formerly a combined market and residential dwelling. The town was represented in the court hearing by Town Counsel Irving Aronson, Chorges by Atty. Philip Bayer, and the appellants by Atty. John O'Connor.

Firemen made nine rescue calls last month. There was one false box alarm.

Bypass Center if You Can During Construction Work

Motorists who habitually pass through the Center, where Main, Center and E. Center Sts. meet, have been asked by Police Chief James Reardon to use an alternate route for at least one week, starting with Tuesday morning. Construction crews, working around the clock, will widen two manholes, at the southeast section of the intersection, and will extend a trench, for underground lines of the Southern New England Co., which is building an addition to its telephone exchange on E. Center St. The manholes will be enlarged to the size of a room, and passage of cars at that point will be limited to one narrow lane, during construction. Reardon said that he will have two men on duty to control traffic with the aid of traffic lights. Even with working around the clock, the construction will take at least a week, and more if the weather and unusual problems interfere.

And Air Conditioning New Heating Plant Asked for Town Hall

A \$50,000 controlled heating and air conditioning system will be installed in the Municipal Building in the spring, if the board of directors approves a recommendation, made by Public Works Director Walter Fuss after a survey made by Jerome F. Mueller and Associates, a Hartford consulting engineering firm.

Fuss, in recommending the \$50,000 appropriation, has presented two alternatives: (1) a \$40,000 expenditure for heating only, with provision made for future air conditioning, and (2) a \$20,000 expenditure for heating only, with no provision made for future air conditioning.

All of the sums include the cost of installation, survey and engineering fees, and contingencies. The combined heating and air conditioning system, estimated to cost \$42,000, would involve the removal of the building's existing cast iron radiators and the installation of combination units, with individual room control.

Fuss said that an alternative to the combined system would be the installation of air conditioning in window units in each office. He said that although that method might cost a little less than the combined heating-air conditioning installation, it would detract from the attractiveness of the building.

Fuss strongly urges the board of directors to approve some method for the renovation of the heating system and recommends that the work, if approved, be started in May, at the end of the upcoming heating season. He states that construction time would be one or two months, and that arrangements will have to be made to provide office space for the occupants of each room, one at a time, as the work is done.

Rock Salt Bids Due on Sept. 22

The town is preparing itself for a short Indian Summer and a long winter as it opens bidding for about 400 tons of rock salt and about 50 tons of calcium chloride. Both minerals are used to melt ice. The bid opening will be at 11 a.m., Sept. 22, in the hearing room of the Municipal Building. Delivery will be to the Jarvis railroad siding on Center St., or, in emergency situations, to the town's sand pit on Tolland Tpke.

## At the Post For Season's Horse Race

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Starting time for network television's great sweepstakes is a little more than a week away, a horse race in every way but one: The winners will not be really known until some time in November.

For the first time, the three major networks will line up all their new and returning shows at the post for a simultaneous start. Procedure in other years has been for each network to appropriate one September-week as its own premiere period.

How will NBC's "The Wackiest Ship in the Army?" do against CBS' "Candid Camera" and "What's My Line?" which have held the Sunday night rail position in the Nielsen ratings for several seasons? Does ABC's "Legend of Jesse James" have a chance pitted against such veteran ratings champs as "The Lucy Show" on CBS and "Dr. Kildare" on NBC?

Two weeks from tonight, viewers are going to be forced to make a blind choice among three shows making their debuts at the same time. The longest odds, of course, benefit the new entries placed in competition with last year's winners — the shows pitted against NBC's "Bonanza," CBS' "Gomer Pyle" and ABC's "Bewitched," to mention the three series which won, placed and showed in most of the Nielsen results.

Post-position handicapping, however, can be as dangerous as any other method of picking TV winners. Thus, there is always a chance that this year's "Gidget" can wind up in front of "Beverly Hillsbillies," or "Honey West" can overtake "Gomer Pyle" — not much of a chance, but it is always an interesting bet.

Series actors worry almost as much about the position of their shows in the network schedule as they do about their lines. One of the season's big threats is ABC's "Peyton Place," which has recently been expanded to three episodes a week — with every one listed on the Nielsen top-10 chart.

Network executives, whose fate hangs on the Nielsen reports of audience interest, expect it will take the audience several weeks to look over the entries and place their viewing bets — so the early November results will be the only ones that really pay off.

NEW YORK (NEA) — When a long-run television series like "77 Sunset Strip" goes off the air, and one of its stars, Roger Smith, doesn't show up on other shows, fans begin to wonder, "Whatever happened to him?"

In the case of Smith, a lot has happened, all of it good and all of it making him richer. It just hasn't been as public as television.

Next season, Roger will return to the home screens, in the title role of "Mr. Roberts," the NBC color series set for Friday nights at 9:30 (the same time and day 77 Sunset Strip had).

Between "Strip" and "Roberts," he has toured the country in stock, in roles ranging from the Witch Boy in "Dark of the Moon," to mother's boy Albert in "Bye-Bye Birdie." And he has launched a very successful night club career.

Smith says he was never much of a night clubber, and he had no ambitions for entertaining in that field, figuring to be successful you had to be a Sinatra. "But you forget a lot of people make a good living in clubs who are not Sinatra."

After 77 Sunset Strip went off, he went on the road in stock, and found that in small towns people expected him to make curtain speeches.

"I got a few laughs, so I began to make notes. One night a woman who owns a restaurant and motel in Milwaukee said she had been looking for an act, to establish an entertainment policy. I wasn't enthusiastic. Later, I was in Cleveland, and she came to see me again. I had a week to kill and she offered me room and board and a split on the profits. I agreed, with the stipulation that I could leave after the second night if I wasn't any good."

The fact that Roger was very good is proved by the fact that the club he launched is now one of the major bookings in Milwaukee, and regularly headlines entertainers of the John

Gary-Jack Jones ilk. You can't get likier than that.

### Teen-ager's Lucy

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Bob Swenseny, actor turned director, has taken over the reins of "The Patty Duke Show" now that the ABC comedy series has moved its production base from New York to Hollywood.

"I was interested in doing the series because of the talent I had seen in the 'The Miracle Worker,' he said. "And because I had a theory that Patty Duke is to teen-age girls what Lucy Ball is to housewives. She gets involved in all sorts of things they wish they could be mixed up in."

## Behind the Spy Is a Prop Man

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — The real and unsung costars of many new television series in the coming season will be the studio prop men in the gimmick shows.

The writers think up the situations, the actors play them out. But it is the prop man with his ingenuity and trunk of visual tricks who makes things work.

Jimmy Harris, prop man of NBC's new "Get Smart," has had his inventive talents strained to fill orders for the

sight gags that abound in this secret agent spoof.

It was Harris who reconstructed a man's shoe so that it contained a secret telephone under the retractable sole and heel. Secret agent Smart — played by Don Adams — is a communications nut, so Harris also has had to build concealed phones in a flower pot, a pair of eyeglasses, a wallet, a belt buckle, a garter, a bed post and a cigarette lighter — as well as turn a normal telephone into a lighter.

His source of materials, Harris confessed, is a toy shop specializing in do-it-yourself miniature models of cars and planes.

"Hub caps make dandy miniature microphones and the wheels do very nicely for

bugging devices," Harris explained.

He visited a hardware store when he had to fill an order to build a pair of "wall-climbing shoes" for Smart. He merely attached a half-dozen outside rubber suction cups to the metal foot platform of a pair of ice skates.

Other assignments are easier: An old railroadman's pocket watch, found in a pawnshop, was easily converted into a secret television set.

The intrepid hero of CBS' James Bond spoof, a period piece called "The Wild, Wild West," does not present any electronic challenges to the company property department. However, they had to come up with an undersized Derringer to hide in the hero's boot, smoke pellets to be concealed in his gun holster and a pool cue that converts instantly into a sword.

For secret agent James T. West (Robert Conrad), the prop man provided some springs and tricky releases so that when a gun is needed the thing shoots down his sleeve into his hand almost as fast as a bullet.

Amos Burke, the girl-chasing, murderer-catching cop who becomes ABC's "Amos Burke, Secret Agent" this season will use such ultra sophisticated devices as a piece of explosive wire woven inconspicuously into his belt, ready for use in blasting open locked steel doors and other such everyday situations.

"You can't imagine how pleasant it is to work with a washed face and have a rug under your feet," he said. "And with girls. There is something dead about working for seven years with a male cast."

Don't get the idea that Fleming is complaining. He seems to be one of the best-adjusted actors around. He didn't even mind being dropped from "Rawhide," although it meant the loss of a tidy fortune.

Fleming admitted that he entered the series haphazardly. After years of median success on Broadway, he decided to chuck the works and head for the Pacific Isles he had known during the war. But Hollywood kept delaying his departure with acting jobs. One was in the pilot of a Western series.

"I figured nothing would come of it," he recalled. "The first script was aimed at the guest stars, and I was only one of eight regulars. I was astounded to see the final version and find Clint Eastwood and I were the stars."

"Still, I never thought it would sell. CBS couldn't give the show away, finally put it on the air in mid-season with half-sponsorship. Within a month sponsors were in line to sign up."

Six and a half years later, it looked as if "Rawhide" had come to the end of its dusty trail. CBS announced the series was being dropped, then a change of management reversed the decision.

"At first I decided I wouldn't continue with the show for a million dollars," said Fleming. "But then they came up with a deal that virtually amounted to a million dollars. I had to reconsider."

Fleming told the network he would be willing to continue, but then the bosses apparently had second thoughts. It was decided to continue "Rawhide" with Clint as solo star.

"That's perfectly understandable," said the understanding Eric. It's the natural progression of a television series to save money.

"I'm learning to live again," he said. "I'm getting back to the things that interest me — art, writing, oceanography, fishing. This picture came along, and I might do one in Europe, where "Rawhide" was even more popular."

"But most of all, I want to get back to those islands. But when I go this time, I will go to stay."
