After 7 Years with Cowboys Fleming Works with Girls

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Viewers of the long-run Western "Rawhide" will be wondering why costar Eric Fleming went thataway. Like most matters in television, it was a question of money. The ruggedly handsome actor can be found these days at MGM, without the side burn and shaggy hair he sported in "Rawhide." He is well clipped and tailored for his role in the new Doris Day comedy, "Glass Bottom Boat."

"You can't imagine how pleasant it is to work with a washed face and have a rug under your feet," he said. "And with girls. There is something deadly about working for seven years with a male cast."

Don't get the idea that Fleming is complaining. He seems to be one of the best-adjusted actors around. He didn't even mind being dropped from "Rawhide," although it meant the loss of a tidy fortune.

Fleming admitted that he entered the series haphazardly. After years of median success on Broadway, he decided to chuck the works and head for the Pacific Isles he had known during the war. But Hollywood kept delaying his departure with acting jobs. One was in the pilot of a Western series.

"I figured nothing would come of it," he recalled. "The first script was aimed at the guest stars, and I was only one of eight regulars. I was astounded to see the final version and find Clint Eastwood and I were the stars."

"Still, I never thought it would sell. CBS couldn't give the show away, finally put it on the air in mid-season with half-sponsorship. Within a month sponsors were in line to sign up."

Six and a half years later, it looked as if "Rawhide" had come to the end of its dusty trail. CBS announced the series was being dropped, then a change of management reversed the decision.

"At first I decided I wouldn't continue with the show for a million dollars," said Fleming. "But then they came up with a deal that virtually amounted to a million dollars. I had to reconsider."

Fleming told the network he would be willing to continue, but then the bosses apparently had second thoughts. It was decided to continue "Rawhide" with Clint as solo star.

"That's perfectly understandable," said the understanding Eric. It's the natural progression of a television series to save money.

"I'm learning to live again," he said. "I'm getting back to the things that interest me — art, writing, oceanography, fishing. This picture came along, and I might do one in Europe, where 'Rawhide' was even more popular."

"But most of all, I want to get back to those islands. But when I go this time, I will go to stay."

India reported Pakistani planes hit "civilian areas" in Amritsar, largest city in Punjab State adjacent to Kashmir where fighting was raging on the ground.

These reports showed the air war had spread 1,000 miles eastward from Kashmir and border areas of India and Pakistan to East Pakistan and eastern India.

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP)—U.N. Secretary-General U Thant made plans today to fly to India and Pakistan to seek an end to the fighting there. He was expected to leave tonight.

The Security Council unanimously called Monday night on both governments to cease hostilities and asked Thant "to exert every possible effort" to gain that objective.

The peace mission is Thant's second such trip since he became secretary-general Nov. 3, 1961. His first took him to Havana in October 1962, during a U.S.-Cuban crisis.

The resolution also asked Thant to strengthen the 45-man U.N. military observer group in Kashmir.

Thant told the council he deplored "the continuation and broadening of the fighting between India and Pakistan over Kashmir."

U.S., Saigon Launch New Major Strike

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—U.S. Marines launched a major assault today on a peninsula along the South China Sea, but at day's end reported no major contact with Communist guerrillas.

A U.S. military spokesman in Saigon reported that a U.S. Marine unit used tear gas in another action Sunday as the "most harmless method" to remove women and children from tunnels where Viet Cong suspects were believed hiding.

The civilians—along with the Communist suspects—were removed from tunnels and caves near Qui Nhon, 250 miles northeast of Saigon, the spokesman said. He said they suffered nothing more than crying from the effects of the tear gas.

Of today's big assault, 20 miles south of Chu Lai, on the Batangan peninsula, a Marine spokesman said:

"We have not located any of the Viet Cong units reported in the area. Indications are right now they may have gone."

Flooding Chases Omaha Citizens

OMAHA, Neb. (AP)—Thousands of Omaha residents were routed from bed early today as a pair of suburban streams rose after a night of storms.

Quickly organized Civil Defense forces removed hundreds to higher ground after the Weather Bureau advised evacuation of the Papio and Little Papio basins.

By 8 a.m. the floodwaters were generally receding on the two Papio creeks, which meander in a southerly direction along Omaha's thickly populated western edge.

In June 1964, a flash flood on the two streams took seven lives.

When sirens shrieked a warning about 3 a.m., many persons left without urging.

"We're pretty whistle-shy out here," commented a veteran of earlier floods after the sirens sounded.

Science Teaching Revolution Atoms Going to Junior High

EDITOR'S NOTE—The curriculum reformers changing the course of U.S. education have concentrated much of their efforts on the teaching of science. There has not been unanimous acceptance of their work as the following first of five articles on the revolution in the 3Rs shows.

By G. K. HODENFIELD AP Education Writer WATERBURY, Mass. (AP)—The house of science the curriculum reformers have built for the nation's high schools may have been set down on very shaky foundations.

There's too big a gap between the general science that most youngsters get in junior high and the biology, chemistry and physics that many of them now study in senior high, says Dr. Uri Haber-Schaim.

Haber-Schaim is directing the development of a new introductory physical science course. It is aimed primarily at the 8th and 9th grades, and its goal is to give the pupils a better preparation for what's to follow.

"This course also will teach English, although that is not its primary function."

"Kids today can't seem to read a short, concise paragraph and know what it means. They have trouble answering a question which requires more than a one-word answer."

"In this course they'll have to keep complete, legible notes when they do an experiment—they may have to refer in March to an experiment they did in October."

"The big thing that's needed in science education, Haber-Schaim said, is to get the students personally involved."

"Often their earlier training has given students the idea that science is remote from real life and from anything they can do. The standard phrase in many textbooks is that 'Scientists have found such and such, and Scientists do so and so,' and the teacher insists that the student memorize it."
