There is even more of this surprising unanimity, where the war between Pakistan and India is concerned. Peple who believe in the United Nations and people who usually pretend they think the world can do without the United Nations both accept the idea that the United Nations should take this war as its problem, and both are prayerfully hoping that United Nasons diplomacy can find some formula which will work toward cease-fire.

There is also agreement on some general principles. A good many people seem to understand that, even if such a war could be fought to a victory, it would leave everybody worse off than they were before it began. It would prove nothing except that one nation had proved better than another in the techniques of death.

It would prove nothing about the people involved except that they have the normal and too often-tested capacity of the human being to combine vague and beautiful aspiration toward the stars with the extreme degradation of impersonalized brutality.

There are, we suppose, several reasons why everybody is suddenly able to see this one particular conflict with such clarity and realism. For one thing, it is somebody else's

For a second thing, it does not volve a struggle between rival ideological or political systems. Both India and Pakistan were struggling to be democ-

For a third reason, the religious and races which are inevitably involved in are not religions or races which are close to us.

For those outside such associations and involvements, then, the war between India and Pakistan is a stupid-

All this is very interesting, and un ferstandable, once we look at it. When, on the other hand, the war is your own war, and when the war clearly involves an ideology in which you yourself believe, and has overones of race and religion which touch you, the same kind of dispassionate and realistic judgment becomes a more difficult thing.

It is almost as if the war in India and the war in Vietnam had nothing in But that mythical observer from

Mars would probably find they had almost everything in common. He might be sure what precise mixture of motivations and challenges was to be found in each war. But he would certainly proclaim that

each had one common denominatorthat of a confrontation between two rival powers filled with an instinctive urge to match strength and dispute

And he would undoubtedly be able, with that cool and advanced Martian legic of his, to proclaim that both wars and any wars-were stupidities.

Great In His Time

If Dr. Albert Schweitzer had died in 1950, there would have been no petty blots on the reverence the first half of

But he lived on into the second half of the twentieth century. And, before he died, some spokesmen for, some members of that second hall of the twentieth century dared criticize Dr. Schweitzer's performance and career by standards which tried to make him something less of a hero, much
