### South Windsor 30% Water Rate Increase Denied by Utility Agency

The Public Utilities Commission (PUC) has denied the request of the Connecticut Water Company to raise the water rates in town.

The commission ruled that the proposed rate increase requested by the water company on March 22 is in excess of that which is just and reasonable.

The Connecticut Water Company has asked permission of the commission to raise its rates for industrial and commercial service by 30 per cent and public and private fire protection service by 40 per cent.

At the hearing, which was continued through four sessions and concluded May 10, a company spokesman said the firm is involved in a program of plant expansion and improvement.

New sources of water are required by the company in order to provide for an increase in the number of customers as well as in increased demands from present customers, the spokesman said.

The company said water consumption has increased in the past five years from an average of 186 gallons per day per person to a present average daily use of 207 gallons per capita.

To meet increased demand and anticipated needs, the Connecticut Water Co. has been constructing wells, standpipes and elevated tanks, and other structures to supply water to an increasing number of customers.

The water company claims the pipe and other property purchased constitutes a utility system and (as provided in the DUE) the commission's system of accounts should be based on the books at the estimated cost to the firm's first dedicated property to public service.

### Columbia The Level's up; And All's Well That Ends Well

Donald Tuttle, chairman of the board of education and of the Porter School building committee, said today that water from Columbia Lake has not been used to fill the school building, despite reports to the contrary.

During the mid-summer drought, after the school addition was begun, architect Roy Ferguson suggested that the water be used to fill the school building. However, after much consultation, it was agreed to adopt a "wait and see" policy.

Over the Labor Day weekend, contractor Joseph Nasti says, the well was run continuously from Friday night to Tuesday morning, and reached another well.

Tuttle, when notified, said he felt the well, given time, would rather wait it out than dump in the water. Instead, it was termed a "satisfactory recovery" by Tuttle and Ferguson.

The well remained at that level Thursday after more than 400 children had used the school facilities. Tuttle said the construction work now in progress will not draw anywhere near the amount of water used this summer.

Shaw stressed that the police union does not use the strike as a tool. If a police union called a strike, "its charter would be suspended."

"If we ever used a strike, many of our friends would suffer because of the lack of police protection. The strength of the union, we have found, is close cooperation with members of the Hartford Central Labor Council." He added that the council promotes collective action.

"In addition, Shaw said, the council is interested in the promotion process as regards the merit system, as that the strike member can progress in his merit rather than on his political ability, and this political ability is what is needed in some cases for a man to progress."

### Hebron Students Back at School; Board Adjusts Its Budget

All classes at Hebron elementary school started Wednesday, with pupils taking classes in the classrooms to which they were assigned last June, in order to avoid confusion at school opening time.

clude ten regular classrooms, two kindergarten rooms, administrative and special services rooms, special library space, and a multi-purpose room. This arrangement is expected to solve the present kindergarten room shortage; space is now being rented at the Hebron First Congregational Church for a third kindergarten class.

A request from out-of-town residents to send kindergarten pupils to the local class this year has been voted down by the board.

**School Budget Cut**  
The Hebron board of education has approved the 1965-66 fiscal year, to the \$1,000 total approved by the June budget meeting. A reduction of \$80, in order to make the cut, instructional salaries were reduced by \$450 and home tutoring by \$200.

### Tolland County St. Onge Wants Earlier Mailing Of U.S. Checks

Rep. William L. St. Onge, who represents Tolland County as a member of the Second Congressional District, has introduced a bill that would require monthly social security checks to be delivered the first day of the month, instead of the third day.

Rep. St. Onge says that the change would prevent unduly delays in the delivery of social security checks that result when the checks are mailed on a Sunday or a legal holiday. The checks would be delivered the next day, under the provisions of St. Onge's bill.

According to the congressman, social security beneficiaries did not get their July checks until July 6 this year, because the present delivery schedule conflicted with the Fourth of July weekend. July 3 was a Saturday, he says, when there were no mail deliveries in some areas. July 4 fell on Sunday and the holiday was celebrated July 5. The checks were not finally delivered until July 6, as a result.

# The Scene at Sears: New Store Is Ready

There's no comparison. That's the view of Sears officials these days about the present Sears at Manchester Shopping Park and the new Sears department store that will open Wednesday.
