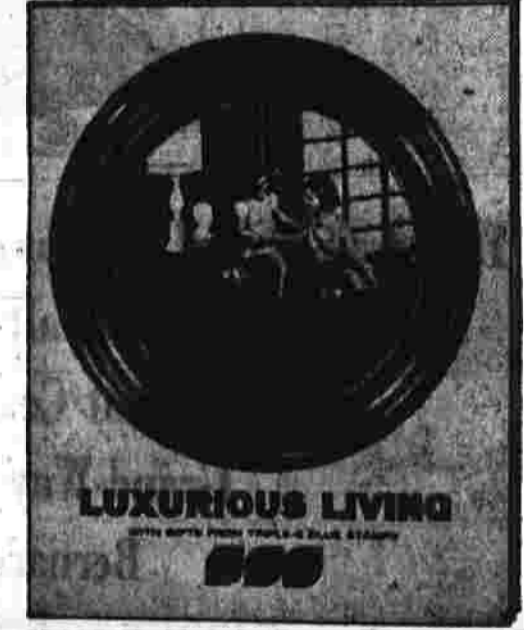

Near-Dead Filibuster Given Lease on Life

WASHINGTON (AP) — The filibuster, a warning institution in the Senate, seemed likely to get a new lease on life in the House — but is modified form.

Rep. Melvin R. Laird, R-Wis., said Republican members of the House have an objective but important point to win — and they are prepared to fight for it. That will be the House into both major legislative sessions.

Laird, chairman of the House Republican Conference, said the point at issue is equal time for speakers on the minority side of motions to have the House bypass its Rules Committee in taking up legislation.

A new rule designed to prevent pigeonholing legislation permits the House to consider bringing a bill directly to the floor. Whether a demand for equal time was their motive or not, most Republican members of the House worked together Monday to make the first use of the new 21-day rule, an agonizing 12 1/2-hour obstacle race impeded by 22 procedural roll calls — a House record.

This is about as close as the House can come to a filibuster. Its rules do not allow unlimited debate — as do the Senate's. "It will be the same thing every time they use the 21-day rule — unless they agree to give us time," Laird said. "If there is an agreement on time — no debate, no problem."

Democrats, however, were prompt to contend that the long-drawn-out opposition Monday

Rustin Sees Negro Votes As Key in Rights Struggle

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Freedom Democratic Party's battle has been endorsed by every major civil rights group in the nation, Rustin said, and has taught them all that "Congress now must become a focal point for the advancement of the struggle."

"There is no major city in the country that has the resources, finances and the will to integrate schools or to bring about employment for Negroes or to destroy slums," Bayard Rustin said in an interview.

"The Negro has finally realized that to accomplish this will require votes, planning and billions of dollars from Congress," he added.

Rustin, who has been described by many civil rights leaders as the visionary in the movement, now heads the A. Philip Randolph Institution which is fundamentally concerned with the eradication of economic barriers to the Negro. The institution is located in New York.

"What I would tell Congress is that what has happened in Atlanta, Louisville and Memphis indicates that the voting rights bill has put them (Southern congressmen) on the defensive. Negroes are now on the threshold of attaining political power."

"What I would tell the average Negro," Rustin added, "is that the most sacred responsibility he has is to register and vote and to organize at the local level to utilize his political power."

With his new political power, Rustin said, comes added responsibility. "The Negro must resist temptation to isolate himself from other progressive elements in black-blue voting."

"He must join his political power with that of other progressive groups such as trade unions, intellectuals and enlightened businessmen to work for concrete and common objectives."

Stealth, Daring Intrigue Fill Marine Night Mission

WITH U.S. MARINES IN THE VIET NAM (AP) — Ten black rubber boats glided through the South China Sea toward the dim shoreline.

A full moon shined slowly from behind a large cloud; its reflection wavered in the water. The sounds of the sea muffled the swishing of paddles.

Suddenly the boats stopped in a pyramid-type formation about 500 feet from shore.

In each boat were seven men of the U.S. Marines 3rd Reconnaissance Battalion, secretive, versatile and daring. Their mission was not to make contact with the Viet Cong but to gather as much information as they could.

It was nearing midnight. Pfc. Baird Sewell of Anaheim, Calif., and Lance Cpl. Ken Whittle of Birmingham, Ala., wearing swimming trunks with only a knife and a flashlight around their waists, dove into the water and swam quietly toward land.

Their job was to guide Delta Company ashore into an area where there were two suspected battalions of Viet Cong.

At midnight, a flashlight blinked. It was Sewell giving the go ahead. An order was given to move out.

The boats broke formation and swiftly paddled to shore. The mission was to check the terrain features and determine if amphibious personnel carriers and tanks could be used in the area.

The men disembarked about 100 feet from the shore and carried their boats with them as they moved up behind the dunes. One platoon remained at the beach to guard the boats. The other two platoons moved out through a sandy area thick with pine trees.

A runner, breathing heavily, told the 1st platoon leader, 1st Lt. Carmine Del Grosso of the Bronx, N.Y., that White had spotted seven uniformed Viet Cong.

Minutes later, a burst of automatic weapons fire came from the Viet Cong. A small exchange of fire followed.

The Viet Cong had spotted the Marines and moved out. In the distance, an eerie sound of drums could be heard. The Viet Cong knew the Marines were in the area and they were relaying signals by drums.

As the Marines moved through a village, Cpl. Russ West of Dayton, Ohio, lead man of the 1st Platoon, was charged by two Viet Cong.

As the Viet Cong drew closer to West, they spotted the other Marines behind him and started to run. One guerrilla was killed, the other escaped.

A small Navy ship that carried the reconnaissance company out to sea reported later that it had watched 28 amphibians towards another island when the shooting broke out. The jets apparently were filled with fleeing Viet Cong.

The Marines' job done, they returned to the beach, quickly moved into their boats, and paddled out to sea. When they were out of sight of the shoreline, the Navy ship that had brought them to the same point picked them up with their boats.

The men went to sleep on deck, arrived back at their encampment area in Da Nang at 6 a.m. Sunday, and washed up for liberty call.

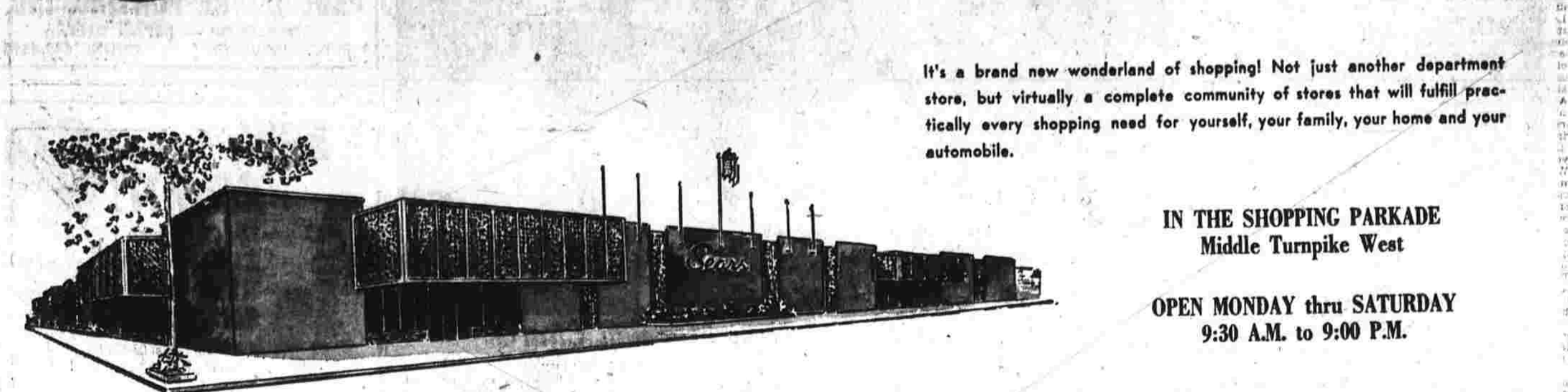

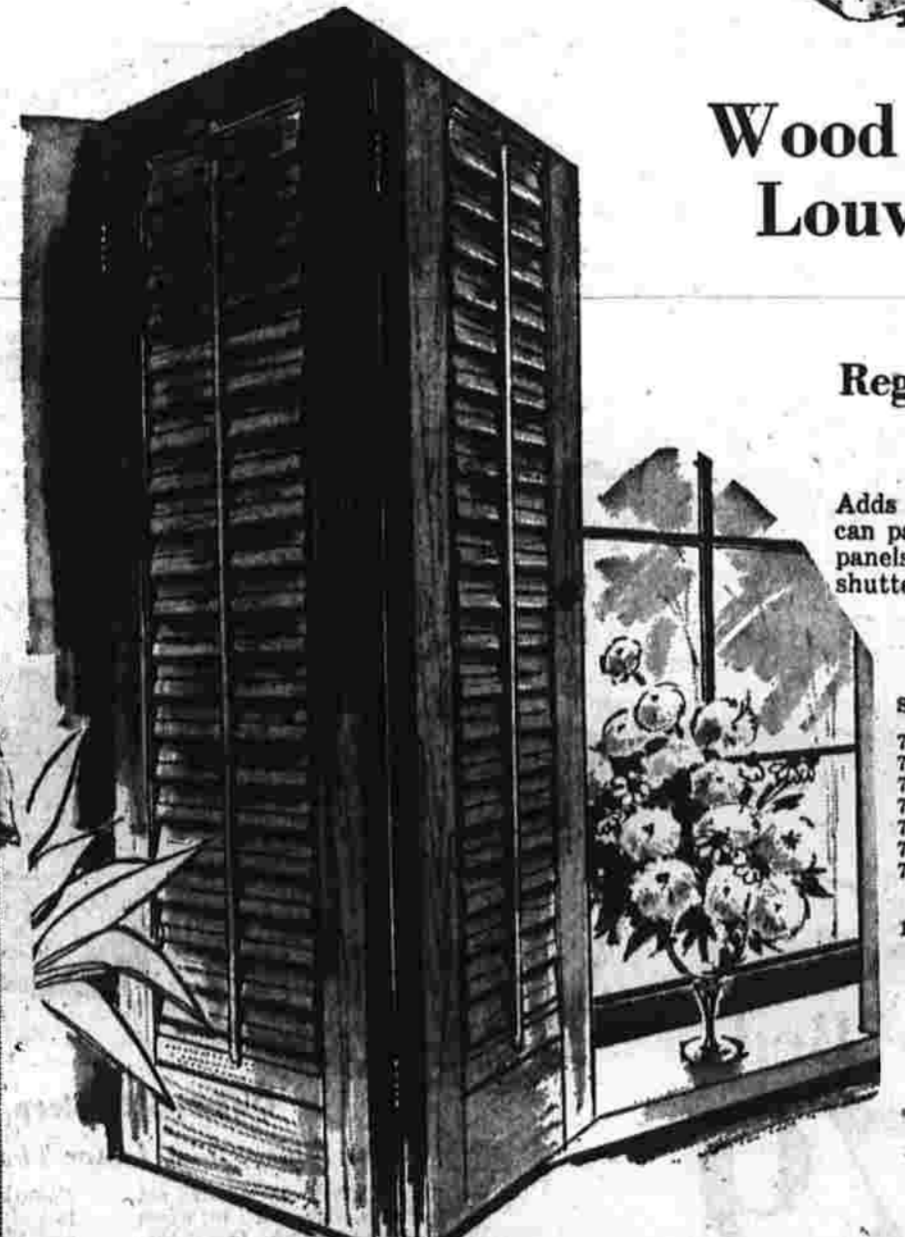

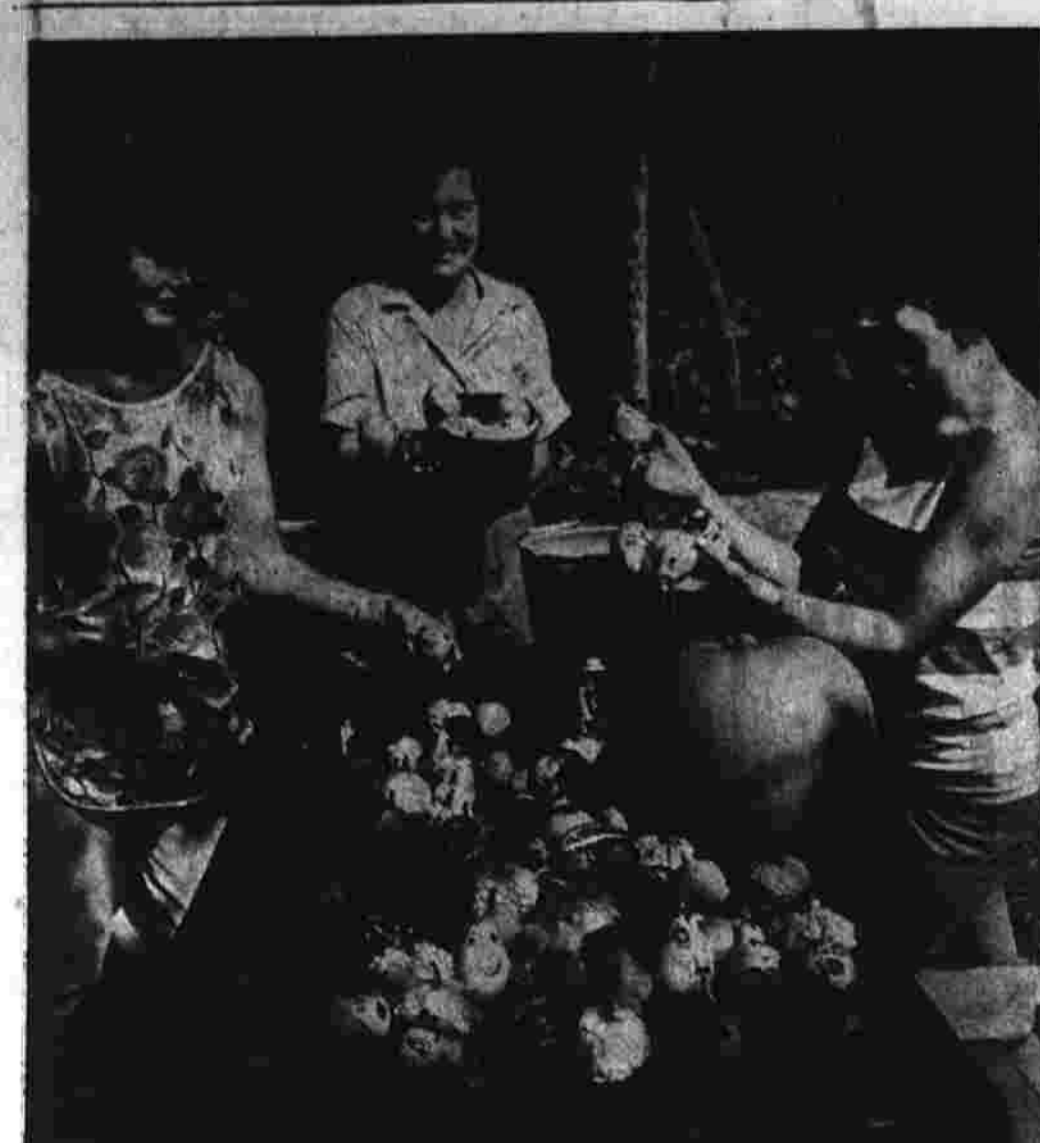

Viet Food Rivals Guerrillas As Enemy of U.S. Troops

VINH LONG, South Viet Nam (AP) — America can take pride in the knowledge that her fighting sons in Viet Nam are fighting their stomachs to win the minds and hearts of the people.

They are eating dogs and snakes, elephant ears, monkeys, cats and bats to save faces among the Vietnamese and Montagnard troops they have come to help and advise.

"The rule is eat it first, then ask what it is," explained Capt. Ronald Griffith of Booneville, Mo., a district adviser in a remote Mekong River delta area where the guerrillas roam, on any given day, to spit to encounter worms, eels, rice, fish, water buffalo and pigeon. "Often it's better not to ask, and hope it's not to look at it."

Among Vietnamese guerrillas in particular, Nham in the field is an elaborate ritual. No aluminum mess kits and canteens for them. Invariably, there is a steaming cauldron of chicken soup. The American adviser, always the honored guest, is given the chicken bones, a favored delicacy, along with a pair of chopsticks to pluck out the eyeballs.

Primitive Montagnard tribes in the mountain areas are not as fastidious at mealtime. Their menus, however, are not to be trifled with: roasted pig, roasted chicken, stewed python, frittose of monkey, all washed down with buckets of rice wine that has been fermenting in bubbling gushers under the grass huts for several months.

Almost everything that grows in Viet Nam can be eaten. The fish land, blessed with abundant rainfall, abounds in coconuts, bananas, mangoes, peanuts and all kinds of leaves and bushes that make excellent insect salads.

Often you see a Vietnamese soldier moving out, unaccompanied by a pack of supplies, with one man lugging a shopping bag full of groceries and another a live duck with the back tied up so its quacking doesn't betray the action.

In the Viet Cong-infested cauldron of the delta, a Vietnamese sailor will hop off a River Assault Group boat at low tide to drop a water buffalo, butcher it on the spot and haul it back aboard for a delectable barbecue.

Gracious dining and guerrilla fighting go hand in hand in the insubstantial East, even if the table d'hôte selection may not always appeal to the American palate.

Beame Wins NYC Run-off

NEW YORK (AP) — Abraham D. Beame, an easy victor in a race he wasn't expected to win, launched his Democratic campaign for mayor today with a call for a crusade against Republican-Liberal John V. Lindsay.

Beame, 58-year-old city comptroller, pulled past three opponents in a primary election Tuesday that seriously damaged the gubernatorial ambitions of his one-time ally, retiring Mayor Robert F. Wagner.

He collected nearly 59,000 votes more than his closest rival, City Council President Paul R. Screvane, who ran with Wagner's backing.

Beame quickly labeled himself an underdog in the battle against Rep. Lindsay, then took off in the pre-dawn hours for a hand-to-hand fight in Fulton fish market.

A record 738,723 Democrats voted in the primary election. Other candidates for mayor were Rep. William F. Ryan and Councilman Paul O'Dwyer.

Unofficial figures showed Beame got 227,884 votes, Screvane 268,991, Ryan 113,182, and O'Dwyer 10,000.

The most powerful vote-getter in the race was Beame's opponent, City Atty. Frank D. O'Connor, Beame's running mate for City President. He got 250,000 votes, nearly half of the ballots cast.

O'Connor's showing catapulted him into next year's race for Democratic nomination for governor. He has made no secret of his intention to run like he did to run against Republican Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller.



Wagner's chance of getting the nomination for governor was dealt a serious blow by his backing of the losing Screvane. Beame said his victory "now guarantees the gubernatorial race is open to everyone."

That reportedly included O'Connor, who carefully avoided plotting during the campaign but was expected to be a four-year term if elected.

Screvane pinned his defeat, in part, on Ryan, who he said pulled away votes that would have gone to him if Ryan had not been in the race.

O'Connor's chief opponent, Daniel P. Moynihan, who quit his job as assistant secretary of defense May 15, said he would be glad to support Beame.

When Moynihan was picked by Screvane it was reported that he had the backing of Robert F. Kennedy, D-N.Y., but Kennedy insisted he was neutral in the fight for the post.

Kennedy flew from Washington to vote in the primary and later visited all four candidates for mayor.

Beame's victory carried former Civil Court Judge Mario Pagano into the nomination for comptroller.

Official Probes Begin On Los Angeles Riots

LOS ANGELES (AP) — An inquest jury, launching the official probe of last month's riotous Los Angeles riots, has ruled justifiable homicide in the shooting of two police officers by peace officers.

The coroner's commission and state and city police continued separate investigations of the Aug. 13-18 riotous, stage-setting testimony by detectives at the inquest depicted a riotous five days.

Thirty-four persons died. More than 800 persons injured. Police arrests of 2,548 persons. \$1.8 per cent of them adults, 78 per cent with prior criminal records.

An "uncountable" number of emergency calls, Property damage of \$45 million from fires, violence and looting. Seven thousand arrests and looting at the riot's peak. Nearly 13,000 National Guardsmen, supporting police and deputies.

Two other deaths — one from a heart attack, the other in a car crash — had been believed at the time to be riot-caused. But the coroner, in announcing his list of deaths to be investigated at inquest, limited the total to 34.

The inquest is to determine how the riotous five days will continue two days. Tuesday's first inquest was quizzed when an American Civil Liberties Union attorney, Hugh Mannes, was ejected after declaring: "This seems to be a platform for whitewashing rather than an inquiry into the truth."

He had been denied permission to cross-examine witnesses. The nine-member jury, including two Negro men and three white women, first found justifiable the police shooting of Honor Ellis, a Negro, and a white woman, in the riotous five days.

The verdict said he died from a bullet in the heart while actively intoxicated and committing a felony, burglary. Ellis, a native of Arkansas, had lived here eight years and worked as an automotive brake holder.

Bonding Big Development For Entire Textile Field

NEW YORK (AP)—One of the newest and fastest growing developments in the textile industry is bonding fabrics.

Born as an illegitimate baby, James Smithson was the son of Hugh Smithson, an English gentleman who became the first Duke of Northampton, and Elizabeth Macle, wealthy widow descended from kings.

On discovering that she was pregnant, the mother discreetly retired from fashionable life in Paris, where the boy was born in 1767, exact date unknown.

He grew up to be a geologist-chemist, a man of insatiable curiosity, a fellow of the Royal Society at the age of 20. He discovered a mineral now called smithsonite; he invented a method of sintering cast-iron to the modern vacuum-drip system.

Once, when he saw a young lady weeping, his science overcame his sympathy. He advised the tears in a vial, analyzed them, and announced they contained four salts.

In his later years, he alternated between collecting minerals and backing the gaming tables of Montmartre.

Though his friends worried he was fast from broke when he died at Geneva on Aug. 19, 1819, his will left his fortune to a nephew, with the proviso that if the latter died childless (which he did), the money was to go to America to found a museum.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q. My mother-in-law is 80 years old and is a semi-invalid. She has been in a nursing home for several years. Will the hospital program under Social Security pay for her care in the nursing home?

A. No. The basic hospital program will provide payment for care in an extended care facility only when a patient is transferred from a hospital for care that is primarily restorative or curative and is prescribed by the doctor. If your mother-in-law is affected to be covered under the voluntary supplemental medical insurance program, she might be eligible for payments for other expenses, such as doctor's bills.

Allies Seen Taking Lead In Viet Nam

WASHINGTON (AP) — High U.S. military officials are looking for Gen. William C. Westmoreland to seize the initiative from the Communist guerrillas in South Viet Nam.

There are two main factors in Viet Nam level hopes for an increasing offensive:

1. A build-up of U.S. fighting forces in Viet Nam shortly will reach about 137,000 men, with more American troops expected to follow.

2. The dry season is approaching. The Viet Cong must operate in the open, and the long dry season makes it difficult for them to hide in the jungles.

At Chi Lai, officials said, the 37th and 25th Regiments of the Viet Cong to the draw and averted an impending Communist attack in force.

The announced body count of Viet Cong dead topped 800. But U.S. military officials now believe that perhaps twice that many of the enemy were killed.

At Chi Lai, many Viet Cong apparently were sealed up by explosives in tunnels and caves, and authorities said.

Two military officials clarified U.S. strategy in Viet Nam. Chief of Staff Gen. Curtis LeMay said that the U.S. strategy is to strike out from secure bases and coastal enclaves to fix and destroy Communist units wherever they can be found. Vital to such far ranging operations is improving intelligence information.

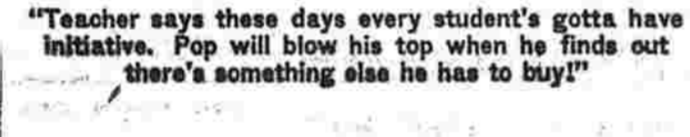

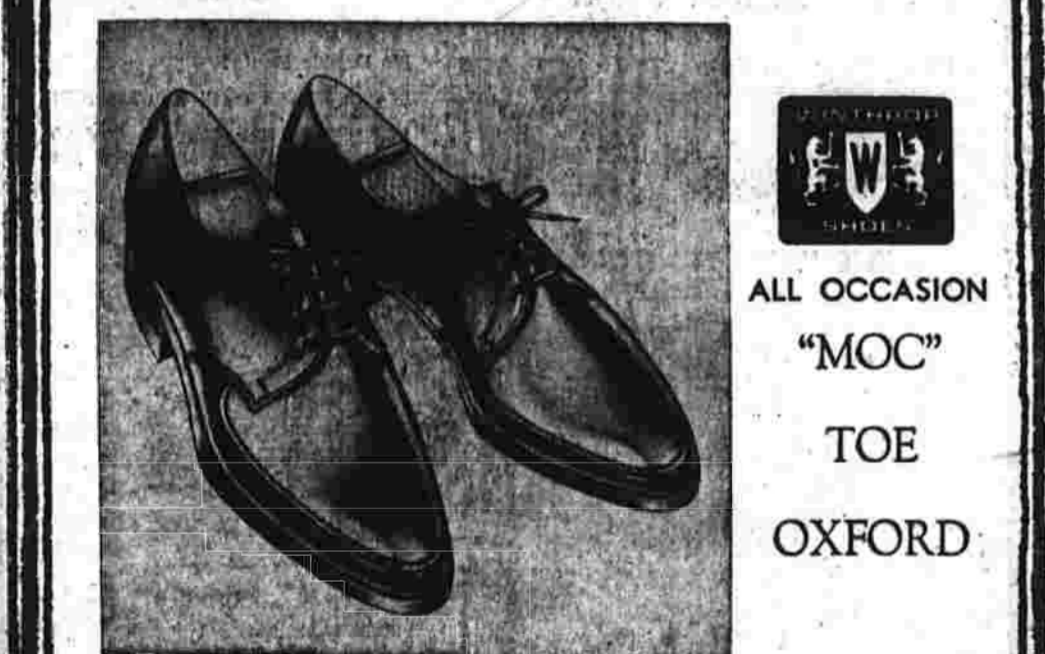
