### Law Is To Obey

When any community takes too lightly the passage of a law, it runs he danger of having individuals take oo lightly the observance of it. oretically at least the law ought be nearly perfect, and it ought to apply-and be applied-with something ike equal force to all who come under This is admittedly a beautiful overdiffication which has great appeal for those with a love for law as an

a practical matter, the law is not ect and its application requires a od deal of human discretion, both in courts and among law enforcement athorities. If the letter of all law were be applied indiscriminately, the court dockets would be even more rowded than they now are. There is a vague consensus, theo-

rists aside, that there are certain laws which ought to be applied sometime and overlooked at other times It is one thing, however, to discover

from experience that the letter of a law does not cover unanticipated situations. It is another thing to write a law knowing that no matter how carefully and completely it is drafted, it cannot ossibly cover all circumstances that again, however, to draft and pass a law with the full knowledge that it should not be enforced much of the time, that will not be enforced much of the chances of surviving in court are doubt-

Such law is not good law no matter how good its intent. One law on the state books now pro-

hibits young drivers from having alcohol in a car they are driving. The intent of the law is obviously good and It won the support of all the good forces and there has been no evidence of overbearing enforcement of it. Perhaps it does dissuade some youths

from drunken or semi-drunken carousing and perhaps it saves some from killing themselves in automobile accidents. It may be that some of those against whom it is enforced will be grateful for it.

At the same time it does require that young drivers-if they want to be law-abiding, as we can suppose some persons do-determined beforehand that there is no liquor stored in a car they are about to drive. And, strictly speaking, it requires a parent who sends a young driver on an errand, to be sure there is no incriminating beverage in

This kind of law comes about generally when the police and the people find themselves frustrated in the attempt to regulate anti-social behavior because existing law is cumbersome or The proposed town ordinance

against possession of liquor in public parks is an example, and the hesitancy some town directors feel in supporting Mustrates the dilemma it poses. What happens, one director wants to know, if a citizen is carrying liquor home and decides to walk through Cen-ter Park?

The answer is that the police, of course, will exercise discretion about enforcing the law. But will the citizen also feel privileged to abide by, or disregard, the law at his discretion? Common sense tells him he can do no one any harm by walking through the park. The law will say he should walk

Similarly the teen-age driver en route to the family summer cottage can elect to obey the law and not transport a case of beer to restore the birder. More probably, he will be pragmatic about it. Knowing his intent is good and that the beer will go undetected anyway, he'll disobey the law. . there is too much law on the coks of the kind that individuals feel they can obey or ignore depending upon their intent, the less effective the

The NAACP has been seeking ways to combat the problem and now the National Education Association is sending a task force to the South to try to find ways to cope with

One easy way out is for the teachers to migrate in vast numbers to teaching jobs in the North. When New York City offered to hire 500 Negro teachers. Negro leaders were abashed.

What worries them, and understandably so, is that if hordes of teachers leave Southern towns, it will strip the Negro middle class of its most numerous element and leave the culturally impoverished Negro communities still weaker. This is more especially true since teaching has represented one field educated Negroes can enter. Many others have been closed to him. So far few of the teachers hav





Robert Stem of Coventry is president and treasurer of the firm and Elmo Baldassari of Scranton, Pa., is his partner. Atty Ronald Jacobs of Manchester handled the legal details.

The property involves most of the western part of the Wells Woods school district, known locally as a "ghost town." ## South Windsor

Library Study Described; Needs, Values Assessed

A study of town library faterillities and needs is being undertaken, financed by a grant from a private foundation, by Kenneth R. Shaffer, director of the school of library sciences at Simmons College, Bostom, Mass.

The study, now in its second phase, will include a complete evaluation of existing facilities, site study for a new central library, and interviews with librarians and library board directors and other town officials. Shaffer was engaged for the project by Town Manager Terry V. Sprenkel and will be paid from a \$3,900 grant from the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving. This is the first time a grant has been given by the Foundation for a library study. The park and recreation study was also supported, by funds from the foundation.

In a personal interview, Shaffer said the library facilities in town are excellent for what we have to work with at present. He commented that "the library board and librarians are doing a fine job with present facilities." He also noted that "very dedicated people were working in the library system in town and that a great muncleus is present to be developed into a fine system."





NEW YORK (AP) - Abraam D. Beame, an easy victor in a race he wasn't expected to win, launched his Democratic ampaign for mayor today with call for a crusade against Reblican-Liberal John V. Lind-Beame, 59-year-old city comptroller, rolled past three opponents in a primary election Tuesday that seriously damaged the gubernatorial ambitions of his one-time ally, retiring Mayor Robert F. Wagner.

He collected nearly 59,000 votes more than his closest rival, City Council President Paul L Screvane, who ran with Wagner.







The gradual pacification of widening areas is regarded as a byproduct of efforts to insure security of U.S. bases by sending patrols farther and farther beyond base perimeters.

As the Viet Cong are cleared from such areas, it is hoped, the Vietnamese army can handle Vietnamese army can handle the job of pacification. In the delta, where the Com-munists have suffered some sigmunists have suffered some sig-nificant reverses recently, the South Vietnamese troops will continue to carry the brunt of the fighting.

U.S. military authorities cred-it the gains in the delta in part to what they say is outstanding leadership and aggressiveness shown by South Vietnamese of-ficers in that theater which used to be a Viet Cong happy hunting ground.

Boston (AP)—It costs more to own and operate an automobile in Boston than in any other major city in the United States, a survey by an auto owners organization disclosed today. The survey said it costs i he 10,000-miles-a-year car owner in Boston 16.18 cents a mile to drive his car, while the same car can be driven in New York for 15.42 cents, and 18.14 cents in Cleveland. In the survey, the Automobile Legal Association compiled all costs for the same car, a medium sized four door sedan, including insurance, taxes, depreciation, licenses and registration maintenance and repairs in a selection of cities a caross the country.
