





### Getting into College Junior Year Time to Plan

When he becomes a junior, the secondary school student must really face up to the question of college—where to go and how to get there. An immediate responsibility is to get a strain of college boards. It is generally wise for the junior to take a set of Scholastic Aptitude and Achievement Test Examinations offered by the College Entrance Examination Board (Box 692, Princeton, N. J.).

Taking the examination is a major does not mean that students are irrevocably committed to a particular college. They will have another chance, if they want it, to re-examine themselves. But the early testing does have value. For one thing, it gives the student an early experience with the testing process. Once acquainted with the form, many students significantly improve their scores.

It is also the evidence of the student's ability. The tests will produce for the secondary school counselor a student's score in each of the major areas. A student's score in each area is a good indicator of his ability to handle the college work. Some students also may want to take the American College Testing program (Box 1, Iowa). There are many colleges and universities that accept scores from this testing of the test.

But while college is a real value, it also involves some danger. Many students are not well prepared for college. Since under law the approval of the commission is required, the town will have to submit a revised plan.

Yesterday, General Manager Richard Martin said that if the town of the plan he had recommended, the town would be able to get going on the project in the next few weeks.

Meanwhile, a petition is circulating in the town asking the commission to disapprove the plan.

The spokesman for the commission said that he has no objection to the plan, but that he has no bearing on the decision and that the town should get on with the project.

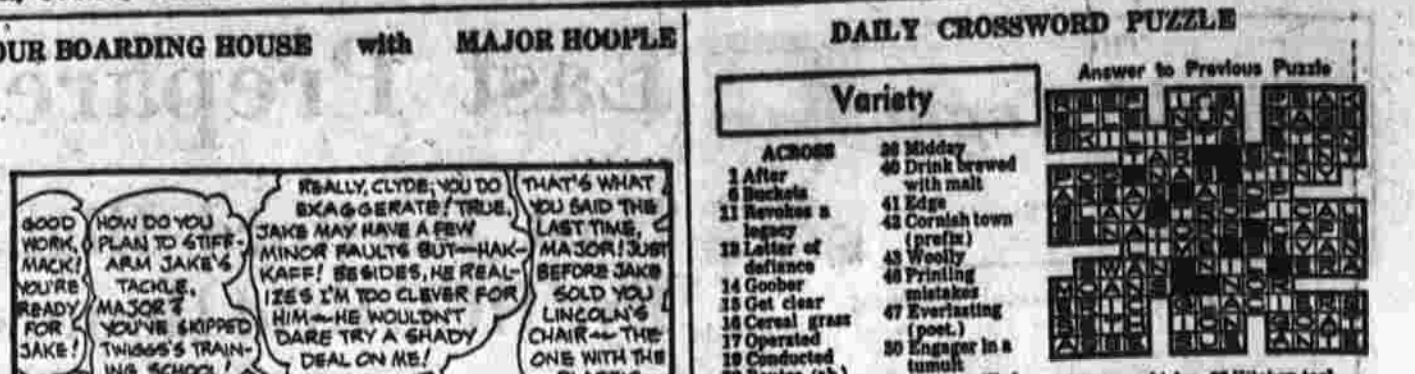
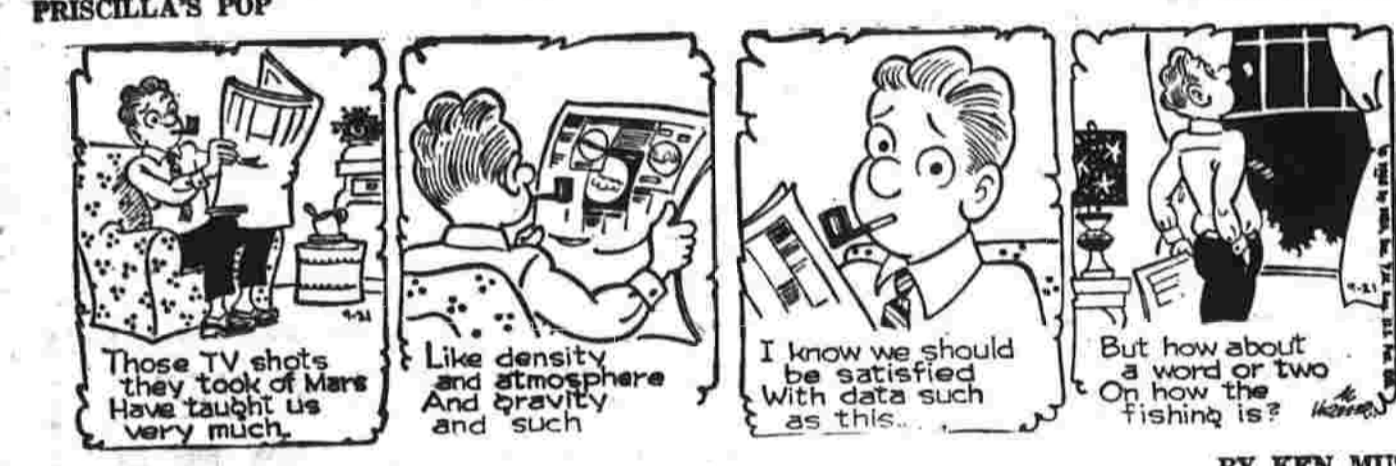
