NEW DELHI, India

AP) - Troops of India and Red China exchanged

shots at close range today near the 14,000 foot alti-tude Nathu La Pass in the

Himalayas, the Indian government announced. The skirmish evidently was brief and bloodless.

Chinese soldiers moved into the Indian-guarded territory near the pass which connects the Indian protectorate of Sik-kim with Communist-ruled Ti-bet, then withdrew when the Indians opened fire, the govern-ment radio said.

This was the first reported outbreak of Indian firing along the Himalayan frontier since Peking — an interested spectator in the Indian-Pakistani war over Kashmir — handed New Delhi an ultimatum last Friday. The Communist Chinese ultimatum, due to expire Wednesday, accused India of border violations and threatened grave consequences unless the Indians dismantle 56 bases alleged to be in Tibetan territory.

Copter Crew Lost Trying To Aid Pilot

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — A U.S. helicopter with four crewmen was shot down in North Viet Nam as it tried to rescue a downed American pi-lot, a military spokesman said today.

The four crewmen and the pilot were listed as missing.

North Vietnamese troops were seen heading for the pilot after he ejected from his F105 Thunderchief Monday, the spokesman said.

The plane was on a bombing mission at a bridge south of Vinh, 100 miles north of the border between North and South Viet Nam, when it was hit by heavy ground fire, he said.

Antiaircraft fire also struck the rescue helicopter and drove off a second chopper, he said.

Another pilot was presumed dead after his F105 crushed into a ridge as it pulled away from its target 50 miles southeast of Dien Bien Phu, the source said.

The two Thunderchiefs raised to four the number of planes U.S. authorities said were lost Monday on missions against the north.

Beginning college visits in the late spring is opportune because admission officers are relatively free after May 1st. They have just finished putting their freshman class for the coming fall and are ready to begin thinking of the year following.

Nevertheless, the junior visiting campus should not necessarily expect a full interview. What the prospective college freshman should concentrate on is getting a sense of the school's atmosphere and human dimenwhat the prospective college freshmen should concentrate on is getting a sense of the school's stmosphere and human dimension.

It will be particularly worthwhile to attend classes — both large lectures and small discussion sections. And the applicant should take a hard look at the life of the campus. At a large university this would include fraternities, dormitories, the international house, the student center, off - campus rooming houses, etc. Frequently, it is the atmosphere in these facilities that will decide a student for or against a particular college.

After the first round of visits, prospective students should narrow their sights on three or four schools that interest them most. A return visit to these campuses is then in order. This time the student should anticipate a more complete interview with the admissions officer, and while on the campus, even more intensively, try to sample the life of the student body. World Law

Last week's World Peace Through conference in Washington began ind ended without fanfare. It produced to startling plans for settling all world aflicts without recourse to force. It expected to produce none.

Furthermore it promised ne great sope that such a plan, in any workable rm, would be forthcoming soon. In act there was among some delegates, notably Dr. Wolfgang Friedman, direcfor of international legal studies at Coumbia University, the suspicion that the shaky structure of international law being gradually weakened and that ven limited acceptance of international legal rules is giving way to "an era of uninhibited power struggle." He cited the United States involve-

nent in the Dominican struggle as an example, arguing that "The most funsamental principle of the law of nations, as it has been built up during the past 3% centuries, is that of the right of integrity of any independently constituted state, big or small, regard less of its political ideology."

The optimistic note was sounded by Chief Justice Earl Warren in his keynote address. He saw the formulation of the rule of law strong enough to regulate actions of nations as no more dreamy than the idea of splitting the atom or traveling to the moon was a

He predicted it within his own generhopeful, and some frankly saw the obect as unattainable.

But the mere fact that 2,500 men from 100 nations, including Pakistan and India, now engaged in bloody bate, gathered to discuss the possibility encouraging. It is doubly so because assembly was not made up of phiophers and academicians. Among gates were some of the world's nost hard-headed leaders, jurists, inmational corporation lawyers, bar

ociation heads. The greatest hope lies in the fact that hen the delegates return to their omes and endeavors from this conence and from others like it, they arry away a little more conviction in

favor of world law and spread it a litis more around the world. The realism of the conference attiade was sounded by Dr. Julius Stone f the University Sydney. He cauoned delegates against attempting oo much too quickly for fear that failares would discredit international law. In the alternative he suggested atempting something that seems feasible—the establishment of some kind of egional courts in societies with comstible cultures and legal systems, such

as an inter-American court, er a Brit-Commonwealth court, He reasons hat if nations use such courts the noion of putting international peace before national sovereignty might catch sold gradually. It is easy in the light of failure of

United Nations and the non-use of the International Court of Justice to brow up hands and say that internaional law will never prevail. What is overlooked in that discouriging view, however, are the successes

of the United Nations in matters that idom if ever make the headlines. Amid the few spectacular (and admitdly orucial) failures are many more victories. As they continue to mulate, nations may find it more ad more to their advantage to rely some machinery for international

Accident statistics soon proved that the median strip was not enough. Cars going at high speed rates did cross the grass strips and did crash head-on into cars in the opposite lane. This type of crash was almost automatically a death crash for all partaking of it. When the combined impact of two cars is 120 miles an hour, humans do not live.

It was also discovered that the median jumping took place on long straight stretches as well as on curves. Some two weeks before the House vote on MFDP's challenge against the five Congressmen, MFDP leaders were approached privately by the liberal Americans for Democratic Action.
