After The Tour Maybe the enthusiasm engendered for creating a Connecticut River Na-

tional Parkway will spread a little and stir up interest in reclaiming other natural esthetic resources. There must be many Union Ponds in Connecticut, and the task of converting them from nuisances is impossible only in so far as the effort is deemed too great or the cost too high.

The Connecticut River, of course, has considerable majesty and it flows by numerous towns whose residents are naturally attracted to the idea of secing it developed into a kind of park. particularly with the federal government bearing the principal costs.

If Senator Abraham Ribicoff's proposal catches hold with others in Washington as it appears to have with Secretary of the Interior Stewart L. Udall, maybe the river banks can be saved from total ugliness.

After taking a tour along the river with the senator, the governor, and a number of local officials, Udall said, "With teamwork we can overcome the problems of pollution and industrial enreachment." In the spirit of the day, Governor Dempsey echoed the call for

Overcoming those problems will take oney and political courage, It will take stronger legislation on pollution and, more important, stronger enforcesary to tackle the pollution problems in the streams and ponds which are tributary to the Connecticut.

It will be years before any national park along the river can become a reality. In the meanwhile the state should take a firm stand with industries and with municipalities which contribute to making the river as dirty when it leaves the state as it is when it enters depite the fact that it clears itself somewhat along the way.

Anti-pollution progress has always been slow because there have always been more attractive demands on priwate and municipal funds. When the consensus favors doing something about pollution even when it hurts, progress will be speeded. If the Ribicoff proposal succeeds in nothing else it may help auster public support of reclamation.

There are hopeful signs here at home despite a recent minor setback. Prospects are good that the Colonial Board Co. will see its way clear to shoulder the expense of having its industrial avastes treated in the town's proposed Parker Village plant or to treat the waste by some method of its own.

The refusal this week of the Water Resources Commission to accept the plans for the plant as they now stand should not be interpreted as a blow to the cause of pollution abatement. In fact, in the long run, it will be a benefit and most of those involved in planming the project might be willing to concede that point.

The commission contends that the effluent from the plant cannot be dumped ed into Lydall Brook because the brook, when it flows at all, does not have enough flow to handle the waste, ven after treatment. The commission suggests instead

hat the treated waste should be umped into the Hockanum River instream from Union Pond, and that oint of view did not come as a surprise to engineers and town officials since it was made clear by commission taff members in advance.

The first instinct is to say that half a loaf is better than none. That is, that waste dumped into the brook after reatment is obviously better than waste dumped in without it, and any step toward pollution abatement is a good one. But the cost of treating ingustrial and domestic wastes is too at to permit more half-way meas-

It would be pleasant to draw from the United States' reliance upon and support of the United Nations in the Pakistan-India muddle the inference that this nation will turn to it more readily in cold war issues of the future. The vigor shown by members of the Security Council seems to have caused the Chinese to back away from a confrontation without any outbreak of shooting on the border.

This represents a double victory for the United Nations and, together with the settlement of the peace-keeping assessment issue, has pierced the gloom which has been enshrouding the UN. The alignment against China appears to have more power behind it than could have been hoped. Further confrontations with Peking are inevitable and reliance on the UN may provide

nation to fight for survival. A new mood and new alignments in the Security Council may tempt the United States to put greater emphasis upon the UN and to continue to give Ambassador Goldberg a free hand for the exercise of his diplomacy which is given much of the credit for the recent
