**The UN Success**  
 It would be pleasant to draw from the United States' relative apathy and support of the United Nations in the Pakistan-India muddle the inference that this nation will turn to it more readily in cold war issues of the future. A more objective view, however, has to admit that the administration's orientation to the UN came about because there was no other way.

And it must also be admitted that while the hostilities on the Indian subcontinent provided for the United Nations one of the greatest problems it had to face, it also gave the world organization an issue on which there was virtual unanimity within its ranks. If the United States returns to the UN in despair, expecting it to accomplish, at least, only the immediate objective of a cease fire, it received a kind of rebuff. The victor shown by members of the Security Council seemed to have caused the Chinese to back away from a confrontation without any outbreak of shooting on the border.

This represents a double victory for the United Nations and, together with the settlement of the peace-keeping assessment issue, has pierced the gloom which has been enshrouding the UN. The alignment against China appears to have more power behind it than could have been hoped. Further confrontations with Peking are inevitable and reliance on the UN may provide a means of meeting continued Chinese threats without forcing that desperate nation to fight for survival.

A new mood and new alignments in the Security Council may tempt the United States to put greater emphasis upon the UN and to continue to give Ambassador Goldberg a free hand for the exercise of his diplomacy which is given much of the credit for the recent success.

**Cause For Bleeding**

We have been suspecting for some time that there is an underground group at work attempting to overthrow the nation's dedicated housewives. Rumors that the John Birch Society is out there for the purpose of overthrowing the nation's dedicated housewives.

After taking a tour along the river with the senator, the governor, and a number of local officials, Udall said, "With teamwork that overcomes the problems of pollution and industrial encroachment." In the spirit of the day, Governor Dempsey echoed the call for teamwork.

Overcoming those problems will take money and political courage. It will take stronger legislation on pollution, and more important, stronger enforcement of it. We will obviously be unable to tackle the pollution problems in the streams and ponds which are tributary to the Connecticut.

It will be years before any national park along the river can become a reality. In the meanwhile the state should take a firm stand with industries and with municipalities which contribute to making the river as dirty when it leaves the state as it is when it enters despite the fact that it cleans itself somewhat along the way.

Anti-pollution progress has always been slow because there have always been more attractive demands on private and municipal funds. When the consensus favors doing something about pollution even when it hurts, progress will be speeded. If the Ribicoff proposal succeeds in nothing else it may help muster public support of remediation.

There are hopeful signs here at home despite a recent minor setback. Prospects are good that the Colonial Brook Co. will see the light to shoulder the expense of having its industrial wastes treated in the town's proposed Parker Village plant or to treat the waste by some method of its own.

The refusal this week of the Water Resources Commission to accept the plans for the plant as they now stand should not be interpreted as a blow to the cause of pollution abatement. In fact, in the long run, it will be a benefit and most of those involved in planning the project might be willing to concede that point.

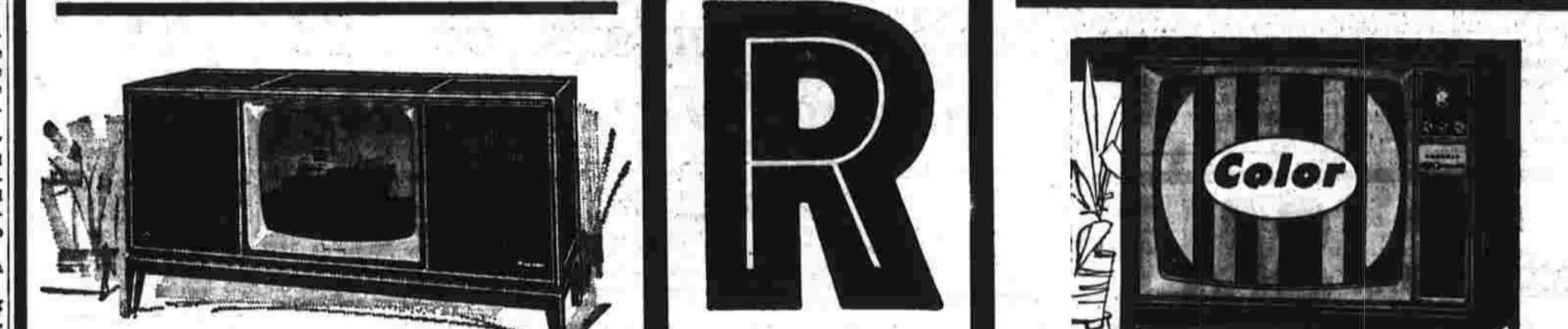

Personable Carm Cozza makes his debut as head football coach at Yale tomorrow when he and his Bulldogs squad face the most crucial one-hour examination of their athletic lives in a season opener with a variety of Connecticut which is expected to attract a convocation of over 30,000 at the sprawling Yale Bowl.

The 2 p.m. contest will mark the third season for Yale and give UConn an opportunity to score its initial victory in the now 11-year-old series.

Headed upon the pain and punishment of 16 previous defeats in as many meetings, the current crop of UConn will audition for the immortality which has escaped all of its predecessors. The Bulldogs, which would dictate the engraving of the names of the players in the stadium, will be a year ago Yale held a tempestuous 7-6 edge five minutes into the fourth period, but converted a go-for-broke UConn pass into a touchdown to pull out of range.
