Wrong Way Speech Oratory and shooting are now paralel forms of conflict between India and

The oratory is at the United Nations. The shooting is on both sides of what, ust week, were supposed to be the ease fire lines on which both nations agreed to honor the United Nations Security Council's order for the shoot-

ing to stop. In the oratory, India and Pakistan are specializing in blaming each other for the beginning of the war, and each is proving ingenious in attaching conditions for an end to the war which it knows the other will not accept,

And, in the field, they are alipping Farther and farther away from compliance with the United Nations peace. In response, the United Nations Security Council sternly reiterates its order for a cease fire. In response, the big power giants, the United States and Russia, hold urgent private consul-

tations at the United Nations, to see what new special pressure they may be With characteristic independence able to put behind United Nations orders, or upon India and Pakistan. At this moment, with the truce slipping, the firing in the field increasing, and the United Nations without any isible recourse for obtaining a tighter grip on the situation, the foreign minister of France made a formal policy address before the United Nations Gen-

eral Assembly. The fact that France should even condescend to make a formal statement of policy at the United Nations-the world organization to which President de Gaulle usually tenders only his most superior anachronistic national sneeris considered as something of a hopeful change in attitude.

But what Foreign Minister de Murville had to say was about as far from e appropriate mark at this particular time as any policy speech could be. The main thing he did was to warn the United Nations against the use of force in any of its efforts to keep the world peaceful. Trying to use force would, he said, be only "an adventure." He likewise declared against any attempt, on the part of the world organization, to threaten breakers of the peace with economic or political pen-

alties of any kind. The recommendation against the use of force in any effort to keep the peace happens to be pertinent enough when it is applied to the particular present instance of war, or slipping cease fire, between India and Pakistan, for the simple realistic fact is that the United Nations, as presently constituted and organized, does not have the force sufficient to deal with the amount of force India and Pakistan possess.

But when we come to the realm of general theory, the one big lesson the resent emergency does teach is that the United Nations must some day have such force, in such proportion to the smount of force permitted individual nations, as to enable it to step in and se force to halt war between nations. The logic which the French foreign minister presented in his policy address would, if extended downward to jurisfictions smaller than that of the United Nations, prohibit the use of force by the FBI to catch a criminal, or the use of orce by state police to halt a riot, or the use of force by city or town police to halt any piece of criminal behavior.

What the crisis between India and akistan—and the accompanying crisis for United Nations law and authorityreally teach is precisely the necessity for equipping world law against war with that degree of force required to see that such law can be enforced.

SECAM And PAL

The world seems ready to divide itself into opposing camps on yet another issue. And again a question arises over whether the alliances to be formed will hue to the political lines in the Communist and non - Communist

The countries are trying to decide whether to cast their lot with the SECAM nations or those of PAL. The letters have nothing to do with defense alliances or economic blocks. They stand for the names of incompatible TV color systems, Sequential and Memory, of Phase Alteration Line.

France has already committed itself to SECAM, and thus posed a problem for Britain which would like to see European unity preserved. If the English choose PAL, as is likely, they will be in the camp shared by Italy, Austria Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Finland, Ireland, Iceland, and West Germany, provided none of those nations changed

The Soviet Union, which had originally favored SECAM and pulled Eastern Burope along with it, is now reportedly having second thoughts. Presumably they are technical rather than political. But the Chinese Communists have shown a leaning toward SECAM which may, after all, have something to do with the Russians' doubts.

the Geneva Convention, prescribing humane treatment of prisoners of war. United States, technically is not at war with either North Viet Nam or the Viet Cong. The Viet Cong, in fact, claims to be an indigenous movement engaged in civil ,war within South Viet Nam. So the status of cap-Americans cannot be precisely defined under international law, even if such law were accepted as binding

Moreover, no one denies that a South Vietnamese firing squad last week exe-Vietnamese civilians convicted of leading anti-American demonstrations at the big military installation at Da Nang. In a very strict sense, the United States is not responsible for all the actions of the South Vietnamese overnment. But it is not surprising hat Radio Hanol should quote Viet Cong spokesmen as denouncing the United States for "having ordered their henchmen" to kill the Communist sym-

The Red propaganda line is that the executed Americans had "committed many crimes against the South Vietnamese people." If that means taking part in a shooting war to save the South Vietnamese government from cunning and devious enemy ailled with a world conspiracy, then the United States stands guilty. But the Viet Cong's crimes against the rural villagers are well publicized, too. It's a rare war in which anybody's hands are really clean. Shocking as are the deaths of two more American
