43 States Fighting For Atom-Age Plum

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Atomic Energy Commission says the job of picking the final site for the Great Atoms-Plum site has now reached the critical stage.

Borrowing a phrase from astronaut Biggs, an AEC spokesman also says that from now on the "go or no-go criteria" for staying in the race will be progressively tougher.

It is obvious that the AEC, and the White House, must have a politically correct guy by the ball as the contest goes on for locating the \$446-million 200-billion electron volt-BIBY-machine.

A modest elimination contest already has begun, with the results announced only recently after months of study by the AEC of 120 potential sites, involving more than 200 locations, from 48 states.

Of 28 semifinalists, representing 43 states, still remain in the running to land what Rep. Craig Bohner, R-Calif., has termed "the 200 BIBY bonanza—the government's biggest free offer to all states since opening the Cherokee Strip to homesteaders in 1890."

A rich payoff in payoffs and prestige would come to the community landing the prize. And the contenders want it so badly that the majority of them have offered free land to the government—for example, \$10 million here of this type offered by the State of Indiana.

Rep. Bohner, a member of the joint Senate-House Atomic Energy Committee, criticized the AEC the day the commission formally announced its admittedly modest whittling-down of the contest.

Bohner asserted that the commission's recent action—leaving 43 states in the fight—constituted "an inept attempt to keep the political circus alive."

Criticism of the AEC also came quickly from a key Democrat on the joint committee, Sen. Clinton P. Anderson of New Mexico.

Asserting that the present list of 43 represents "not a very good scaling down" by the AEC from the original entrants, Anderson said:

"I think it will do a lot to destroy confidence in the project, remaining silent to such judgments, the AEC says that in the months ahead, stiffer criteria will be used to whittle down the list. I am sure that by the commission itself will be applied to the contest survivors by

A-Station To Lower Power Cost

HARTFORD (AP)—A nuclear power station to be built by the Northeast Utilities Co. is expected to cut the cost of electricity for Connecticut and Western Massachusetts residents.

Thomas R. Knapp, who will serve as president of the station, said Thursday.

Knapp, who is also head of the Connecticut Light and Power Co., said that the proposed Millstone Point nuclear power station would produce electricity at a cost of 1.5¢ per kilowatt-hour, compared with 2.5¢ per kilowatt-hour for the coal-fired plants now in operation.

The station would be built on the site of the old Millstone Point power plant, which was destroyed by a fire in 1954.

The station would have a capacity of 1,000 megawatts and would be able to produce 10 billion kilowatt-hours of electricity per year.

The station would be financed by the Northeast Utilities Co. and would be operated by the Connecticut Light and Power Co.

UNACCOUNTED HENRIPROTOTYS DECLARER

BY ALFRED SHEINWOLD

If a player tells you exactly how much he counts for a nine or a ten, don't believe him. Only heads-down counts are reliable. As a practical matter, you consider only the number of cards in the hand.

Opening lead—Jack of spades. In today's hand South would bid if his hand of spades had been an eight. But he would have gone down.

West led the jack of spades and declarer wisely played dummy's ace. There was no need to finesse as long as South had the nine.

If South played dummy's queen, East would take the king and return the suit to force out the ace. The defenders would get three spades, the ace of diamonds and at least one other trick.

Declarer actually took the ace of spades and led a diamond to force out the ace. If West led the ten of spades back, dummy's queen would drive out the king, and South's nine would be high. If West led back a low spade, South would play low from dummy and get a trick with the nine or the queen.

If South gets two spades he can go after the clubs and make sure of nine tricks with three clubs, three diamonds, two spades and one heart. If the defenders abandon spades, South can afford to take a heart finesse at the end.

If South had the ace of spades instead of the nine, West would be able to continue spades on taking the ace of diamonds.

Bad Weather Stalls Wagner Strike Talks

NEW YORK (AP)—Bad flying weather has delayed Mayor Robert F. Wagner's intervention in the 28-day New York Times paper Guild strike against the New York Times.

Wagner is scheduled to meet with negotiators for the AFL-CIO union and the Times this afternoon in an effort to break their deadlock on contract issues.

A session had been set for city hall at 11:30 Thursday night. Wagner was flying from Minneapolis after watching the first two games of the World Series, but bad weather forced diversion of the flight to Detroit. He was expected to arrive here this morning.

The mayor, who was instrumental in settling a 11-day newspaper strike and shutdown in 1962-63, is entering the negotiations after both sides rejected a settlement formula proposed by his special mediator, Theodore W. Kheel.

Only two of the eight major newspapers of general circulation in New York City are shut down voluntarily because of the times closing.

Among Kheel's major recommendations were these:

- 1. A guild stop should not be granted in the editorial and news departments. A guild stop provision in the contract, as sought by the union, would require an employee to join the guild to hold his job.
- 2. On the issue of job jurisdiction, the guild's demand for a "ban" on the introduction of automation equipment by the Times without prior agreement with the guild is "inappropriate."

SANTO DOMINGO, Dominican Republic (AP) — The handbag machine-gun emplacements guarding the approach to the rebel zone in Santo Domingo are again firing.

The April rebellion is not over, but a visitor returning to the Dominican capital after two months is startled to find that the city is once again the Broadway of Santo Domingo and no longer an ominously empty street in the heart of the rebel zone.

The rebel zone continues to exist — an enclave of 25 square blocks crowded with low-income homes and with its back to the sea. Barbed wire still surrounds the area, and troops of the Inter-American Peace Force patrol the perimeter.

But only the sentries carry guns. Most of the 10,000 foreign troops go unarmed. Their jeeps and trucks stick out strangely in the rush hour traffic. Young U.S. paratroopers scowl about town on rented motorbikes.

Neither the foreign troops nor Dominican army troops go downtown into the rebel zone. Only civilians have free movement. The zone remains a sanctuary for those who rebelled and continue to struggle for the goals of the revolt.

The rebels recognize the authority of President Hector Garcia-Godoy's month-old provisional government. However, 1,200 well-armed rebel soldiers live downtown in hotels and private homes while their leader, Col. Francisco Caamaño Dasso, tries to negotiate their return to the regular armed forces.

The pro-Castro June 16th Movement, once outlawed, has reopened its office on El Conde. So has the Popular Dominican Movement — MPD, one of the nation's two Communist parties.

The majority of the banners on streets and buildings are signed by the June 16th Movement, the MPD and Dominican Communist party. Last Sunday they led 53 other organizations in the establishment of the United Anti-Imperialist and Constitutionalist Front.

Ex-President Juan Bosch, just back from exile, refused to allow his big Dominican Revolutionary party to join the leftist front. But he and thousands of Dominicans agree with its principal announced goal: the immediate departure of the 10,000 U.S. troops who make up the bulk of the inter-American force. Bosch refuses to go out of the rebel zone.

What will happen to this political activity if Caamaño's soldiers reject the rebels' safety and the rebel sanctuary disappears? Garcia-Godoy has offered guarantees for everyone's safety and liberty. But conservative businessmen and the officers who control the armed forces are pressuring him to crack down.

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson's "war on poverty" enters its second year today, under investigation by Congress and the target of some criticism, but with its chief coordinator, Mr. Hubert H. Humphrey, saying the program is making progress.

There have been charges of poor administration from both Democrats and Republicans. There have been congressional suggestions that President Humphrey, the anti-poverty commander, step out as Peace Corps director and give full time to running the Office of Economic Opportunity.

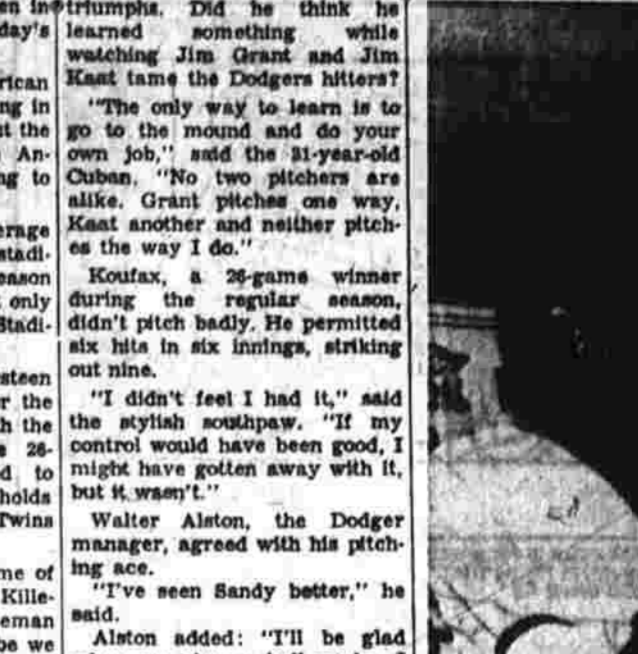
