STUDY THE REDDING TO LOCATE CARDS

By ALFRED SHEINWOLD

If you pay careful attention to the bidding you will find that you can play certain hands as though all the cards were face up on the table. Try that method with South's holding of four spades.

Opening lead—king of hearts. West opened the king of hearts, and South considered it best to pass. But she remembered the bidding and therefore counted points.

Dummy had 8 points, 4 for each ace, south had 18 points, 4 for the ace, 5 for each king, 2 for the queen, and 1 for each jack. Since there are only 40 points in an entire deck, only 16 points were missing — and West surely held every single point for his opening bid of one notrump.

South knew before she started that East could not hold as much as one queen, and that no trumps would work. He made the contract by catching West in an end play.

Ruffs Out Hearts

South took the first trick with the ace of hearts, ruffed a heart, and then led the ace of diamonds and ruffed the other heart. South then cashed the king and queen of diamonds. Fortunately, West had to follow suit throughout.

South then led the ten of spades, and West was in with the queen of spades. If West returned a trump, South would lose only one trump trick and could afford to give up two clubs. If West returned a club South would lose only one club trick and could afford to give up two spades.

Partner opens with one notrump (16 to 18 points), and the next play shows you hold: ♠ A, 2, 3; ♥ K, Q; ♦ A, 2, 3; ♣ A, 2, 3, 4.

Answer: Bid two hearts, as shown in the diagram. Despite your total lack of points you may make two hearts (or come close) and your partner may be in great trouble at one notrump.

NEW YORK (AP) — CBS programming executives, like impatient gardeners, are weeding out very early in the season any shows with symptoms of that terrible TV disease, ratings lag.

"Rawhide," after six healthy years, will be ripped from the network's Wednesday night schedule as soon as possible — after the first of the year. It will be replaced by a series called "Clarence," the Cross-eyed Lion, itself an unsuccessful candidate for a spot in the season's new schedule.

The new series, expanded in the current fashion from a minor old feature film, obviously is counted as one of those so-called "family shows" which means a program that adults believe will not harm their children and which they will patiently sit through themselves.

By the time this television season has ended, it will have shaped up as one more beneficial to lovable animal actors than to humans. There is, of course, "Mr. Ed," the talking horse, and "Flipper" the dolphin who almost talks and "Lassie" who does everything but talk, and now Clarence.

"Honey West's" closest companion is an ocelot named Bruce — although in real life, Bruce is a girl ocelot named Honey but that would have been much too confusing to the audience. There is also Spot, "The Munster's" flame-throwing pet, and "My Three Sons," shaggy dog, Tramp and "Please Don't Eat The Daisies," Hungarian sheepdog called "Ladadog" by the witty script writers but whose real name is Lord Nelson.

CBS has really decided to replace its first cancellation of the season, "Slattery's People" with an Art Linkletter-hosted variety show to start on Dec. 3. This addition will bring to 15 the number of network variety shows available to most TV audiences each week.

Presumably Linkletter's free adaptation of his summer replacement hour, "Hollywood Talent Scouts," will be long on inexpensive new talent and success-story interviews with established stars who do not perform but who plug their current activities.

Review: Stretch Pants and One Joke

NEW YORK (AP) — If you watch enough television, you can pick up some of the darndest nuggets of little-known information.

How many of us realized, until Wednesday night, that daughters of rich ranchers in the California of 1885 were wearing stretch pants with a side zipper? Anyway, that was what the daughter of the "Big Valley" Barkleys was wearing when she was rescued from a thundering herd of wild horses. What made it so noticeable was that the rest of the time she was discreetly garbed in floor-length gowns.

Actually, "The Big Valley," one of ABC's new series, isn't

much concerned with minor details — it's the action that counts. Wednesday night's episode managed to crowd in quite a lot of action from a gang of roving thugs blackmailing simple sodabusters for protection money to fistfights, shootings, arson, and even an ill-starred love affair.

It was a busy hour, but the show seems well-equipped to handle almost any kind of plot. The Barkleys are quite a clan, headed by Barbara Stanwyck who plays the mother. Miss Stanwyck is an actress of considerable ability, but both times I've looked in on the show her contribution has been merely looking serene and sensible and speaking a few lines.

There are two hot-headed brothers, apparently in the cast to take care of the fight scenes. There is also a third brother, the aloof, urbane member of the family, who keeps pouring himself belts of brandy and discussing current problems in a detached way.

And, of course, there is that pretty daughter — the one with the stretch pants.

If the public fancies this setup, and it sure beats "Bonanza" for size and variety, there is almost no limit to the types of stories they can turn out.

Earlier in the evening, CBS' "Beverly Hillsbillies" was walking down that well-worn James Bond road. There seems to be

an unwritten television rule that every comedy series this season must have at least one secret agent spoof.

The Hillbilly version had Jethro play an even bigger boob than usual, talking about joining the anti-SMERSH forces, becoming a member of the "Oh-ohs." He clanks around in a bulletproof trench coat accompanied by wild screams from the laugh track. It was a relief when the half-hour was over.

Maybe this series in its two years has gone just about as far as it can go on its one joke. The rich Clampetts nowadays are not so much complete innocents in a cynical society as they are complete fools. It's not very funny any more.

State News NHRR Asks To End Runs For Riders

NEW YORK (AP)—The New Haven Railroad says it will file with the Interstate Commerce Commission a request for permission to abandon all interstate passenger service, effective March 1, 1966.

The petition is a formality to eliminate the bankrupt New Haven's last legal obligation to continue passenger service.

The railroad has temporary operating agreements with states or public agencies that assure commuter service until next summer. Similar agreements for long-haul passenger service are under consideration.

Under a proposed merger, the New Haven's freight system, but not passenger service, would be taken over by the Pennsylvania and New York Central railroads.

New Alcoholism Plan

FAIRFIELD (AP)—Rep. Donald J. Irwin, C-Conn., announced today award of a three-year federal grant of some \$300,000 to be used in a community-wide approach to alcoholism treatment.

The program, described as unique in this country, will be pioneered in Fairfield County under the Fairfield County Council on Alcoholism, Inc., with headquarters in Westport.

Through the program, called "The Fairfield Plan," families and friends of problem drinkers in Fairfield County will receive specific and experienced advice on how to overcome the alcoholic's symptomatic resistances to treatment and how to guide the recovering alcoholic in making the best individual use of existing treatment resources.

Senate Vote Fails On 14B Filibuster

WASHINGTON (AP)—Senate supporters of the bill to revoke the power of states to ban the union shop fell 17 votes short in their effort today to invoke cloture and choke off a filibuster.

The vote on cloture was 45 for and 47 against so that the bill's supporters did not even muster a majority.

With 92 senators recorded, it would have required 62 to invoke cloture. Democratic Leader Mike Mansfield of Montana said simply after the vote that "the debate will continue."

LBJ Meets with Despite Unpleasant

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson conferred for 45 minutes today with Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey after spending what was described as his "most unpleasant night" since gall bladder surgery.

The unpleasant aspects were attributed by press secretary Bill D. Moyers to the fact that son took no sedatives. Moyers said doctors feel that at about this point patients recovering from major abdominal surgery experience their greatest discomfort.

"He is uncomfortable this morning," Moyers reported. However, he said Johnson's pain did not discourage him from covering a wide range of topics, foreign and domestic, with Humphrey.
