Route 195 Still Bits and Pieces

Route 56, which one day will allow a motorist to drive from the Canadian border to the tip of Fiorida without a traffic light, is a hodge podge of toll roads, bits and pieces of super highway, and plain old fash-toned city streets in its 600-mile New England sector.

The roughest sections of the new route, intended to replace the old Route 1, are in Rhode Island and Massachusetts.

In both states drivers encounter short sections of the superhighway between 1 ong stretches of old narrow roads.

Connecticut has a toil turnpike paralleling the shore line

The route now goes over the York state line to the Rhode Mystic River Bridge, a toll Island line which is designated crossing, and connects with the

It's a toll road in Maine, too, but at 70 miles an hour it doesn't take long to travel the 106 miles to Augusta, and from there on its a freeway to Old Town, a few miles North of Bangor, Maine, and almost 200 miles from the edge of New Hampshire.

But it is planned to lead Route 96 later to the proposed inner belt highway which will be built through Somerville, Cambridge and Boston, to link up with the extension of the southern end of 96 which soon will cross Route 128.

For years construction of the Inner Belt has been held up by legislative action which gave these cities, and several others, a veto power over the route se-

are now cooling on their one-time willgness to help us create a joint naval auclear force which would be a cute way for us to let Western Germany get a finger on a nuclear trigger without actually giving Western Germany nuclear weapons of its own. This means we have reached the stage

where nobody is in favor of the project of a joint nuclear fleet, except the United States, which proposed it, and West Germany, which apparently is still willing to take it, although without much nthusiasm. In West Germany, following the inevitable cycle in such matters, enthusiasm will soon be developing for Germany to have its own nuclear arms. Not only are the British losing inter-

at in the proposed nuclear fleet, but ey are considering withdrawing 50,000 their NATO troops from West Germany. One of their reasons seems to be feeling that while they are shoulderthe expense of keeping their troops West Germany to protect West Gerany, that nation is giving Britain hing of a clobbering in the field trade. If Britain spent less money proecting Germany, it might be able to

While Britain is showing such disloyity to the NATO concept, President de Gaulle is, of course, really giving our alliance the business. He is threatening withdraw from it completely in 1969, to 20th anniversary.

The simple layman, coupling such attitudes on the part of the two principal Western members of the alliance with the broader atmosphere which finds the Western relationship with Russia - the original and still only enemy NATO is supposed to have—growing warmer these days, might conclude that NATO a lame duck alliance.

But nobody in diplomacy or in nation-If policy seems able to see the situation at simply. Because Washington doesn't know ow to abandon and kill the alliance it

ered-and one can think of many rguments against abandonment which must sound urgent inside Washington's top level debates-Washington is likely to try to find all kinds of clever desperate measures to keep the alliance gong ahead, and pretend it is some kind instrument for tomorrow instead of hangover from the past.



NATO may have held off some ssible Russian attack; it did so only at the cost of keeping Germany divided, and keeping Germany divided is the symbol of the fact that the victors of World War II have not yet been able to make peace for that war, 20 years af-

And this, the one undeniable accomlishment of NATO, is still the main issue about it, as Washington now delibrates how hard to try to keep it going

The choice is still between a unity of Western powers in alliance against Rusa and a unity of Europe in which both dast and West are prepared to live tother, in the same Germany, and on e same continent.

Our consistent policy choice has been keep Germany, and Europe, divided. he trouble with this policy is that if we here to it much longer our friends will desert the alliance which does the lividing and the two Germanies will make their own unity, and we will be left holding the empty brief case with the letters NATO on it.

Thoughts On A Brief Visit The most interesting thing about the visit, when you think it over, was that it took place at all. It was not so long ago, as time is measured by history, that it would no have occurred to the Bishop of Rome to come to the United States of America. If it had, he would have set off an uproar

Yet when Paul VI, Pontiff of the Roman Catholic Church, spent a few hours this week in New York not only the city out the whole nation did him honor. The people lined the streets, the television cameras carried his every movement to people across the continent and the resident of the United States journeyed from Washington to receive him.

All this made it a memorable occasion. It was also one to dramatize the great changes that have taken place in country, in the world and within the Roman Church itself. Paradoxically endure amid the changes of men.

So it must be put down that the visit of the Bishop of Rome passed as an unruffled triumph in part because religion itself has lest its one-time grip upon the minds of men. As faith languishes,

Yet if this be true, there remains a paradox unexplained. For while the welcoming crowds along the Pontiff's path were predominantly Catholic communicants, they were by no means exclusively so. Protestants, Jews and confessors to nothing joined the throng or watched on TV. And all the world waited to hear what this man would say to the ministers of nations. Perhaps some of these were drawn by

pageantry, as to coronations or to fuserals of the great. Or perhaps for some it was merely idle curiosity. But you did not have to mingle with those who stood for hours along the chilly streets to be aware that there was something more than this.

What that something is can only be turmised, and that only by asking yourself a question. If this is such a secular age, why ould men anxiously await the outcome a Consistory of an institution they nink outmoded, as men have awaited

the recent Roman councils, why should they weigh the words of a man of God if they profess no God at all? There is one simple explanation for the paradox. When men have lost old faiths they can still hunger for some-thing to have faith in. You do not have to be a Catholic, or even a Christian, to long for something that will restore to man his spirit, his kinship with some-

hing outside himself, a spirit stripped from him by the rationalization of science and the materialism of ideologies. Put briefly, the surmise is that great numbers of people watched this Bishop eving not in anything but wanting to believe in something, hoping for some mystery that would give them back again their faith.

This is the strength of the Roman Church. If you read its history as a raional man, you cannot escape its brutality, its terrors, even its evils. Though raised up in the name of God, it is at institution created by men no less frail and fallible than their brothers. That is why in its past you can find anything you wish to look for.
Yet as an institution it has outlasted

all other institutions of men; states, and even empires, have come and gone while it remains. In some mysterious way, the idea of the Church transcends the institution. This gives its Bishop preeminence among all others. There is so priest of any Protestant church, no rabbl, no mullah, no Buddhist monk who can speak with such authority to so many. None, then, with so much power to rally men if he can find, for a mod-ern age, the touchstone of the spirit. No man knows whether this Bishop, or any other, can find the way. Not all would follow anyway. But all men can wish that some man could, because we all long for what is lost. 
