





Hard To Reject Empire Is the time and world of empires over, and is it inexorably time for a new kind of history? Or is America destined to be the lat-

est approach to a world empire in a repetition of all the history that has been lived to date? These are the questions which lie at the heart of almost every United States policy discussion these days, even

though they might rise to the surface in-We are reminded of their existence, however, by news from Britain, which is to the effect that the Conservative Party, the traditional guardian of the concepts of empire, is now heading toward a position in which it will favor having Britain end its military commit-

ments "east of Suez." This, if it happens, will not only mark one more retrenchment on the part of a Britain which has grown perhaps both tired and intelligent. It will also leave the United States with an increased burden and responsibility, if it continues to take upon itself, the responsibility of seeing, by its own strong military presence, that nobody else moves into the vacuum such British withdrawal might create.

Such a move would leave us as the last Western military presence in Asia, as the last Western power assuming the role of trying to keep peace and order This kind of opportunity repeats it-

self, in one way or another, almost every other time some old empire gives up the ghost. The post-war trend began soon after World War II, when Britain suddenly decided it did not want to be responsible for Greece, and yielded that sphere of influence and protection to us. The invitation is sometimes issued by circumstance rather than by diplomacy as in Southeast Asia, where we filtered our way in after the French had begun their departure. The invitation, or temptation, has developed in Africa, in the wake of departing European empires, but there, for a time at least, we declined the immediate succession to em-

Again and again the situation presents itself to the United States, not with any outright question as to whether or not we want to try to be the world's latest empire, but with the kind of approach which says:

"There is now this vacuum in the power politics situation. Do you want to leave it a vacuum, until it tempts and draws in or submits to somebody unworthy to fill it, or will you move in yourself and protect the situation for peace and civilization?"

But however the question is asked, the answer in the affirmative falls into the pattern of empire-unwilling, selfsacrificing empire, as all empires have always really seen themselves, but empire nonetheless. And the affirmative never really has to be an open, formal yes. It can consist merely of an act, a movement, which constitutes the beginning of a commitment.

To answer in the negative, on the other hand, to say no to empire, requires a much more arduous and conspicuous effort and decision. There is only one real way for a nation as powerful and vaguely well-intentioned as we are to avoid following the path of empire. That is to set up, and use, an alternative. It is to seek the troublesome collective form of action instead of the anilateral, to complicate responsibility by dividing it, and to help make some nternational power and law greater than our own. If a nation in our position would not have empire, it must deny it by concerted, meaningful policies which build up the alternatives. To make it all too simple, but not too far from the logic involved, if we do not want to try to run the world ourselves we must prepare to let the United Nations have sufficient responsibility and power for the

Lady Bird's Bill

It seems regrettably true that the "beauty bill" the Congress rushed through as a present to Lyndon and Lady Bird on the eve of the President's operation is little more than a plous shell of the original proposals for making a start at the business of eliminating the junk and the garishness from America's

Some cynics say not a billboard will be lost, not a junkyard diminished, by the final passage of the bill. But if we were a junkyard owner or a billboard operator, we wouldn't feel quite that philosophical about it.

This bill is a beginning as an enunciation of federal policy. It may not have teeth, but it does have principle. And it is par for the course in the history of this kind of legislation that, although i may take a mild beginning to get the first law on the books, once the law is there it can be progressively strengthened in succeeding sessions. We suspect that the redoubtable, personable, and persuasive Lady in the White House will see that her favorite cause is not forgotten in the next Congress. More power to her, and to all crusad-

ers for the better appearance of Amerfully apparent that those who care how

this country looks are few in number and fitful in their activity while the

creators of ugliness are beyond numbering and work routinely at their task. The balance of effort and energy is all wrong, and makes the odds against the crusaders higher than they should ever need to be in a country of such wealth and resources. It has become ridiculous to claim, in such a country, that we can't afford not to be ugly. But the regrettable disproportion of energy and effort continues; while the reformers gain a victory here and there, the thoughtless, the automatized routine is creating new and greater ugliness elsewhere. But evidently there is going to be a higher public consciousness of what we are letting ourselves do to ourselves, and eventually people like Mrs. Johnson are going to get something stronger in the law, and eventually those commercial interests which now think they can't afford to go to the trouble and pains of avoiding ugliness are going to realize that they themselves have been figuring the thing all wrong. That will be the passage of that rather tame bill, as a special gesture to the Presidential family in time of illness, may be quite persuasive toward that end even if it lacks rigid directions and enforcement

When the patrolman in civilian clothes happened along, and heard of the presence of a gun, he went up behind the detective and drew his own gun and told him to put up his hands. The detective thought some criminal was holding him up. He reached for his gun. The patrolman killed the detective, getting at least four shots into him. The detective merely wound-

ed the patrolman, hitting him twice. The department is investigating. One fortunate angle, of course, is that no street riots followed this particular tragic piece of police shooting. The policemen involved cannot be accused of being trigger happy against any particular race.

But there are serious questions raised, both about the general training of police in the use of their own weapons, and perhaps especially about the wearing and use of weapons by policemen when they are not in uniform. There is, as this incident illustrated, nothing to distinguish a cop in civilian clothes who carries a gun from any mobster who carries a gun-nothing except his possible possession of much greater discretion and restraint in the way he does wear and use his weapon. In this particular instance, the discretion and restraint employed were less
