





Signals That Failed While, conceivably, peace demonstrations in this country last weekend may have conveyed some comfort to the Communists of the world-as indeed Communists, in their own ignorance, are likely to take comfort from any of those many American divisions of opinion on foreign policy which are both the privilege and the strength of democracy -things were not going too happily for the Communists themselves in two situations where they might possibly have been expected to show some ability to

get people out in the streets. In South Vietnam, the Viet Cong radio had called for a one hour general strike to be staged last Friday morning, the strike supposedly to be in honor of a young South Vietnamese who was executed last year for plotting an attempt on the life of Defense Secretary Robert McNamara.

The success or failure of this Communist-called strike among the people of South Vietnam—the test as to whether or not the Communist call was able to have any influence whatsoever -provided something of a test, in Vietnam, of some of the more extreme claims being made in this country at about the same hour, by some of our demonstrators for peace in Vietnam. In the claims of some of these demonstrators, the Viet Cong are the potent liberators of the people of South Vietnam, who would be welcomed if only we would get out of the way.

The people of South Vietnam had some kind of opportunity to show such sentiment, if it exists, last Friday. But all reports seem to have been negative. Roads into Saigon from the countryside were comparatively deserted that day, as if peasants who would normally be carrying produce to markets were afraid of Viet Cong violence along the roads, but there was no change in the formal rhythm of life noted that day in on or any of the other cities under Vietnamese control. So if President Johnson, down Washington, regrets that he can't keep every expression and demonstration of American opinion harmoniously and happily in line with the policies he and his advisers have selected, let him derive some minor comfort from the fact that not everything comes up unanimity for the Communists either.

### Disowns Word, Not Deed

In an apparently significant speech, given out at San Diego, Under Secretary of State Thomas C. Mann, who has been the number one architect of President Johnson's toughness in Latin America, went through the motions of diselaiming some of the extreme infersnces of the resolution recently passed by the House of Representatives calling any nation in the hemisphere to in-

tervene where any other nation might be threatened with Communist subversion.
Under Secretary Mann, in fact, included in his speech these particular

"I believe unilateral, intervention by one American state in the internal affairs of another is not only prescribed by the O.A.S. Charter, but that nonintervention is a keystone of the structure of he inter-American system."

Intervention, when it becomes necessary to protect "weak and fragile states" from "subversive elements responding to direction from abroad," should. Mann said, be a collective af-

But in the instance of Dominican intervention, which Under Secretary Mann spent much of his speech defending, the United States speedily violated the O.A.S. Charter which the Under Secretary now cites, and willingly took its chance of shattering the "keystone structure of the inter-American sys-

The agonizing question is, indeed, whether that inter-American system can ever be rebuilt or nourished back to life

The resolution passed by the House increased the odds against any such development, which would have to include some hemisphere trust in the motivations and the restraint of the United States. And Under Secretary Mann's speech, which rejects the formal language of the House resolution, but which still seems to share and condone its spirit, will not increase the "good neighborliness" of the hemispheric cli-

fects of the House resolution, the Mann

What one has more difficulty imagining is the positive results their authors seem to expect from them. They claim the aim of making the hemisphere safe from Communism. It seems just as probable that they will make the hemisphere such an unhappy and uneasy place that the conditions for the growth of Communism will be created and encouraged.

One suspects the much greater security against Communism is being created by such things as the President's policy for a new treaty with Panama, which all true believers in Under Secretary Mann's hard line approach must consider diamally soft.

Three jolly cheers, and a pip-pip, say we, for that precious movement over in England which has begun criticizing the British national anthem, "God Save The Queen," for being "flat" and unsuitable to modern times, and which is campaigning to have Britain adopt something newer and snappier.

If the British will give up "God Save The Queen," that means the Canadians will have clear and uncontroversial sailing with "The Maple Tree Forever," which is a beautiful national anthem for

And it would mean that we in this country could soon move in and pass ourselves an act of Congress giving us a national anthem somebody can sing. That would be, of course, "America,"

or "My Country "Tis Of Thee," which many of us grew up singing at the opening of every school day, which has a beautiful tune for everybody to sing, and which has words that are everlastingly beautiful for Americans.

"The Star Spangled Banner," difficult thing as it is sounds like a different anthem depending on what star of opera or stage is supposed to be leading it. No mass audience is ever able to follow it successfully. No new arrangemen ever succeeds in bringing it all within the range of any average voice.

The consequence is that audiences are dropping more and more into the fatalistic habit of not even attempting to go the route with the anthem, which, in turn, gives the impression that Americans are not interested in having a national anthem or a country, for that

make a heartening difference. In fact, most of us never did mind, during the long years when we thought "America" was the national anthem, sharing the music with England and Canada.
