The techniques of the House Unimerican Activities Committee remain mentially the same over the years, and over the targets.

public hearings are held. When the targets are brought in, they are subjected to lines of questioning designed primarily to force them to resort to a refusal to answer, the best kind of refusal, for headline purposes, being hat which "takes the Fifth Amend-

After a sufficient number of quesons which won't be answered have sen asked, and the protection of one mendment or another claimed a suffitient number of times, the Committee and its staff will produce and present any incidental information of a damning and derogatory nature they have been able to dig up about the victim of the

By this process, the individuals summoned, and the organisation they may represent, are hung out to dry in, the Committee hopes, headlines which are venerously long and high.

This is the form of investigation, or nquisition, which has become the standard formula for Congress. The real instigation is always done behind closed dors, and in secrecy, and often it and its soults are never heard of unless they re deemed suitable for headline drama when the prepared show is presented in

The public hearings do not add to the ommittee's knowledge. They merely share with the public some portion of what the Committee itself has found out. Like all planned theatrical productions, they have a predetermined course and a scheduled climax.

This kind of investigation drama, or side show, which we in this democracy have designed for ourselves, is probably in all respects a more civilized and desirable thing than the kind of inquisi-Sons that would be managed by the kind of targets the House Committee on Un-American Activities has selected for itelf over the years-the Communist Party and its affiliates, or the Ku Klux Elan and its soul, mates.

But there is still something offensive about any such effort deliberately to put out to blacken and destroy, by whatever tactic seems likely to produce headlines, the particular Committee target of the moment.

It is still an inquisition, which uses the methods and tactics of an inquisition, with the predetermined intentions of an inquisition.

And whether its target of any particular moment or year happens to be more popular with some than its targets of other years does not seem, to us, to matter very much in any true weighing of the appeal and value of the Committee as an American Institution.

We are never sure the Committee itself is not one of the most Un-American stitutions we have.

Striking Weak Enterprises There is some perverse law of human shavior which makes us grow more uneasonable the more pressure upon us mounts, the more damage our unreasonableneas may do.

We are often most violent when we are least sure of our cause and our ground. And we are often most berserk and uncompromising precisely when that brand of conduct is most likely to injure and destroy the very things we surnelves profess to be seeking.

Some unhappy combination of both of these human tendencies seems to have worked its way into two strikes lately. The newspaper strike in New York surried itself to the very edge of the destruction of some more of New York's great historic newspapers, it

The one big question the current strike has opened in many minds is the question of whether the same and sensible thing to do would be to abandon the idea of bus transportation altogether instead of trying to finds ways of reviving it. All the great emergency measures the authorities of Hartford planned and organized to cope with the situation in the event of strike have. gone unused. There has been no visible emergency for the public. The emergency is for the survival of transportation by bus in an American city. Perhaps the buses no longer belong in a place like Hartford; perhaps they belong in other countries where not every garage has three cars.

That is the way the bus strike looks to many of us, as the New York newspaper strike also looked-as a situation in which very fine and otherwise normal people become most demanding and most uncompromising when such conduct may cost the very life of the enterprize with which they are dealing.

### The Battle Of The Flowers

Right in the very heart and middle of the contagious vandalism which distinguished the last day of the World's Fair there was the strangely revealing bat tle of the flowers.

And we find it difficult to join the normal press accounts in their labeling of the vandal-villains in this battle of the flowers.

The flowers involved were some 90,000 lovely chrysanthemums which the Fair had planted for itself last Septem-

On the last day of the Fair, the situation was this: that everybody loved these chrysanthemums

The Fair officials who had set them out loved them. The individual exhibit keepers who had tended them loved them.

And the good people attending the last day of the Fair loved them so much they couldn't bear to think of them being lost and demolished like almost everything else connected with the Fair, There was one crucial fact that ordinary people in this situation did not

They did not know that these plantings of chrysanthemums were not scheduled to be destroyed and thrown out along with most of everything else. They did not know these chrysanthemums had been put in as permanent plantings, to be one of the main floral displays in the new park which is supposed to be the one thing salvaged from the Fair. This lack of knowledge was, then, the faint vestige of excuse for the behavio of all the people who, on the last day of the Fair, started pulling these chrysanthemum plants up by the roots, with the idea of taking them home to their own backyards, and thus saving them from ingiorious death while also providing, to said backyards, a perennial sou-

venir of the Fair. When the flower vandals, or flower rescuers, as some of them undoubtedly considered themselves, found that the guards at the gates were taking flowers away from people as well as any other kind of stolen souvenir, they took to pinching off the flowers, and packing just the roots into their handbags.

Just as there seems to have been a love of flowers and thus something a shade beyond mere vandalism-in the conduct of these people, so there was also a special passion in the reaction of the Fair's own people. They fought to save the flowers much more fiercely than they fought to save fixtures, or merchandise. They resented what they viewed as the attack on their flowers much more than they resented the final day smashing of their exhibits.

So both sides of the battle, ironically, seem to have been dominated by a love of flowers-a common denominator o a kind which ought somehow to have produced a shared happiness instead of a pitched battle.

We are not sure that some of the other battles in history have not evolved from circumstances and motivations equally ironic.

**Everything's Coming Up Onions** 

It could happen only to the one place in the world that has been known both as the Flour City and the Flower City. Where else would a load of topsoil, applied for the sake of the urban landscape, come up with a crop more suitable to the farm?

We refer to what we think we heard on the radio-that Rochester, New York, suddenly found this topsoil sprouting all over with green onions.

There is a theory, of course, about how the seeds got there. But we sug-gest that, before Rochester does anything hasty-if by any chance it has not already done so-the City Fathers should make sure the onions really are

We cannot help recalling the polgnant childhood episode of Harriet Beecher Stowe, though she may not even have gone through Rochester on her journey with her father from Litchfield, Conn., Cincinnati, Ohio. She and her brother found a bag of what they thought were onions in their mother's bedroom. They ate them all up. Sadly their mother said: "My dears, those were not onions, but the rosts of beautiful flowers." It would be too ironic if the Flower City made Harriet's mistake and disposed of a crop of tullps in this way. But from all we know of industrious Roches-ter, it is not a land of lotus-caters, or tulip-eaters either. It is a city that always has known its onlons, and now it probably always will - CHRISTIAN

NEW HAVEN (AP) - Plans for a new collseum that will hopefully lure some of the convention trade away from Hart ford were announced today by Mayor Richard Lee.

The 9,000 - seat colliseum will "attract numerous shows, sport ing events, conventions and ex-hibitions for which New Haven now has no adequate space," Lee said.

As for the old New Haven Arena, it will be purchased by the city for \$900,000 with the aid of federal money and torn down. the mayor said. The coliseum is to be built or

a 230,000 quare foot site already owned by the city just off. the Oak Street connector. The site is near the interchange of the Connecticut Turnpike with the new Interstate Route 91 and the "identity by the state" s "ideally located," Lee said.

The colliseum is to be designed by Kevin Roche, chief designer for Eero Saarinen & Associates. It will be near the Roche-de-signed Knights of Columbus skyscraper on South Church St. The New Haven arena is old and inadequate and we have long known that many shows, conventions and other attrac-tions have bypassed the area because of its limited capacity and lack of facilities," Lee said.
