30 Days to Better Spelling Two Trouble Areas

You find you're unable.

By this time it should be clear, at least to regular readers, that these articles have attempted to simplify the so-called problem areas in spelling. There is tremendous common sense in spelling the English language, despite all the digressing by those who profess the desire to help us with spelling problems.

It does not give much help, mirabile, what helped us to spell though it may give comfort, to the word as admirable and not to solve the problem. Our remedy is to put an "a" in its suffix (atom), so using able and file as a suffix. It would be a lot more helpful, and it would also give greater comfort - to be told how to solve the problem. Our remedy is to put an "a" in its suffix (atom), so using able and file as a suffix.

The only word we should explain briefly in this verse is the word "cousin." A cousin is a family relation, and in our context of spelling, we mean simply a related word. For example, admiration is a "cousin" of admiration.

Representatives of the Connecticut League of Historical Societies outlined a program for the possible formation of a Tolland Historical Society at last night's meeting of the public advisory committee of the Tolland Junior Woman's Club.

"Joe said, 'What's going on here? Who are these guys?'" "I followed the man with Joe and the second one backed after them, holding the gun and pointing it right at me. He was about 20 feet from me when he fired the gun once."

The man put Joe in a late model, two-door beige car. The headlights were on. I couldn't see if anyone else was in the car, because it was too dark. The car was pointed east on 86th Street, just off Park Avenue.

"Joe was still struggling as it sped off. I was shouting, 'Who are these guys?'"

"This did 69-year-old Joe Bananas - born Joseph Bonanno in Sicily - disappear. Several witnesses say they heard the shot, but police did not find the ejected shell. Maloney was not hurt.

Maloney, once an assistant U.S. attorney and chief of the trial section of the Justice Department, reportedly has expressed the belief that it was a real, not staged, kidnaping. Police and the FBI have withheld their opinions.

Tucker's Basketball Teams To Play Under Town Rules

The Vernon Community Basketball Program will continue to operate this year but will sign its practices to those of the town. Robert Tucker, the director of the program, and the referees will be paid by the town.

Tucker made it clear that the program may break away if the commission's rules do not prove satisfactory.

Following Tucker's program will remain an affiliate of the town's recreation program is uncertain. In his statement, Tucker said his program "will still exist and remain solvent until it is proven that the town of Vernon Recreation Commission will give each and every youngster of the age 8 to 12 a good complete program."

In that case, his program will simply dissolve into the town's program, Tucker said.

If the members of the House Committee split on party lines over the lead-taking section, then the entire constitutional package approved by the convention could be stuck in committee.

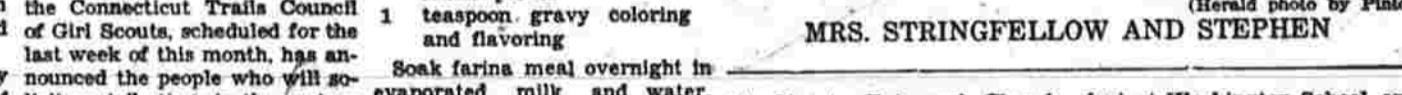

Gabe Paul Owners' Choice

Cleveland President Supported

CHICAGO (AP)—There is growing sentiment among the major league club owners that Gabe Paul is the man to lead the league in the coming season.

Paul, 57, is the president of the Cleveland Indians, and he has been the most prominent candidate for the job since he was named to the position last year.

Most of the owners once again favor a ruler from their own ranks.

Paul's most enthusiastic supporter is Bill DeWitt, owner of the Cincinnati Reds, who originally proposed Paul but the president of the Indians subsequently advised that he is not to be considered.

"And I put it in writing, too," Paul emphasized.

"A man can always change his mind," DeWitt said. "Especially if it is in the best interests of baseball."

Paul preceded DeWitt as president of the Reds before leaving Cincinnati to become general manager and eventually president of the Cleveland club.

What started out as a list of 18 candidates who the club owners gathered Tuesday was reduced substantially with five men emerging as leading candidates before the new development.

These five were Eugene M. Zuckert, secretary of the former Puro; Curtis E. McMay, former president of the National League; G. Keith Funston, president of the American League; and Louis Carol, president of the National League.

"Not one of these, however, could gather enough support to warrant even an unofficial ball. Fourteen votes — seven more than any other — are required for election."

2. Director of player affairs.
3. Director for public information.
4. Director for broadcasting.
5. Director for amateur baseball.

This group will serve as a sort of cabinet for the commissioner.

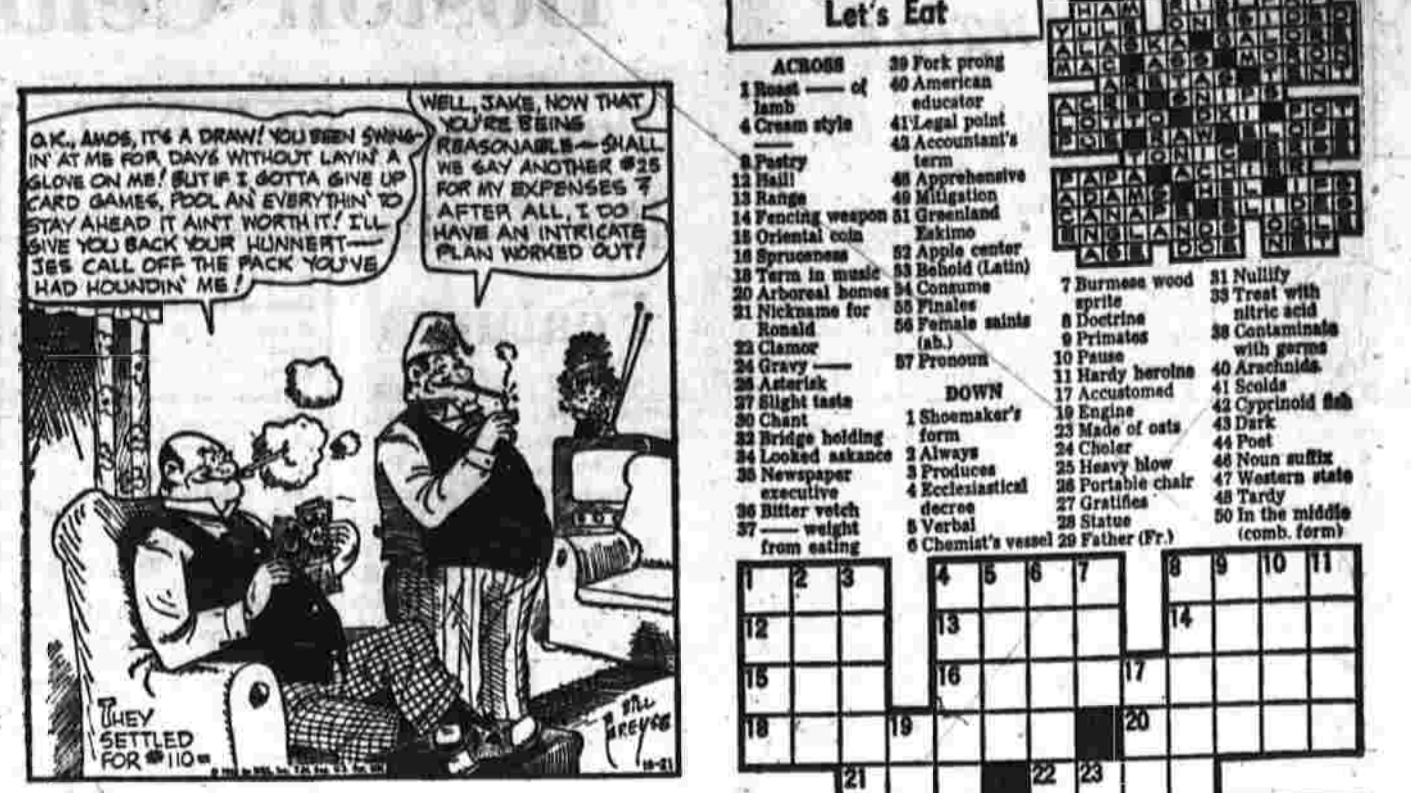

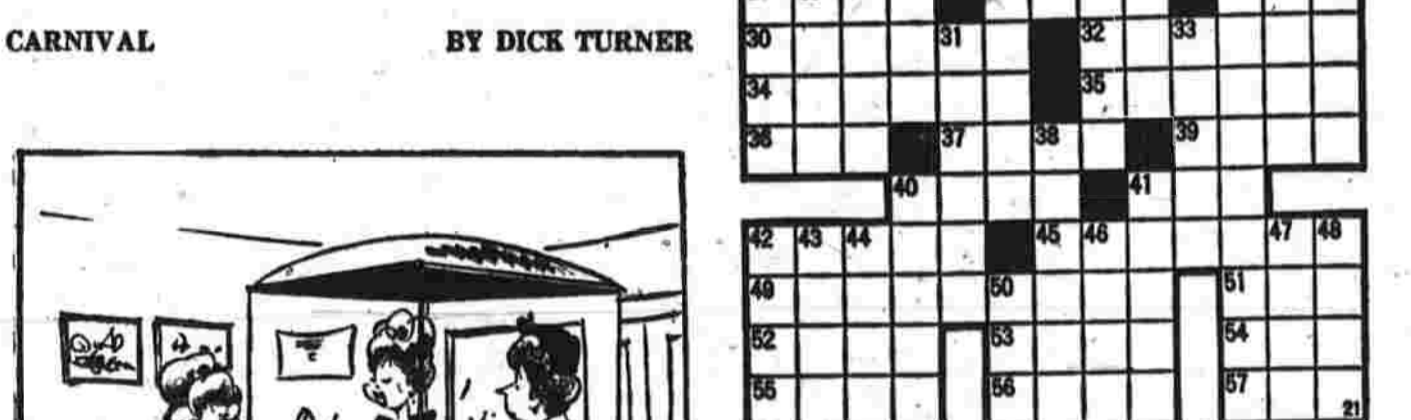

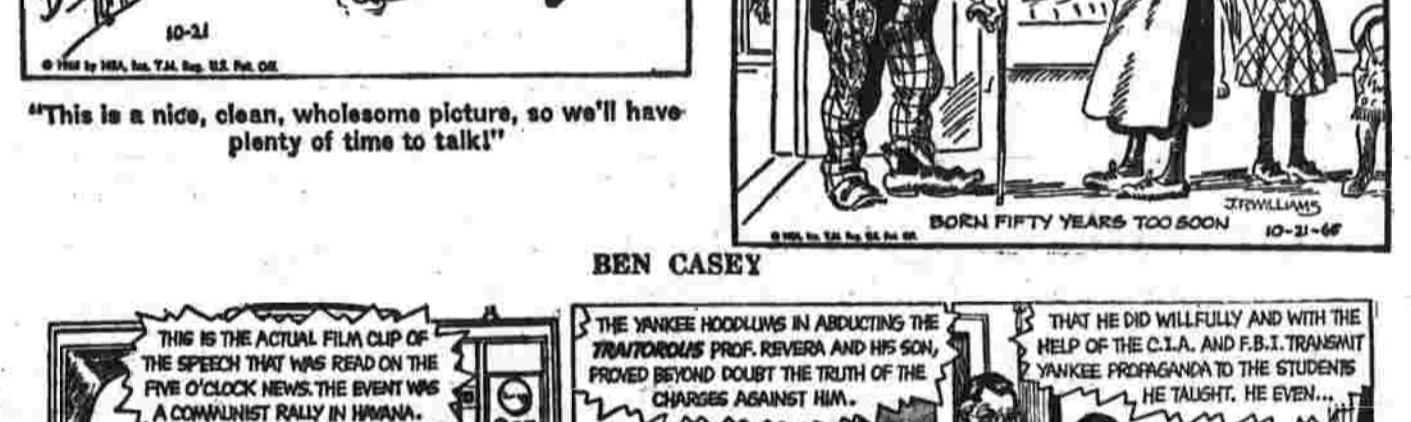
