





Back Toward The Positive

Diplomatic reports from the United Nations suggest that upgrade efforts, rather than downgrade acquiescence, have begun to attach themselves to the suestion of the world organization's potential peace-keeping powers.

For one important thing, the United States seems to have pulled out of its long tailspin with regard to United Nations policies and to have returned toward some of the concepts and purposes in which it was once a leader. For the central issue at the United Nations-the thing which is really always the central issue, for that matter

-the brief essential background is this: 1. The United Nations was originally organized with the Security Council where the big veto power would always be present, as the proposed location of any action against war.

2. When North Korea invaded South Korea, Russia, with its veto, was boycotting the Security Council, and this absence made possible the historic vote by which the Security Council sent the United Nations flag to lead the police action against aggression in Korea.

3. The necessity, and the success, for that particular United Nations police action led members of the United Nations, led by the United States, to a realization that there ought to be some way to launch similar actions in simila situations even if there did happen to be a veto opposing in the Security Council sembly of its "uniting for peace resolution" in which the General Assembly assumed to itself the power to move into Korea-like actions and policies should

the Security Council prove deadlocked. 4. This worked spectacularly well in the Suez crisis of 1956, when Britain and France yielded to the intervention led by the General Assembly after they had vetoed United Nations intervention in the Security Council.

5. But the eftermath to the Sues success, in preventing a war, raised a shadow almost immediately, when France, one of the nations which had been conducting the attack on Egypt, refused to pay for the cost of United Nations peace patrols. This shadow became a major issue after both France and Russia refused to help pay for the cost of peace-keeping operations in the Congo, and United States efforts to force them to pay such back bills threw the General Assembly into that paralysis which, last fall and winter, reduced the whole influence and prestige of the United Nations to the lowest point since

6. This financial strike against United Nations General Assembly policy constituted a new kind of veto, which threatened to make impossible, in any future emergency, any peace-keeping action on the part of the General Assembly. 7. In all the long negotiations looking

toward some resolution of the financial question, both the United States and Russia were supposedly agreed on the general proposition that the peacekeeping power which the General Assembly had assumed for itself back in 1951 should be shifted exclusively back to the Security Council, thus making the world safe for the big powers, and for big power wars, again. What has happened now is that ti

United States, at least, in response to leadership from the diplomacy of Ireland and Britain, and perhaps in response to the appearance and pronouncements of Pope Paul, has shifted back toward a willingness to talk about designing and setting up some new procodure by which the General Assembly can get its chance to act against war, without threat of financial veto, in cases where the Security Council finds itself

The United States keeps alternating between trying to police the world itself and trying to build up a world police force. Our diplomacy at the United Nations has now returned to where it was in 1950 and 1951 and 1956-to the effort to build up the United Nations peace-keeping muscle. It will be a great day for the world if we ever manage to come to the moment when we can bring our actions and obligations into line with such a policy.

If our state must live only in terms of provable necessities, we will soon have the nation's poorest highways, worst schools, most neglected slums, and most dismal public facilities of all kinds. It is hard to imagine a surer way of degrading the quality of life in Connecticut. Here in Waterbury, it is interesting to note, our city Parking Authority wants to acquire some land at the corner of Bank and Grand Streets. This would be an ideal site for a parking garage that the Authority wants to build. We need the garage, and the Authority could probably prove that need. But could it

prove that it is "necessary" to put the garage on this very piece of land? Other cossible sites have been suggested, alhough none of them is quite as good. If it were a case of pure necessity howwer, the city might be able to settle for the second best, or the third best-or the tenth best, if the first nine site owners invoked the gimmick Mr. Alcorn wants to write into our state laws.


