Wreckage of Ill-Fated Vanguard Airliner Litters Runway

DRAMA IN THE SKIES 36 Die in London; Pilot Foils Hijack

LONDON (AP)—A British domestic airliner exploded in flames on its third attempt to land in blinding fog at London Airport early today, killing all 36 persons aboard.

The plane, a four-engine Vanguard turboprop designed to carry 130 passengers, was landing at 1:35 a.m. after a flight from Edinburgh, Scotland. Operated by British European Airways, it carried 30 passengers, one a child, and a crew of 6.

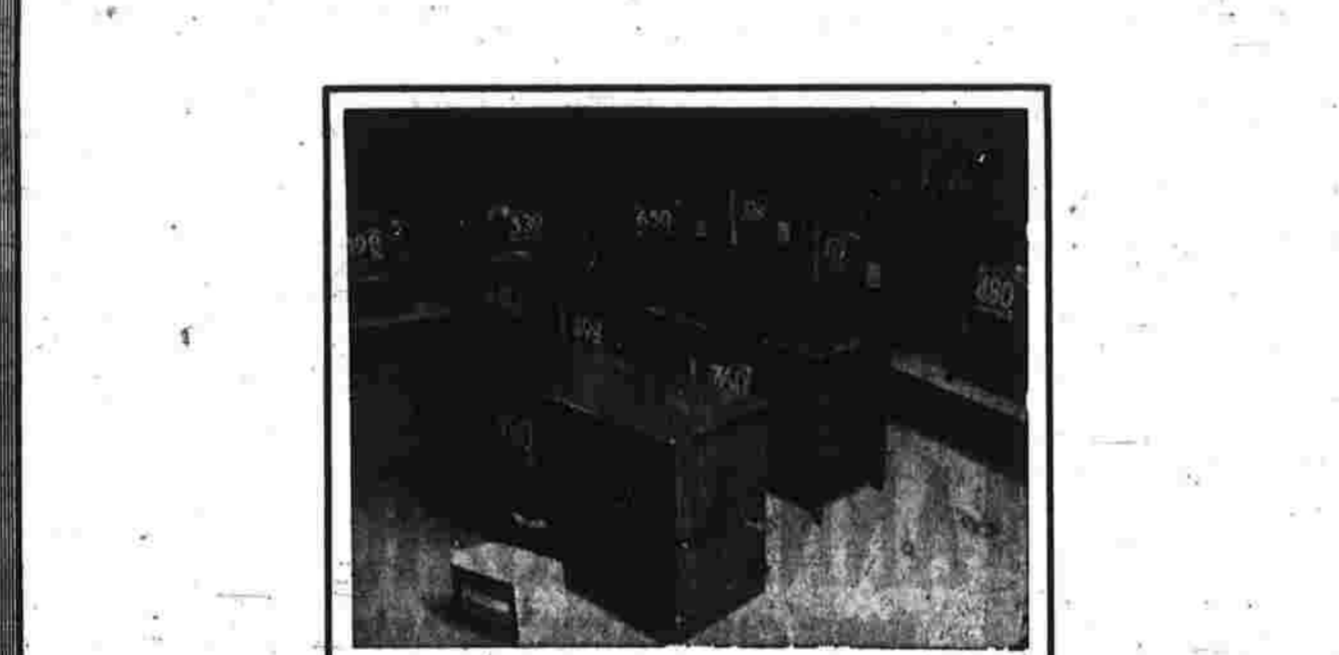

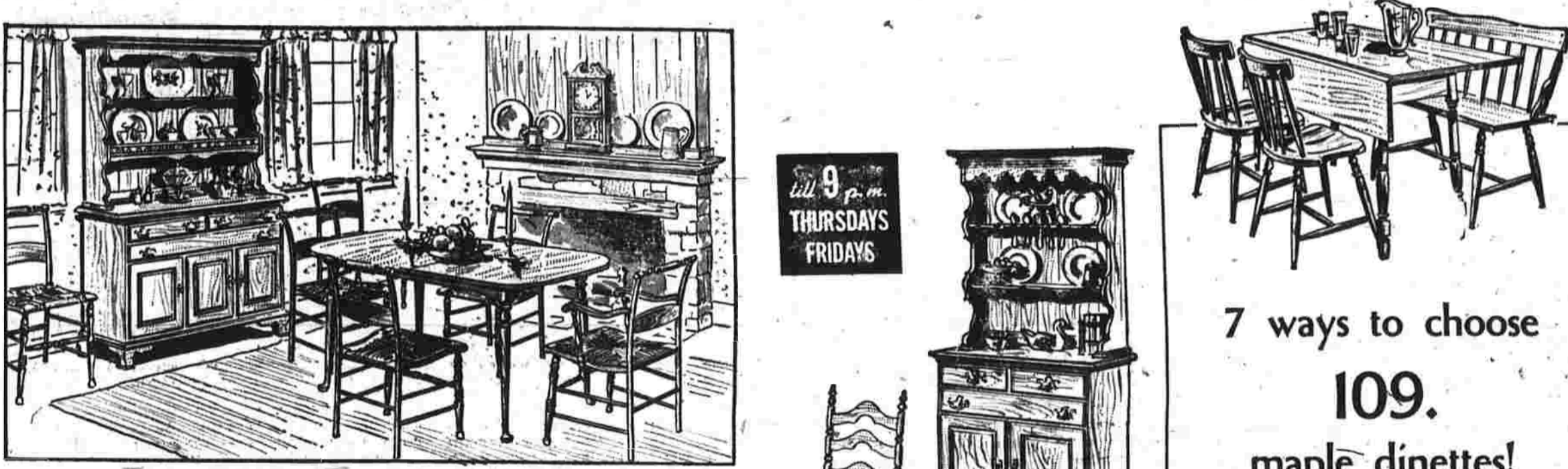

Bolton Individual Instruction, Seven Pupils at a Time

Mrs. Elizabeth Wright, English teacher at the junior high level at Bolton High School, has been experimenting with taped English exercises in one of her Grade 7 classes this fall.

Mrs. Wright taped the lessons herself, using the Hotel Reading Inventory, a book of exercises in such aspects of language as phonics and vocabulary building. She has taped lessons on the sounds of vowels and consonants and on vocabulary building.

The day The Herald visited the class, seven students were finishing a test on word opposites. Their heads were plugged into the tape recorder, they were listening intently and circling a number on their score sheets. The score sheets came with the Hotel Inventory.

Mrs. Wright, who taught Grades 5 and 6 for many years before returning to the teaching profession last year, explained that one of the most important things being taught in the state is to listen. Listening is apparently becoming a test art.

The veteran teacher said that she could stand up in front of the room and read the questions, or the word opposites, or whatever, to the students, but that they would always ask her to repeat, and she would not be able to keep so steady a pace as when she did when she recorded her voice on the tape. With the taped lesson, the students either learn to listen and respond quickly, or they can't do the lesson.

It took a few weeks to acustom the students to this new learning method, Mrs. Wright said, but now they seem to enjoy it. Furthermore, having the pupils working on their own at the table frees the teacher to work on something else with other members of the class, who have had their turn at the tape, or will have later on.

At this point Mrs. Wright has reached the end of Bol and is looking around for more material. She said the method is good because it can be used to diagnose where individual students are having trouble, and can be used for drill at any time.

According to Principal Ralph Conlon, although Mrs. Wright's idea of taped English drill is not new, it is rare enough in this part of the state to be termed an innovation.

The new plan retains the Wyllys St. ramp, but provides for a northwesterly relocation of Glen Rd., making it one way, with exit onto the ramp at the north, and entry from Spring St. on the south.

Dennison, at a meeting this morning in the Town Planning Office, said that Case Bros. engineers will study the new proposal before a decision on its acceptance is made.

The meeting was attended by Town Planning Director Joseph Tamsky; Planning Commission Chairman John Lameno; Robert Dennison; Wally Fortin, president of Case Bros.; and Robert Brock, executive vice president of the Manchester CotC.

Tamsky said today that he and Mayor Francis Maloney will ask state highway officials to attend a public meeting in Manchester in the near future, to explain their newest proposal and to explore other possibilities.

On Sept. 30, over 100 property owners of the Highland area had gathered into the Municipal Hearing Room to hear Tamsky explain the then-up-to-date Rt. 6 plan.

By a show of hands they expressed overwhelming objections to a ramp at Wyllys St. and suggested that it be moved about 600 feet to the west.

State highway officials have said that they would be amenable to suggestions, insofar as they do not alter the present Rt. 6 alignment proposal.
