





They were also privileged, at nat Bandung Conference, to glimpse omething else—the temporarily benign ountenance of a Communist China ager, even then, to spread a brand of futionary leadership which was not n exact harmony with the slightly older nd more tired revolutionism of Soviet

By the time the Algiers Conference was scheduled for last winter, the rivalry between the Russian and the Chinese brands of Communism, and between their rival efforts to spread and gain influence among the newly developing nations in both Asia and Africa, had come out into the open, and the Algiers Conference came to have its primary imortance because of that rivalry. It as not to demonstrate, this Conference, the unity and common cause of the Afro-Asian world so much as it was to reveal which Communist giant

Russia or China. Last winter, it was . China which seemed to be winning that battle. The pay-off was that China was invited to he Algiers Conference, but that Russia was not. Then a revolutionary coup in Algeria itself changed the identity of the host government; so many of the potential guests were uncertain whether hey wanted to come into the new and unpredictable atmosphere that the Conference had to be postponed, over the strenuous protests of Chins, which wantd it held as scheduled, but to the pleasure of Russis, which had never got

belf invited. In the intervening months, the strugde over who would be allowed to come to the Algiers Conference, if it was held, segan all over again. And in this struggle, Russia gained the advantage of an witation at last. But when this happened, China announced that it would now boycott the Conference, and now the situation was just the reverse of what it had been last winter. Now Russia wanted the conference to be

held, China wanted it postponed.

It has now turned out to be postponement, and the kind of postponement which seems to mean forever. And, although Russia and China each had its particular champions and sympathizers mside the Afro-Asian group of 45 nations, what the group as a whole has now said by its adjournment without having held the Conference for which it was gathered is that it sees no value or advantage in constituting itself a bat-Eleground for the Soviet-Chinese rival-The original Bandung Conference in

1955, met in a spirit of celebration of the end of the era of colonialism in the world. Since that time, the member nations have had 10 more years experience with their own freedom from oldfashioned colonialism and 10 more years acquaintance, at varying disances and in varying degrees, with the games of influence, intrigue, and pressure the world's big powers still manage to play, even in the wake of colonialism

And their main verdict, at Algiers this week, has been that they wanted to take themselves away from this postolonialism colonialism, and be satelliter to nobody. In the end, they rejected the business of making any choice between China and Russia. That is surely healthy for them, and

it also has a side meaning for the United States. They don't want anybody's enevolent post-colonialism, including ours. The cue for sensible and intelligent great powers is to respect these new sovereigntles of the world, in attitude as well as in deed, even when it may seem; to one great power or another, that their affairs could stand a little nudging from outside. Not to let them make their own mistakes—to put it at the extreme can be the great and costly big power mistake in this era of

And now, mirabile dictu, comes actual news from Fordham College, which is going to inaugurate, a year from now, a test program by which a group of students will be awarded a bachelor of arts

This isn't quite at the cradle. But it is three years closer. Under the test program, youngsters will be receiving their bachelor of arts degree at the tender

The Fordham innovation, it is true, will not have the purity of principle involved in awarding degrees at birth. These particular students will get their degrees at 18 as the result of a process of telescoping the present seventh grade, the four years of high school, and the four years of college into a six year course. Students will have to work for their degrees, and will still be under some pressure and competition. And one reason for the experimental innovation is the feeling of the Rev. Leo McLaughlin, the new President of Fordham University, that the educational process is taking too many years of one's life, in these days when post-graduate work is becoming almost the normal

On the other hand, the proposed experiment has at least an instinct toward taking some of the rat race competition out of education. The students selected for this special accelerated program are not, Father McLaughlin says, going to be selected because they are geniuses, or in the top percentage of their class. And, he promises, they are going to be watched, to be sure they don't start putting rat race strain on themselves. "We're dealing with lives," says Father McLaughlin, "and we cannot treat that

That's a nice way to put it—lives, not always necessarily degrees, titles, status professions, academic standings, or even income ratings, but lives.

Crackdown Time

There are laws to protect legitimate nacientious objectors, These laws will continue to be recognized, but it is lime to crack down on the draft dodg ers, kooks, chronic demonstrators, and Communists who are distorting the pic ture of American support for freedom in the world. There is no domestic danger that

hese people will in any way weaken American determination to protect the people of South Viet Nam. On the contrary it is likely that demonstration like those of the past weekend will strengthen this determination. Despite the campus activities of some young kooks our youth will "rally around the Flag." Enlistments have jumped with the increased draft calls.


The danger is not in any faltering on the part of loyal Americans. There always have been pacifists in this country in every war, and they have been tolerated and largely ignored. Of course, a person who was a patriot and war leader in the war against Hitler and is a pacifist in a war against Communism deserves the critical appraisal that he will surely get.

The danger is that the activities of these persons who give the impression to our friends abroad and more especially to the enemy that we are no united in our determination to defend freedom in South Viet Nam. Reports from Hanol state that the North Vietamese are convinced that we are halfearted in our war effort and that we will withdraw when we do not win an easy victory. This same belief is echo-

It must be granted that some of the administration words in the past have encouraged this belief. The constant refrain that we are ready to negotiate, ever negotiated anything with the Red Chinese, has been considered weakness by the Communist camp. The massive buildup and determined action in the field unforunately has been ignored by convinced Communist leaders that

America is weak and divided. The nation has been treated to disgraceful exhibitions by so-called colege students for some time. College is a place for study, not for riots. Those who want to riot should be tossed out. Professors who teach treason should be removed. No nation need tolerate treason in the name of "free speech" any more than it need tolerate obscenity. A good deal has been written about shortage of space in colleges. If this space were used by students instead of demonstrators there might be enough to go






