In State Referendums

Voters OK More Spending, But Give a Few Slaps Too

WASHINGTON (AP) — Two things as routine as the sun rising in the east were rejected by voters in small counties to serve on more than one court, also failed.

New York voters rejected two proposals to expand the state's public housing program and also turned down increased pensions for New York City street cleaners.

In Kentucky, North Carolina, Maine and Texas, however, large bond issues were approved. The biggest money measure on the ballot in the eight states holding referenda Tuesday, a \$1-billion New York bond issue to fight water pollution, received overwhelming endorsement.

Connally, who has already announced he will seek a third term next year, campaigned for a four-year term, while the state AFL-CIO fought it. When vote counting was stopped for the night at midnight the tally stood 264,878 against, 217,052 for.

Burns insisted that the amendment was a vitally needed safety measure, while opponents contended the governor was using the proposal to pave the way for a try at reelection next year when the Florida chief executive's term will be extended from two to four years.

In Ohio, education forces lost a battle to raise the state sales tax from 3 to 4 per cent in an effort to raise more money for education. The measure fell by a narrow margin.

House to Study Maritime Schools

WASHINGTON (AP) — A New York proposal to call a constitutional convention on legislative reapportionment in April 1967 was defeated as was an amendment increasing legislative terms from two to four years.

In Kentucky, the administration of Gov. Edwin P. Breathitt Jr. won its fight for the biggest bond issue in the state's history — a \$170-million measure of which \$138 million is for highways and the rest for other building projects.

It won overwhelming approval and is expected to bring an additional \$700 million in matching federal aid.

North Carolina voters heeded the appeal of Gov. Dan K. Moore for a \$300-million bond issue for road construction to be repaid with revenues from the state's gasoline tax. They also voted to authorize creation by the legislature of an intermediate court of appeals. The 1967 General Assembly will have to approve it.

In Maine, three major funding proposals all passed. They were an amendment to extend the term of the state chief executive's term to four years, and separate bond issues of \$2.9 million and \$2.9 million for facilities at state colleges and capital improvements at the state university.

In Texas, voters approved an \$88-million bond issue to set up a loan fund for college students.

They agreed to a five cent increase per \$100 of property valuation to pay for new buildings at state colleges.

Also approved were proposals allowing Texas to participate in federal health care programs, to make the teacher retirement system's board a constitutional agency and free it of some restrictions on investments and to retire judges at the age of 75.

In Pennsylvania, voters approved two relatively minor proposals exempting some persons from occupational privileges taxes and permitting the General Assembly to set conditions under which former judges can be assigned temporarily to court duty.

Water Increases In Reservoirs
The town's water supply has increased in the past month, but it is still less than capacity, according to a report issued by Lawrence Wittkove, superintendent of the Water and Sewer Department.
The report shows that as of Nov. 1, a total of 258 million gallons was stored in Porter, Howard, Roaring Brook and Globe Hollow Reservoirs, slightly over half capacity.
The Nov. 1, 1965 water level was higher than it was at the corresponding time the last two years, but it still needs 100 million gallons to reach the Nov. 1, 1962 level.
Of the four reservoirs, Porter was filled almost to capacity, and the lowest level was reached in the Roaring Brook Reservoir, which is only about one third full.
This October produced more rain than an October usually gets—27.1 inches less, against a 31.8 inches average.
Since Jan. 1, however, less rain has fallen than in previous years—10.59 inches below the 36.25 average.
Storage in the reservoirs is now about 10 million gallons more than it was the first of September.

Mrs. Hicks Sees Victory As Vindication of Policy

BOSTON (AP) — Louise Day dates whose view disagree with Hicks, who once more has topped the ticket in a Boston city election, regards her victory as a vindication of her policies as chairman of the School Committee.

In that office Mrs. Hicks has remained steadfast in opposition to busing of school pupils to eliminate alleged racial imbalances, and she has insisted on preservation of the neighborhood district system of assigning pupils to schools — a system which has been the target for a strong stand. To do so, she said, would be "undemocratic, un-American, absurdly expensive, unworkable and diametrically opposed to the wishes of the parents of this city."

Mrs. Hicks' nearest rival was fellow committeeman Thomas Blaisdell, 70, 73.

Mrs. Hicks' massive vote confirms her as a power in Boston politics, but it is not known if it will add to her strength as a statewide candidate.

Last year Mrs. Hicks entered the contest for the Democratic nomination for state treasurer, but while she carried Boston, the incumbent, Robert C. Crane prevailed easily in the statewide count.

This was the first time that opponents of Mrs. Hicks prevailed in an organized front by backing a full slate of candidates.

The organization, which was called Citizens for Boston Schools, supported one incumbent, Arthur Gardland, and presented a slate of four others, Vella DiCesare, George H. Parker, John F. Gagnin and Malcolm King, the only Negro candidate.

All, including Gardland, were defeated.

On the issue of busing pupils away from such districts to other schools, Mrs. Hicks took a strong stand. To do so, she said, would be "undemocratic, un-American, absurdly expensive, unworkable and diametrically opposed to the wishes of the parents of this city."

This fall the parents of some 200 Negro children bused their children to other districts from their home schools in which the enrollments ranged up to 80 per cent Negro.

After a week or two an appeal was made to the school committee to pick up the cost of the buses.

"We just aren't going to do it," she said. And the majority of the school committee backed her up.

With the defeat of Gardland, who had spoken up on behalf of Negro groups, a continued majority backing Mrs. Hicks' views seems assured.

Diem May Be Evaluated By Outcome of Viet War

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — The second anniversary of Ngo Dinh Diem's overthrow will raise again a question for which there can be no answer: What would Viet Nam be like today if Diem and his brother-in-law had survived?

With the death of Diem and Nhu, Nov. 2, 1963, Viet Nam tried a series of military governments; and then, since last June, another military regime.

The present government is headed by a young air force officer, Gen. Nguyen Cao Ky. In a report to the nation this month he had this to say about the revolution of two years ago:

"The collapse of the Ngo Dinh Diem regime was the inevitable consequence of the long treason of a regime deeply engaged in the path of dictatorship, corruption and instability. The whole people rose up to start the revolution in order to oust a reactionary regime, in the hope of building a new regime capable of preserving and developing the 'humane' rights of human beings — the rights to live to be free and to enjoy happiness."

Ky has been accused by some of his critics of making fine speeches but taking little action. There are those who recall that Ngo Dinh Diem also talked about the rights and the happiness of the people, and they say they have heard all the words before.

There is grumbling against the government over the impact of soaring prices, inflation and shortages.

How history will judge the downfall of Diem may be overshadowed and perhaps confused by the military and international political developments of the past few months.

In the final months of Diem's rule the number of American military personnel in South Viet Nam numbered in the hundreds. Today there are almost 150,000 American military men in the country, and the buildup continues.

"It wouldn't have happened under Diem," says an American business man who has lived here for years. "First, he probably wouldn't have permitted it anyway. He wanted American help to a point, but he had his ideas about where that point was."

Some others disagree. They assert Diem would have taken any steps to keep the Communists from taking over.

Opponents of this argument cite brother Nhu, his influence with Diem, his lack of love for Americans and the security rumors that even months before his death he had put out feelers into North Viet Nam.

In the period of political turmoil that followed the events in November 1963, it was widely believed that the fall of Diem would long exert an influence over developments in a chaotic Viet Nam. It was felt the arguments would go over whether his downfall was good or bad.

Then came the military

Eye Bypass Holds Hope For Blind

MEXICO CITY (AP) — A Mexican team has invented an electronic device that bypasses the eye and sends light signals directly to the brain. The team hopes it may eventually be developed to help the hopelessly blind.

Dr. Armando del Campo, a professor at the National University, says the device now is in the experimental stage and is too large and bulky.

In time, he says, it may be possible to refine the machine down to a portable size to be used much as the deaf use hearing aids.

He and four aides developed the device recently after years of work.

The machine is called an "amatorosa," meaning blindness, and "okopeo" — to see. Del Campo says the system is basically a series of photo-receiving elements that catch light and send it directly to the brain through five intermediate circuits without passing through the eyes. Wires are attached to the skull of the patient.

Dr. Enrique Wudka, an eye specialist, says the impulses sent through the wires enable a blind person to distinguish between light and shadow. In experiments, blind persons have had a sense of seeing flashes of light going on and off.

Del Campo says the experiments lead him to hope that hopelessly blind can count on some help in the future. But he agrees with Wudka that much remains to be done.

The studies and experiments with blind people were carried out at the Faculty of Sciences of National University and in the laboratories of Mexico's largest television system, Televisi6n Mexicana, S.A. A government grant for further experiments is expected.

Collaborating with Del Campo are Jorge Arias Pundal and Juan Guerrero y Collier, students at the university; Alejandro Guerrero y Collier of the Institute of Monks; and Abelardo Medina y Diaz Intante of the National Polytechnic Institute.

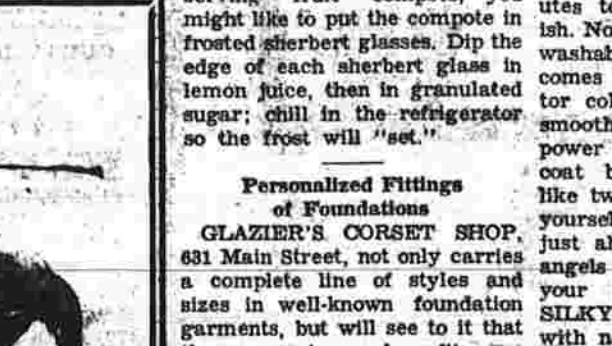

Runs Hard and Fast, Catches or Throws Passes

Sayers Makes the Bears 'Go'

CHICAGO (NEA) — Their offense was as exciting as an organ recital. The quarterback could throw long but not necessarily as far as some of the halfbacks could run hard but not far. Their line maddled a defense drawn in tight to stop the inside plays and the short "stop" passes. Gradually, the vaunted Chicago Bear signal pattern devolved to a single call—"ouch!"

Owner — coach George Halas got the hint: Bear football games were exciting to watch as two wet teardrops beaded it out in a tepid teardrop. He tried to open up the Bear offense by sending the line Willie Grier on sweeps, by trying to convert him into a pass receiver, Willie had great speed and beautiful deepness. He also had hands like bricks. He couldn't hold onto the ball when it was handed to him. So he became a line-smashing halfback.

Then Halas turned to Ronnie Bull, who came out of the state of Texas regarded as the greatest thing since the depression allowed. Bull, he thought, was in the tradition of Frank Gifford and Paul Hornung; he could fake a run and draw a halfback pass on an option play. Unfortunately, Bull's passes went up like the White Cliffs of Dover and over-end-over. So Ron became a line-smashing halfback.

Lacking any kind of a wide-open offense, Halas had one alternative: To build a great defense. It was the defense that helped the Bears take the National Football League title in 1963. The Bears didn't exactly win the title. They survived it — like Grant in the White House.

This year it's all different. The offense is the most diversified that the Bears have had in 10 years. The Bears have even found a way with some triple-wing formations. The Bears are a little bit more sophisticated. They're a little bit more sophisticated. They're a little bit more sophisticated.

Opened Up Offense — Sayers' running has opened up the Bear offense. He can no longer count on the opposition double-team Ditka or — when he's in the game — triple team flanker Jimmy Morris. No longer can they stack the defense on the inside and all but ignore the Bear offensive line.

Dartmouth Still New England's Best

Yale Rated Eighth Spot In AP Poll

BOSTON (AP) — Although it nearly stumbled at Yale, Dartmouth lost precious little ground today in the voting for New England's No. 1 football team in the weekly Associated Press regional poll.

Dartmouth, which came from behind in the closing minutes for a 20-17 victory over Yale, garnered 14 of the 15 first place votes cast by a six-state panel and amassed 116 points in the voting on a 10 points for first, nine for second, etc. basis.

The Indians, still undefeated as they head for their Ivy League showdown with Princeton, had reached a high of 15 first-place votes and 177 points a week ago.

Yankee Conference champion Maine, undefeated after seven games, continued in second place with 159 points, eight more than the No. 2 team, Boston College.
