# LBJ Reveals Farm Study

**JOHNSON CITY, Tex. (AP)—**President Johnson announced plans today for "the most thorough study ever conducted" of federal farm programs after signing into law a four-year omnibus agriculture bill affecting most major commodities.

Johnson just got under the heavy study over the effects of the effects of agricultural policies on the performance of our economy and on our foreign relations.

The President's action was announced Wednesday night by Dean Sherwood Berg of the Texas White House shortly after 11 p.m. He had waited until after midnight, the legislature would have died by then.

The study will be headed by the United States Department of Agriculture, with the University of Minnesota, which will report to the President within 18 months.

However, Congress defeated an administration proposal to create a new agency to handle the study. The House passed the bill, making payment come from the federal Treasury. Opponents of the administration plan had dubbed it a "tax on the farm."

Wheat producers are guaranteed at least \$1.85 a bushel. Wheat going into domestic bread will be supported at \$2.25 a bushel. It is expected support plus a 75-cent payment (See Page Nine)

"I just kept my big mouth shut," he told friends gathered at his gas station election day.

"If they don't want Bossy Gillis after six terms, then he'll be with them," he added.

He voted it would be his last campaign and that he was through with politics.

"You have to keep reminding people what you've done for them. Even if I've done nothing right."

Gillis was his first term as mayor in 1927 and ended up running for a 30th.

# Threats of Bomb, Poison Delay Princess Margaret

**LONDON (AP)—**Princess Margaret left today for her first visit to the United States after two days.

The British jetliner taking Queen Elizabeth's 35-year-old daughter to America was delayed by a matching high-crowned hat. Her husband had on a dark suit and a gray overcoat. The entire first-class section of the plane was reserved for the princess and her party. Some of the seats were taken out to make room for a dining table, and the menu for lunch included French onion soup, smoked salmon from Scotland, Irish lobster, turtle soup, grilled beef and roast potatoes.

Among those who saw the royal couple off at London airport were the Earl of Westmorland, the Queen's lord-in-waiting, who said farewell on behalf of the monarch; and U.S. Ambassador David Bruce and his wife.

The princess, 35, was scheduled to land for 30 minutes at a hotel in New York City.

Princess Margaret's three-week tour will include visits to San Francisco, Los Angeles, the Arizona ranch of former Ambassador Lewis W. Douglas, Washington and New York.

An informant said the full-length princess and her husband will try to break away from the usual formalities of royal tours during the trip.

# U.S. Ambushes Viet Cong Patrol

**NO SPACE WALK**

**MANNED SPACE CENTER, Houston, Tex. (AP)—**The scheduled double double space flight proposed for December will not include a space walk, the Manned Spacecraft Center said today.
