



Above Morality

Former Secretary of State Dean Acheson, who now conceivably has more actual influence on our foreign policy than he had when he was nominally charge of it himself, has just produced nother of those statements well calculated to endear him to humanity. It was just about a year ago, in a selebrated, if that should be the word, dress up at Amherst, Mr. Acheson advanced the theory that nations could not afford the effort and luxury of trying to be moral in their international onduct. Whether so intended or not, that speech took its place in history as the oratorical prelude to actual policy decisions by the Johnson administration in which Acheson's personal disciples hold posts of high importance. These policy decisions were toward the frank and open use of force in Vietnam and in Dominica, And, although there comes from the Johnson administration frequent reassurance to the fact that it has the best suid noblest of intentions and seeks only peace, the guess would be that its force-using muscles still remain hard, and that, in any next crisis, it would once again move first and then try to construct its legal and moral

justifications after. If the direction pointed by Mr. Acheson's speech of a year ago is the way the world is to be run, it need only be said that it is the way of the jungle, and that, with nuclear weapons at their disposal, the denizers of that jungle won't prolong themselves mutually very

The other day this same Mr. Acheson delivered himself of another gem of the kind which leads humanity forward. According to the Christian Science Monitor account, he startled a television interview show by remarking that perhaps the United Nations should have ermitted India and Pakistan to go head and fight out their war rather than intervene and "rescue people from ash confrontations."

The Monitor quotes one Western Euroean diplomat as observing that "none of the thousands, perhaps tens of thouands, of people who would have been killed could be expected to thank Mr. Acheson for his solution.

"Nor," he continued, "would his answer be likely to prove correct. Wars fought out usually leave just as many unsolved and agonizing problems as war halted short of solution. Hasn't Mr. Acheson heard of World War I and World War II?"

One wonders if perhaps Mr. Acheson, having had such apparently measurable effect with his oratorical warning of a year ago that it might be immoral for a big nation to try to be moral in its foreign policy, is not attempting to see whether there is still, in humanity anywhere, any small residue of shockability. One would judge that he is still on the way to winning his crusade against morality. He dares speak openly. The "Western European diplomat" the Monitor United Nations correspondent quoted was careful to remain anonymous. It gets less and less fashionable to try to e moral, and it seems more and more as if the future belongs to the Acheson aper men who do not flinch at a ttle blood now and then.

"Motorists are expecting more services from state police," Mr. Morris says, "We're not out there just to arrest them, but to assist them." Among the services: State police patroling the Illinois Tollway are equipped to pump gas from their tanks into those of stranded motorists. The gasoline is free, but officers hand drivers an envelope in which they can mail a dollar to state police headquarters. About 50 per cent do.


Iowa plans to add 100 additional officers within the next two years; 50 of them will be assigned to patrol interstate highways. Mr. Sueppel hopes this will mean an Iowa patrol car will pass any given interstate-highway point every 30 to 40 minutes.

Currently, the Automobile Manufacturers Association is pushing HELP, the Highway Emergency Location Plan. The idea is that drivers equip their cars with Citizens Band (CB) radios so they can call for help when they need it. Supposedly, police stations, garages, and other CB-equipped cars would be listenng. The plan is in operation on a limited scale. But an official of the International Association of Chiefs of Police who stopped to aid 59 stranded motorists during a trip from Chicago to Washington, D.C., reports he could obtain nelp only 12 times by using his CB ra-

Still, association officials think the plan eventually will become quite popular. There are now about 2,500,000 CB units in operation, about 1,500,000 o them in autos. Last month, the Federal Communications Commission Issued nearly 13,000 new CB station licenses, which are easily obtained since no technical knowledge is required. A car CB unit can be bought for around \$200. Also under consideration by the nation's telephone companies is a plan to

But there is a danger, 'If you're a stopped vehicle you're always in danger." Mr. Sueppel says. Yet, he adds that knows of no cases in Iowa where a talled motorist has been robbed, though a trucker who stopped when he spotted a car with a distress signal was attacked.
