





Welcome To Mr. Weiss

om all the people and taxpayers of fanchester, for Robert B. Weiss, the centleman who, as of the first of the rear, will assume the position of Genral Manager of the Manchester town

From what is known of the way in which the Board of Directors conducted ts search for a new General Manager, earnestly sought the best man it ould hire for the job. Perhaps, during some portions of its search, it came to more realistic appreciation of the tind of talent and service Manchester losing with the retirement of the present General Manager. But there s to be a new order, and the new chief recutive and administrative officer for he town government has been selected by bi-partisan agreement of the members of the Board of Directors. This is the proper setting for the beginning of ais responsibilities here, and should provide the atmosphere in which he is allowed to pursue his task.

For some time in the past, the conduct of the office of General Manager has been strictly non-political, a cirsumstance which has, from time to time, annoyed one political party or the other. We urge the political party lominant at the moment, and any political party which may be dominant in the future, to accord the new General s complete and unquestioned political independence. There is no other course which can be good for

As for Mr. Weiss himself, he will discover that Manchester has its problems, and that among the most urgent of these is that of holding the tax rate in check. The town is not quite as wealthy, in the taxpayer sense, as might be indicated by the size of the salary the Board of Directors has agreed to give Mr. Welss in order to entice him to come here. But if he can halt the continual escalation of our Manchester tax rate and our Manchester tax bills, he will get credit for earning that \$19,500 starting salary, and be a hero to us all.

### Other Results

In two states last Tuesday, New York and Texas, the voters rejected the idea of electing public officials for longer terms. In New York, the voters rejected the idea of giving state legislators four ear terms. In Texas, they voted to keep the present two year terms for governor, state officers, and legislators. In both instances the voters, instead f yielding to the theory that longer erms in office would give their officials better chance to mature and be of public service, seemed to form the more cynical judgment, which was that they still thought it a good thing to bring their servants back to face their electorates quite frequently,

Perhaps, with these two votes, we have come to the end of easy, routine acceptance of the idea that a four year term makes a better governor or a better legislator than a two year term. It would be our theory that if they are good in the first place, a four year term oes no harm, but that if they don't measure up, four years is too long a time to have them entrenched beyond the reach of the electorate.

The voters were deciding for themselves, in their own sweet way, in some other special directions last Tuesday. Up in Boston, Mrs. Louise Day Hicks, who specializes in fighting artificial procedures to bring about racial integration of public schools, once more led all other candidates as she was reelected to the Boston School Committee.

But while, in Boston, the opponents of at least one kind of progress in the direction of civil rights were proving their strength, some of the recent recipients of such civil rights, the Negroes, were proving, in one city after another, their ability to use their voting privilege in an independent manner. They refused to stay in their supposed grooves, and take the orders of their supposed bosses, in elections like those in New York and Philadelphia. To the contrary, they declared their independence, and thus put all political parties on notice that, in the future, nobody is carrying them around in a vest pocket.

Perhaps the strangest election of all— one that should confound all experts and theorists—took place down in the state Virginia, in a strange bedfellowship aspired by the presence of a third party.

The historically conservative Byrd machine, fearing, quite correctly, that the Conservative Party might take away some of its traditional votes, found that would rather associate even with the Johnson administration, the champion of civil rights, than loss an election. And the Negroes of Virginia, forced to choose the least of three evils, wound up deciding that they'd rather take the one they knew most about, having had to live with it all their lives, than experiment with the Republican or the Conservative ticket.

It seems, all in all, to have been a rather healthy American election day, full of independences and shifting pattems or private lineral const

Policy So Dear, Life So Cheap?

When Buddhist priests in far-off Vietnam began immolating themselves in protest against the policies of their government, we in this country reacted in two ways. First, we were surprised that people could care that much about naional affairs. Second, we satisfied ourselves that

there must be something peculiarly oriental, some barbaric cultural tradition in which life itself was held cheap, which made such events possible. Or, to summarize, we were surprised

the monks cared so much about national policy and cared so little about their And, of course, we finally had to admit that the strategy had been effective. It played its part in bringing about

the downfall of the Diem government of

Americans doing the same thing-of caring more about their nation's policies than they do about their own lives? Do we rationalize it in the same way we tried to rationalize it when we thought we could safely label it orien-

We may try, but it doesn't quite work, We find it difficult to believe that even the gentlest and most pacifistic American has somehow come to hold life cheap. To the contrary, it is supposedly a respect for life, a desire to protect the good of what life can be, that dominates the logic and the emotions of those who dedicate themselves to fighting the institution and the custom of war.

We have to come to the feeling that life was dear enough, all right, to the young American who set himself on fire in front of the Pentagon, and that he enjoyed no particular oriental ease in bidding his own flesh and blood exisince goodbye, but that his convictions about some question of right and wrong seemed to him more important than everything else in the world.

And those of us who may not feel so deeply about the issues of our time have small right to smear what may have been the sincerity of his sacrifice by questioning his motives, or his sanity, or his loyalty. We might better acknowledge the possibility that somebody does care that much, and does sacrifice that much, and is perhaps nearer to the realities of our terrible time than we are, and then, after we have let it have its imprint on our own thought, and feeling, hope it does not happen any

Instead, his act inspires revulsion and pitypity for a mind so disturbed that, in anguish over innocent victims of the Vietnamese war, it would endanger the life of his innocent one-year-old child together with his own; so confused as to believe that public suicide, as an instrument of protest, could be transferred from an Oriental to an Occidental civili-

year bond issue. Tolland would borrow a maximum of \$400,000 if the plan was put into effect within the next year, based on a "short budget" drawn to operate the town from Sept. 15 to June 30. This would result in an initial
