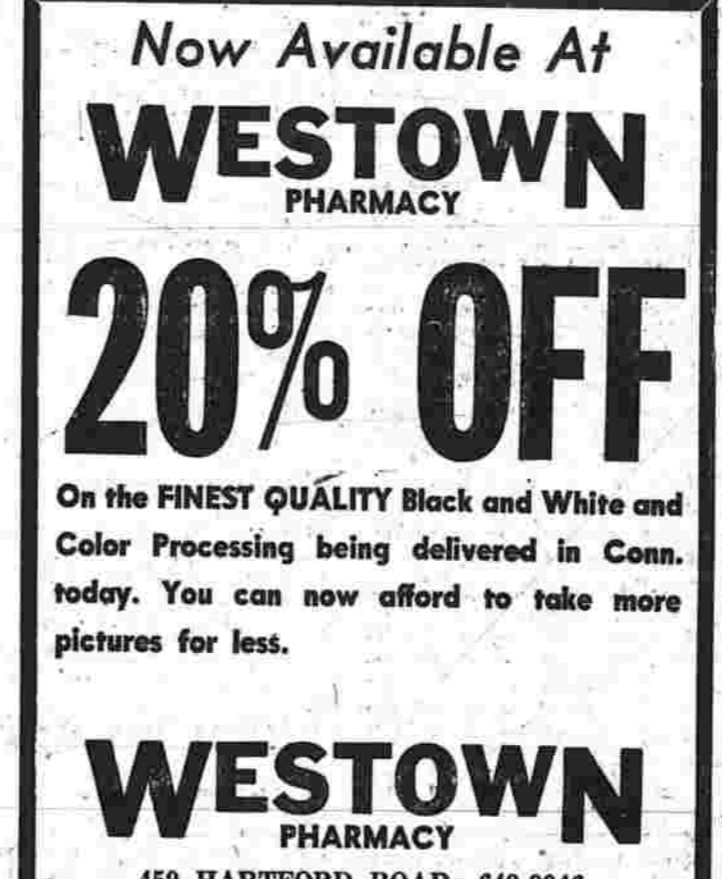

Perhaps the strangest election at all—one that should confound all experts and theorists—took place down in the state of Virginia, in a strange bedfellowship inspired by the presence of a third party, Conservative Party candidate.

The historically conservative Byrd machine, fearing, quite correctly, that the Conservative Party might take away some of its traditional votes, found that it would rather associate even with the Johnson administration, the champion of civil rights, than lose an election.

It seems, all in all, to have been a rather healthy American election day, full of independence and shifting patterns.

Policy So Dear, Life So Cheap?

When Buddhist priests in far-off Vietnam began immolating themselves in protest against the policies of their government, we in this country reacted in two ways. First, we were surprised that people could care that much about national affairs.

Second, we satified ourselves that there must be something peculiarly oriental, some barbaric cultural tradition in which life itself was held cheap, which made such events possible.

Or, to summarize, we were surprised the monks cared so much about national policy and cared so little about their own lives.

How do we react, now, to the idea of Americans doing the same thing—carrying more about their nation's policies than they do about their own lives?

Do we rationalize, as in the same way we tried to rationalize it when we thought we could safely label it orientalist?

We may try, but it doesn't quite work. We find it difficult to believe that even the gentlest and most pacifistic American has somehow come to hold life cheap.

And those of us who may not feel so deeply about the issues of our time have much to learn from the sacrifice of those who do.

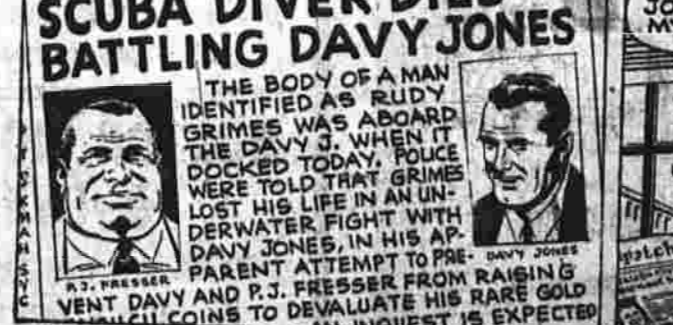
