The tiny overlapping scales on the cup are arranged in neat rows with all the precision of a fish's scales, or the minute scales on the wing of a butterfly. We had thought that empty acorn

cups had no use whatsoever, until we watched two schoolboys extract piercing whistles from them. The secret, they were pleased to impart, lies in holding the concave side of the cup partly covered by the thumbs, and blowing into the aperture. A half century ago in the rear of the

old West Main Street School stood a large red oak which dropped its fruit profligately into the playground, to the delight of the pupils. Stone throwing, of course, was forbidden on the playground, but no mention was made of acorn throwing, so acorns were hurled with abandon. Although many of them found their mark, no one was seriously hurt, and no tale was carried to a teach-
