Boston Strangler May Never Face Trial for Murder BROOKLINE (AP) — The Boston strangler may never come to trial.

And most police officials now agree there may never be a guilty verdict or explanation of 11 stranglings of women in the Greater Boston area.

Atty. Gen. Edward W. Brooke's office says a prime suspect has been placed in an institution, that he is believed mentally incompetent to stand trial and that there is no indication now that he can ever be indicted.

The string of macabre slayings began June 14, 1962, with the death of Anna E. Blensers, 55, a seamstress strangled with a cord of her housecoat in her Boston apartment.

Most of the deaths that followed were of women in their late 20s, 30s, and 40s. And a cord, bra, nylon stocking or pillow slip was wrapped tightly around their necks.

Most of the victims lived alone in apartments. The strangler was thought to have gained entrance on some such pretext as being a delivery or repairman.

It is now ten months since Asst. Atty. Gen. John E. Bottemy, in charge of the case, announced that his prime suspect was "vastly institutionalized," and since then there have been no more stranglings related to the other pretext as being a delivery or repairman.

The most recent in the series was the strangling of Miss Mary Ellen Sullivan on Jan. 4, 1964 in her Boston apartment.

At UConn, she appeared in "The Male Animal," "The Boy Friend," and "A View of the Bridge," while with the Windsor group she was seen in "New Girl in Town."

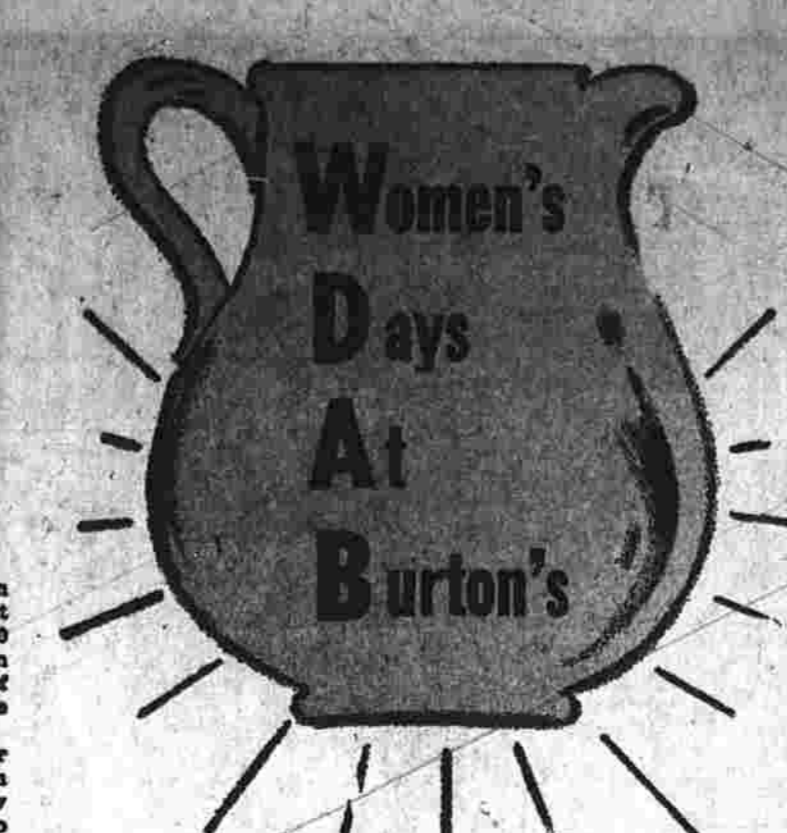

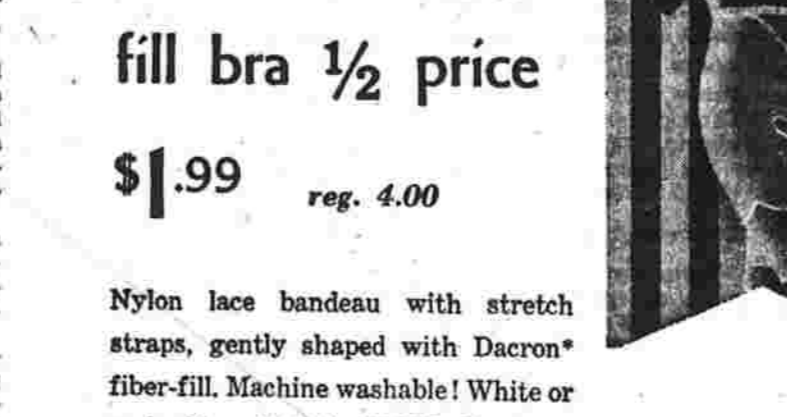

Vernon Police Salary Schedule Average for Town's Size

Vernon's salary scale for its police department is average for towns of the same population category, according to a report issued this week by the Connecticut Public Expenditures Council.

The report also shows that Vernon provides for a slightly more than average fringe benefits. The local salary range for patrolmen, in three steps, is shown as being from \$4,900 to \$5,400.

In 1960, more than 60 per cent of the police departments worked a 48-hour week, and in 1965, more than 77 per cent of the departments worked a 40-hour week. The Rockville department had gone onto the 40-hour week prior to the completion of the governments, and the whole department is now on this schedule.

The town of Vernon is classed with the towns of 10,000 to 25,000 population. In its population group, Vernon is about average in salary range for patrolmen. It is also about average in population, being about 20,000.

Obituary James Schaub Dies, Retired Fire Chief

James H. Schaub, 74, of 105 Highland St., retired South Manchester fire chief, died early this morning at Rocky Hill Veterans Home and Hospital after a short illness.

Born in Kittanning, Pa., on Sept. 7, 1891, he has been a resident of Manchester since he was five years old, living most of his life in the Highland Park section. Upon graduating from local schools, Mr. Schaub went to work in the restaurant business, working for P. J. O'Leary in the wholesale, retail and delicatessen divisions. He then became a partner with William Garvin and opened a restaurant in the old Walden Block. He later was in business with James Johnson and Raymond Robinson.

In 1918, he closed the restaurant to enter the U.S. Army, serving in the Machine Gun Co. of the 73rd Regiment, 12th Division. Mr. Schaub returned to Manchester and re-entered the fire department. He became a member of the SMFD Hose Co. #1 in 1919 and became the company driver for the following year. He was the first appointed regular in the fire department, having been appointed in 1921. The former fire chief attained considerable recognition while a member of the fire department. He attended most of the fire schools until his retirement as well as training most of the men under him.
