Early Cold Grips Much Of Europe

LONDON (AP)-Winter spread its icy white fingers across Europe today, blocking roads and snarling traffic from the Atlantic to Siberia and from the North Cape to the Riviera. In many places snow, ice and freezing temperatures came earlier in the year than ever before.

Britain's official thermometer on the roof of the Air Ministry in London at 1 a.m. marked the lowest temperature for Nov. 15 -29 degrees Fahrenheit-since recording began in 1940.

Moscow reported the coldest Nov. 15 in 80 years with a reading of 4 below zero.

Italy reported freezing temperatures, with snow on the Italian Riviera, Even Madrid was cloudy and cold. Further north it was raining. The Pyrenees already were blanketed with snow. The thermometer was just above freezing.

Snow, ice or freezing fog covered most of Britain, Snowplows were out in Devon, southwestern England, clearing a six-inch weekend snowfall on Dartmoor.

The unusual cold, with resulting heavy use of electric heaters, forced voltage cuts in power in the London area. The Cen-Electricity Generating board said the cut was "a very mild one" from 7:55 to 10 a.m. warned British motorists to "drive with the utmost care."

High Court Sets Aside 1950 Law

WASHINGTON (AP)-The Supreme Court today declared unconstitutional a requirement that members of the Communist party must register with the government.

The requirement is contained in a section of the 1950 Subversive Activities Control Act. Justice William J. Brennar

delivered the 8-0 decision. The decision held that the act's requirement conflicts with a constitutional provision that nobody can be compelled to give evidence against himself in any criminal case.

The Communist party itself now is on trial in Federal District Court here on charges of failure to register as a representative of the Soviet Union.

There was no immediate indication just how today's Supreme Court decision—based upon registration of individuals-may eventually apply to the case against the party.

However, Justice Department officials said this trial will continue while government lawyers study the high tribunal's opin-

Specifically involved in today's decision were William Albertson of Brooklyn, N.Y., and Roscoe Quincy Proctor of Oakland, Calif. The Subversive Activities Control Board in 1962 ordered Albertson to register. A similar order to Proctor was issued in 1963.

The Justice Department said Proctor was a member of the party of Nev York expelled Albertson on July 7, 1964, calling him a "police

Sam Sheppard Gets Hearing in Supreme Court

WASHINGTON (AP) - Dr. Samuel H. Sheppard, former Cleveland, Ohio, osteopath, was granted today a hearing on a new appeal to the Supreme Court from his conviction and life sentence for the slaying of his first wife.

Sheppard pressed in the new appeal a contention that publicity about his case made it impossible to impanel a fair and inipartial jury.

The high tribunal in 1956 refused to review Sheppard's trial and his unsuccessful appeals to beas corpus proceedings in lower federal courts. Losing in this to the Supreme Court.





The Disasters We Repeat Some disasters come upon us because e deal with powers and risks beyond

complete knowledge and beyond r complete control. They come, disasters in this class, as mething of a surprise, and we immeliately begin an unlimited search for e explanation and for the cure and normally spare no expense in findng that explanation and in providing e cure if it can be provided by any cill or resource at the command of our

This was the way it was with the at Northeast blackout the other day. were operating on a big new sysm which had been pushed somewhat eyond our fully expert knowledge and full control. It broke away from behavior. Some people will argue at we should never have pushed the w system so far until we had made uch more exhaustive studies of the eaknesses or whims to which it might subject. But the main point concedsd will be that we were indeed, this time, operating in unknown territory, under pioneer conditions, and that, although the disaster was regrettable, the important thing is to try to learn from it how to prevent its repetition and then not hesitate to do what that

prevention takes. We are much farther along in aviaion than we are in the country-wide power grids, but here also we are still pioneering, still encountering the new, still trying to make sure what the components of safety may be from one type of operation to another. We have great staffs of experts working 365 days every year at the business of trying to find out what is safe, what is danger. And once we have spotted a potential danger, or designed a greater assurance of safety, there is no hanging back, there is no delay, there is no reluctance in the way we put our knowledge into practice.

We continue to have accidents, terrible, costly accidents in aviation. But our conscience is always clear in this respect: that we have never failed to keep our awareness of danger high, or to have our safety codes and equipment under constant revision and improvement. No one is ever content, no one is ever complacent, in the aviation field. When accidents do happen, it is usually against and in spite of the best effort the human establishment can

Then we have a second class of acci-These come upon us when we deal with dangers of which we have knowledge and with which we are familiar,

but when we do not deal with these dangers in the way our own experience and knowledge and study might They come, disasters in this class, not as any real surprise, but almost as if they were part of a grisly routine.

They are, indeed, predictable. When they happen, there is no need for any urgent search to try to identify some new kind of peril. The investigation merely has to de-

termine precisely just how much failure there has been to honor the standards previously recommended as necessary in order to guard against known, familiar dangers. The Yarmouth Castle has had grace

enough to sink, so perhaps the investigation will be relatively short. It was a loose old excursion tub; its weekend galety was tinsel over lifebelts that couldn't be found, lifeboats that couldn't be lowered, fire alarms that couldn't be sounded, and over an atmosphere which trained neither passengers nor crew for roles in a disaster at sea. Another Hymn To Lyndon When White House Assistant Jack Valenti went up to Boston last spring and delivered his famous speech o praise of the great man in the White House, it was a common assumption that Mr. Valenti was that particular kind of naive, unsophisticated individual who didn't know any better than to make in public an extravagant burleaque of the kind of praise his superior in the White

But Bill Moyers, the current White House press secretary, is a more sophisticated individual, respected for poise, and for intelligence. And now he has delivered himself of

his particular hymn of praise. "The President," said his press secretary on a television interview the other day, "was born with a feeling for people and that's not a gift or an inheritance quickly lost. He has a way of divining the pulse of the American people that few men in public life whom I know

"I think he has antennae that, give or take one or two degrees, keep him pretty closely attuned to the problems, moods and attitudes of the people." According to other parts of the Movers appraisal of his boss, the President "has tremendous energy" and has "the face of a very compassionate and concerned man."

"It's not the job of the press secretary to build the President's image," Then, for good measure, he said, of

the President: "My affection for him, as well as my appreciation for the inner or private man, continues to grow. . . . I find the President so towering and exciting a figure, that to work for him anywhere . would be exciting and very reward-

Moyers, an intelligent, poised individual, said all this remembering well the somewhat skeptical reception the Valenti adulation received when it was delivered a few months ago. We frigidminded, emotion-stalled New Englanders had better reexamine our own chromosomes and ask ourselves whether there may not indeed be a greatness abroad in our land, nay, in our world, which we ourselves have been unpardonably slow to appreciate. There is, after all, such a thing as saying nice things about the living.

Day The Trucks Purred The other day, down on the New England Thruway in New Rochelle, New York State troopers set themselves up to try out the first enforcement of new law which came into effect in New York state on Oct. 1. It is a law prohibiting excessive mo-

tor noise on the state highways. The legal limit is set at 88 decibels, with 90 the point at which police enforcement goes beyond the warning stage. The troopers, the other day, had very poor luck catching trucks blasting out

the number of decibels they suspected the trucks might be capable of. The troopers had selected a key spot all right-one of those places in the road where the trucks would inevitably be trying to regain momentum. But the truck drivers, who have the sharpest eyes in the world, noticed the little decibel-catchers stationed along the road, and, accordingly, purred past with the sweetest and most decorous sounds imaginable, mufflers all tightened down, and nothing more than a little toe on the accelerator.

So not an arrest was made that day, Still, it must have been a pleasant kind of experience, and a pleasant kind of day, to find the great behemoths proceeding, for once, with such civilized silken whispers.

New York is recognized as the experimental leader in the field of putting some limit on the blast and blare of trucks, and it is acknowledged that other states are watching to see how the new law does work out. Such a first day experience-no arrests, and such beautifully modulated trucks—seems quite perfect, and should commend the law to every other state.

'Human Torch' Proves Nothing About a week ago a young father burned himself to death in Washington, revealing that this horrible act of self-destruction was his form of protest against the war in Viet Nam. His fellow citizens, recoiling from deeds of this sort, so foreign to our ways of life, and our ways of thinking, saw in it not an act of heroism, a protest in the grand and noble manner, but an exer-

cise in futility. Their sympathy, if any, was not for is cause, but for Ms folly, a sorrowful realization that this was, and only could be, an irrational act of one mentally unbalanced, definitely out of step with the many millions among whom he walked.

Now, in New York, another young, self-styled pacifist, has assayed the same stunt, subjected himself to a "human torch" role. Doubtless he did so with the belief that he was going to prove something. He has proved nothing save the folly of extremes of action, Sad experience tells us that these exaibitionist-type of deed seem to set up a chain reaction of repetition. As
