

Transistors, Moon, People?

A team of 100 sociologists financed by the University of Chicago is scurrying out to begin questioning 1.560 persons who were in the Nov. 9 blackout to get the precious data about human reaction down on paper before some of the precious details and some of the particular quirks of thought and feeling slip from fragile human memory. One particular question is going to concern these sociologists more than any other.

Why, in the blackout, was there so much social peace, so much public courtesy, so much instant and apparently instinctive cooperation among

The sociologists are, of course, pleased that people were so nice to one another in the big blackout cities. But they are also very much surprised. For the blackout could have been the first stage in a real disaster of some sort. and in a real disaster there is not sup posed to be any luxurious willingness to be one's brother's keeper, but rather an overpowering instinct to take care of

one's own survival first. We won't know what the sociologists discover, of course, until they complete their interviews, assemble their data, and have some computer interpret it

It might have been the relative shortness of the emergency, and the fact that the transistor radio was in existence, bringing to somebody in every neighborhood some quick word about what was happening. The important things about what was happening were. first, that it was widespread and therefore not too special or lonely, and, second, that there was immediate word of an area of normality outside the boun-

> daries of the emergency. The transistor was probably the most important single factor in preserving human poise inside the emergency area. The next most important non-human element on the scene was, we would say, the full moon in clear sky. This gave the whole blackout area an immediate auxiliary source of light, brighter than many millions of candles, and, beyond its mere brightness, a calm

reassurance of celestial normalcy. Beyond the transistor radio and the full moon, there is one more possibility for the sociologists to consider. People themselves may sometimes be just a little bit better than they are charted

The Wrong Method
