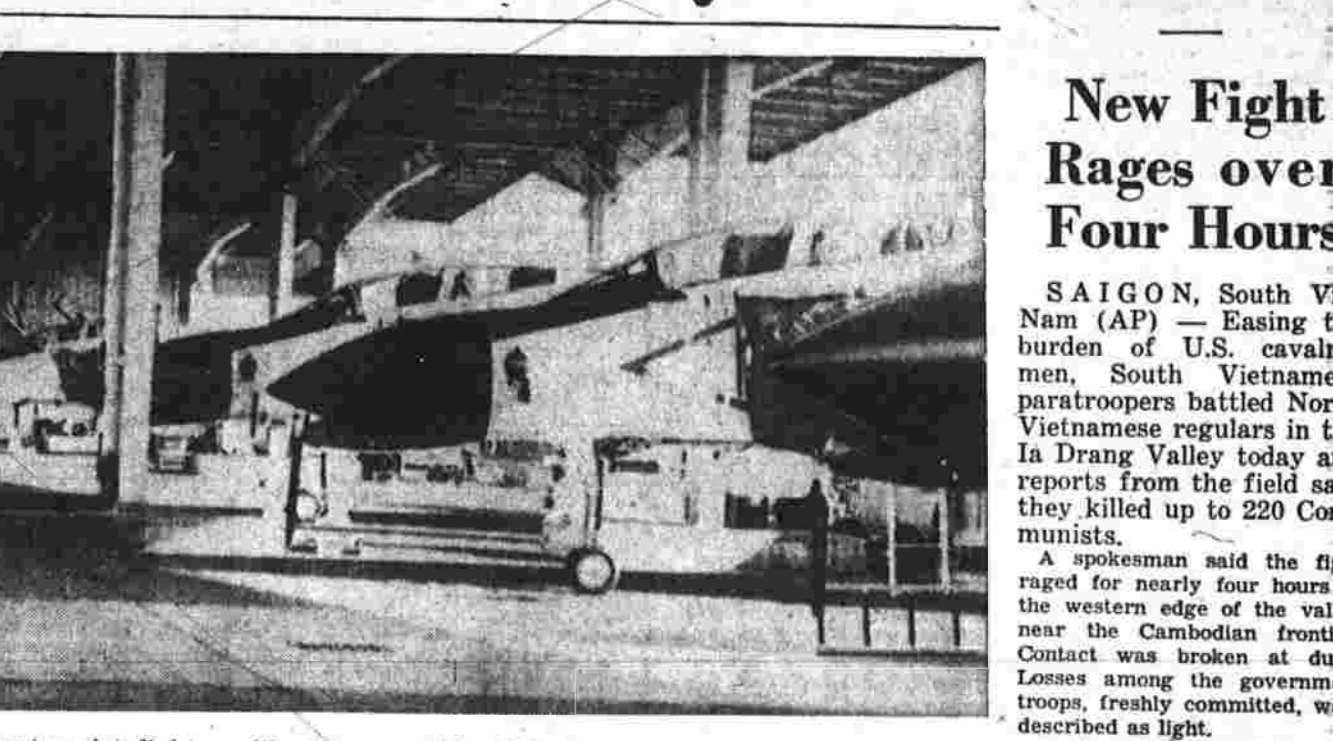

Stop Action Adds New Dimension

Instantaneous stop action of video tape, which permits the play in a game to be stopped at any point and as often as the situation warrants, has added a completely new dimension to the National Football League broadcasts on the CBS Television Network this season.

The new recording system gives viewers an opportunity to see exactly how a runner has broken a tackle, a receiver has outmaneuvered his defender, or how a linebacker has blitzed through the line to throw the quarterback.

Used in conjunction with the isolated camera which CBS Television sports also introduced, the stop action is giving fans another insight into the highly complex game of professional football. By reworking instantly a play, and stopping action at key points during it, the commentator can illustrate to viewers, as well as describe exactly what happened on a particular play.

The stop action can be applied to a rerun of the normal coverage of the game or it can be applied to the action captured by the isolated camera. The recorder was designed and built by the MVR Corp. of Palo Alto, Calif., in conjunction with CBS, which defined the intricate needs of television broadcasting.

It was first used to record and play back action highlights of the Baltimore Colts intrasquad game broadcast Aug. 14 and has been employed regularly during the week's NFL games.

The simple operation of the recorder and its light weight and portability make it particularly adaptable for broadcast use and for closed circuit recording of sports activity of all types where an immediate view of action is desired. The MVR disc recorder mechanism provides, at the touch of a button, complete 20-second segments which can be replayed in regular motion or stopped to provide "freeze action" shots.

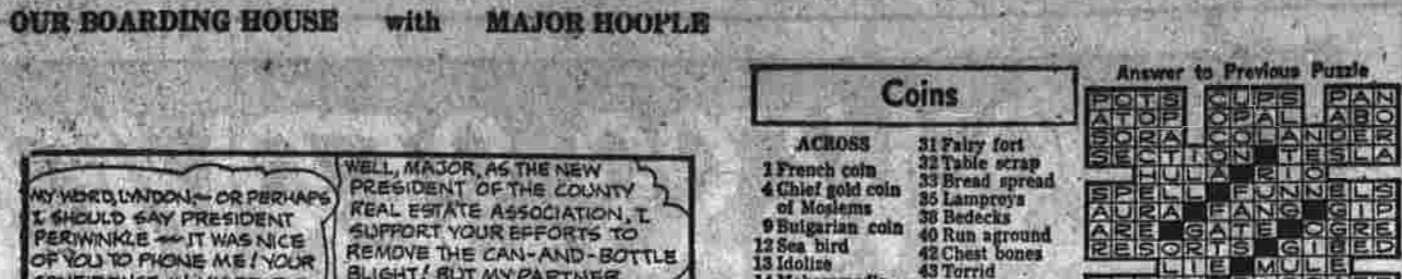

TV M.D.s Ailing

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—This hasn't been a good television season for doctors.

Not that they're fumbling their scalpels or misjudging diagnoses. The television medics are just as omniscient as ever. But their ratings have been ailing.

"Ben Casey," which Vincent Edwards intends to abandon after this season, has been trounced by "Run for Your Life." The latter portrays Ben Gazzara as a man whose doctors give him two years to live — Could Casey cure him?

"Dr. Kildare" entered the new season in a truncated version, half-hours appearing Monday and Tuesday night. The format obviously was patterned after last season's sensation, "Peyton Place," which has proved fallible in the ratings this fall.

The young doc himself, Richard Chamberlain, admits that the Kildare ratings have also been "not good." But he says it still is too early to predict whether the show will continue as a half-hour, return to the hour, or disappear.

"As for myself, I'm happier with the show this year," he remarked. "I think the scripts have been much stronger, and

the character of Kildare is much more to my liking.

"In previous years, Kildare was inclined to be too ingenuous, too easily impressed. Now he is more forceful, more decisive. I think he comes across a lot stronger."

Come what may, Chamberlain is content to abide by the pronouncements of NBC and MGM as to the future of "Dr. Kildare." Meanwhile he thinks about his own future.

No comedian in history left a greater legacy of inspiration to the performer who followed him than Stan Laurel, the wistful little man under the flat-brimmed derby, who, with his roly-poly partner, Oliver Hardy, created a comedy that has never been matched.

Hosting the show will be Dick Van Dyke, who makes no bones about patterning his style after Laurel's. Appearing with Van Dyke will be Lucille Ball, Richard Burton, Fred Gwynne, Danny Kaye, Buster Keaton, Leonid Kinskey, Tina Louise, Audrey Meadows, Bob Newhart, Louis Nye, Gregory Peck Cesar Romero and Phil Silvers.

"It was funny how the show evolved," Van Dyke said. "When Stan passed away, his family asked me to do the eulogy. Everyone was saying we should do something for his widow, and someone said, 'What if we got a lot of stars to do a show for nothing and turn over their salaries to the Motion Picture Home in Stan's name? The idea began to get steam very quickly.'"

Phil Silvers recalled, "Every time there was a new Stan Laurel picture in our little theater in Flatbush, all the kids would rush around trying to scrape together that 10 cent admission. It took almost a day and a half to snitch enough milk bottles — that was the Nielsen rating of the day. When Laurel and Hardy movies were showing, more milk bottles were swiped than during the run of any other picture."

In 1961, Danny Kaye accepted an Oscar from the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences in behalf of Laurel. He will recall that event and introduce some rare home movies

showing Laurel with his Oscar. Van Dyke will perform a stand-up routine about fall-down comedy, and show his own talent in the art of slapstick.

Who's Smart? Not Smart!

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — "My wife thinks I really am Maxwell Smart," laments comedian Don Adams, who plays the title role in the biggest hit of the new television season, "Get Smart."

In the series, which is the sole new show to make the hallowed top 10 in audience ratings, Adams plays an all-thumbs secret agent, the kind that could make James Bond cry U.N.C.L.E.

"My wife could be right," Adams sighed. "I'm the kind of a guy who is always knocking over water glasses and running out of gasoline. Whenever I do something like that, my wife says, 'You're Maxwell Smart, all right!'"

The external evidence seemed to bear him out. When he arrived for lunch at the Brown Derby, he was catching a cold. He ordered scrambled eggs and burned bacon. Burned bacon?

"That's right," he confided. "That's the only way you can really get it crisp. Only rarely does some smart-aleck chef really burn it."

The bacon arrived — burned. Despite occasional mishaps, Adams has had a good time of it in his chosen profession. Born Donald James Yarmy in New York City 38 years ago, he started writing comedy material while working as a commercial

artist. His stuff clicked with the better comics, and Don decided to deliver some of it himself. He started climbing after winning on Arthur Godfrey's Talent Scouts show.

"For seven or eight years, I appeared on more television variety shows than any other stand-up comic," he said.

Bouncing back and forth between both coasts and playing night clubs all over, Adams found himself a rich gypsy. He was about to abandon performing for a career in production when he was cast for "The Bill Dana Show." A spin-off series was planned for him as the bumbling house detective, but the show was canceled before that happened.

Then came "Get Smart." Adams is an easily overlooked man of conservative tailoring and eyes that disappear into slits when he is thinking hard. The best illustration of his similarity to Maxwell Smart concerns the garbage cans.

"I live up on this hill, see," he explained. "The garbage truck won't come up to the house to make the collection, so I have to take the cans down the hill to the street. One morning I loaded the two cans into the back of my car and went down the hill."

"I was on Sunset Boulevard half way to the studio when I noticed other motorists were staring at the back of my car. I turned around and there were the garbage cans. I had to turn around and take them back."

When we parted, he said, "It's been nice meeting you, Jack." "It's Bob," I said. "Oh, yes," he answered, shaking his head as he walked away.

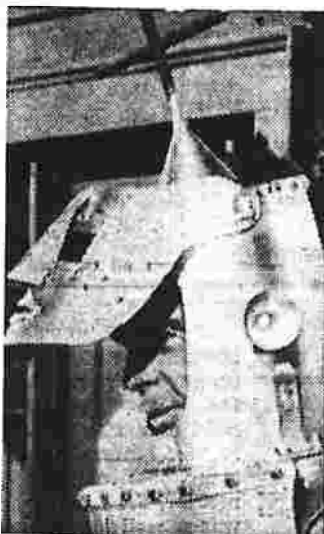
