Thinking it over, particularly after he result, we have decided we would much prefer not to have last night's heavyweight championship engagement egarded as any symbolic meeting between two ways of life, two rival religions, or two contradictory views of how the problem of racial relations should best be solved in this country. Let it stay classified as just one more

that series of grotesquely mismatchd encounters inevitable in any situation which finds an existing heavyweight champion good enough and skilled enough and strong enough to outclass by ridiculous margins any challenger in sight. As for those of us who believe in the

principles of one religion in preference o those of another, or who believe in one version of the American way of life as vastly sounder and preferable to another, let us acknowledge that, in truth, the proof of our relief lies with us, not some symbolic delegated champion using his fists for a certain number of ninutes inside a certain designated ring. It was a lousy fight in Las Vegas, and we are not all Muslims this morning because one fellow hit harder than the other.

And it could be that there is an equal ack of real ideological conclusiveness to some of the other tests of strength going on in our world today.

Our problem, in education, in morality, in everything, is simply that, so far, each generation has to learn each lesson over again for itself, a process which necessarily makes improvement and progress slow. But the old moralities keep poking along after us all, from generation to generation, and they never fail to catch up, old-fashioned meddlers that they are. It would be a trite and silly exhortation to make to those bright young students in the survey-if you don't cheat you will be a lot happier later on-but it would be

Liberals Are 'Peculiarly Intolerant'

A few months ago I ventured to suggest in these columns that the middle classes had been given a raw deal. The not very extreme view attracted a good deal of support. But what depressed, even alarmed, me was the reaction o those who disagreed. They were not content simply to disagree. They were outraged that anyone should write such

for convenience, we had better call rightwing ideas is, I have observed, characteristic. . . . Anyone who questions the basic as-

sumptions of the left-the absolute desirability of universal suffrage, for example, or of progressive taxation or of state-run welfare schemes or of the right to strike-will meet incredulity and indignation rather than argument. Left-wing radicalism is not expected to provoke any similar reaction from the right; nor, on the whole, does it. Leftists, in short, are peculiarly intolerant. Is this a coincidence, a historical or political accident? I don't think so. I think it is inherent in the philosophy of

It is an essential doctrine of the left that most human evils are the fruit of socioeconomic conditions and can be cured by political means. Right-wingers. therefore, are not merely opponents in a debatable field: they are blocking the road to paradise, reopening Pandora's

the left. . . .

Secondly, leftists - liberals in the American terminology - luxuriate in guilt. They feel responsible for all the world's injustices, inequalities, miseries. "We must do something," they say, even when they are not in any sense responsible and there is nothing useful they can do. They would, for example, still want to disburse foreign aid even if it was clearly bringing the recipients more harm than good. They are compulsive demonstrators. They hotly resent people, especially people of their own race and class, who refuse to share their guilt, who decline either to


do or to demonstrate. . . . Leftists, being egalitarians, assume that everyone wants and needs the same things: And, as rationalists, they believe that their policies, their solutions are the objectively correct way toward these universal goals. No one can intelligently and honestly disagree except over details. It follows that anyone who professes to disagree must be either unintelligent or dishonest. . . .

More than most of us, leftists find that useful discussions are possible only with people who accept their own basic premises; other views are simply not relevant and therefore not worth serious consideration. Useful discussions produce a positive response: A negative response implies ignorance or obduracy. Clashes between men of good will must be the result of misunderstandings; rational round-table discussions can blow any problem away.

These beliefs help to explain the paradoxes and apparent double standards of the left. Liberals are enthusiastic advocates of trade and cultural exchanges between Communist countries and the West: But in the next breath they advocate boycotts and the refusal of performing rights as weapons against such "Fascist" countries as South Africa and Spain. Why? Because the disagreement with communism is the result of misunderstandings, which can be cleared up, but the disagreement with fascism is a fight against malice. Similarly, liberals are conspicuously tolerant of juvenile delinquency, thugs, cannibals, savages, and bloodthirsty rebels, but singularly intolerant of civilized opponents, of aristocrats, financiers, and intellectual rightwingers. Why? Because the criminals and savages are ignorant, victims of capitalism and imperialism, a cause of guilt-feelings rather than of anger in iberal breasts, whereas the aristocrats. financiers and right-wing intellectuals are more or less deliberate villains and

Modern liberals are not really very liberal; even their commitment to free speech tends to be qualified. They champion the rights of Communists in what they regard as Fascist countries, but they never demand free speech for Fascists in Communist countries. What interests them, both at home and abroad is that left-wing views should be heard; they are quite content, in practice if not in theory, for reactionary views to be . . . The guess is that the opposition will need more than 70,000 votes to be able to kill the nev Constitution, but that it may have very good chances of get ting more than 70,000 votesmany more. We think ther could be as many as 150,000 votes within reach of the opposition's appeal.

The second part of the threa to the state's sanity on Dec. 14 lies in the nature of the opposition Given such a possibility of controlling a state decision by a minority, and given a field of 150,000 potential votes which to pursue its own har vest procedures, then the na ture of the opposition is such as to promise that something close to the maximum poten tial of this minority will be brought to the voting booths on

The leadership of this opposition, as symbolized in the person of John Mather Lupton, is by this time very experience and calm in the technique of leading fringe causes with a persuasive, business-like air. 1 s a leadership which has a truly sophisticated talent fo voicing its extremism in the simplest language of common sense. It has the fire and zeal and unremitting energy of fanaticism, but it works as if i were setting out the apple pie at a neighborhood social.

All its leadership, of course, is not of the suave and subtle Lupton excellence. Some of it cares more passionately and deeply than he does, and therefore controls itself less artistically. If Vivien Kellems, for instance, should get really loose down the campaign trail with her unquenchable talent for dramatizing Kellems, she might undo much of the effect of Lupton's careful and con trolled modulation of the issues.
