With The Clock Turned Back So far, the story of the Conference of Foreign Ministers of the Organization of American States at Rio de Janeiro. Brazil, can be told in three speeches, and in the way each of them handled the United States proposal for the creaion of a hemisphere military force

which would be set up for the purpose intervening in hemisphere countries directened by "totalitarian takeover and rule." The first speech came from Brazil. the host country, and it favored the United States proposal. This was the indorsement United States diplomacy needed least, and could least afford to have, since Brazil is, at the moment, the

semisphere's prime sample, outside of Cuba itself, of a military dictatorship denying the forms and traditions of democracy. The second speech came from Chile, the democratic country trying hard to keep Communism down and out by the soundness and dignity of its own internal politics. The speech from Chile bitterly opposed the United States proposal for a hemisphere military inter-

vention force, and said "the inter-American force would give our regionall system a negative and dangerous ideological connotation, it would destroy the fundamental principle of nonintervention and would threaten to divide us into irreconcilable blocs." This speech from Chile became the most applauded speech of the confer-

The third speech was that of Secre-

tary of State Dean Rusk, who recomded the creation of the inter-American force so that the hemisphere ould be "prepared to move fast and effectively and, if possible, together, when a dangerous situation arises in the hemisphere." This speech was inted as a statement that we faa hemisphere force, but that, if some was created, we would continue to

intervens unliaterally, or occasions we considered necessary, as we did in Dominica. This speech was not well. gived even after it had been awee ened by the special announcement that President Johnson has just decided to extend our contributions to the Alli-ance for Progress beyond the formal ermination date of 1970.

Summing up, we have, so far, had the ong nation with us, the wrong naion against us, and have made our isplay of the stick and carrot techique so obvious we probably embarraused most of our more respectable friends in the hemisphere.

This is no reason for being discouraged. This is, in fact, precisely as well as we can expect to do now that, in act and pronouncement, we have turned back the hemisphere clock to the point where it reads, once again: Intervention, at the discretion of the United

Any romantic vision of Congressman John Lindsay, the nice guy, the liberal hope of the nation's Republicanism, the Ivy League gentleman with the Harlem touch, running for mayor in New York City and winning on the basis of his personal appeal, and charm-any such vision will have to readjust itself slightly, in order to let a touch of reality in In addition to all the other Lindsay charms and appeals, there was a slight matter of some \$2,500,000 thrown in to finance his campaign.

There was nothing crooked or reprehensible about this. All the \$2,500,000 did, one can be sure, was make it possible for the pleasing Lindsay image to reach more voters, for the moderate Lindsay message to be repeated a few times more often, for the genuine enthusiasm of his own close friends and supporters to be communicated out into ever widening circles of people, and then for the zeal and enthusiasm of these people to be given an opportunity to play a part in the campaign effort and the business of getting out the vote.

While this was what the nice guy spent, the old Tammany Democratic or ganization, one of the villains in the piece, had perhaps a million dollars less to spend, while the third man needed only some \$250,000 to keep his waspish themes before the voters.

There can be no law about the voteproducing efficiency of campaign funds. If there were, many an election would have turned out differently. Sometimes no amount of money can overcome a candidate's or a party's natural handicaps. Sometimes no amount of campaign poverty can keep a candidate's natural appeal from scoring a victory on its own.

The Israeli Elections

David Ben-Gurion is so widely and rightly honored for his remarkable contribution to establishing the State of Israel that it might seem amiss to say that his countrymen were wise not to follow where he was beckoning in this week's election.

Mr. Ben-Gurion is lively and vigorous for all his years. But he has made his contribution to the national well-being. A generation of native Israelis is coming to maturity. And for all his fierce patriotism, Mr. Ben-Gurion does not now necessarily know best what is right for Israel. Yet, like former Chancellor Adenauer in West Germany, Mr. Ben-Gurion finds it enormously difficult to watch gracefully from the sidelines of

Levi Eshkol has been a worthy and responsible Premier, and the likelihood of a further term as head of government after Tuesday's elections will reassure most of Israel's friends overseas. His approach to Israel's hostile Arab neighbors has been more cautious than was Mr. Ben-Gurion's-but not necessarily more passive. And an approach such as Mr. Eshkol's is more likely to lead one day to a modus vivendi between Arabs and Israelis.

In some ways, Mr. Ben-Gurion's break with Mr. Eshkol was connected with a feeling that Mr. Eshkol was not giving the party to which they both belonged a bold and imaginative enough lead. This party, Mapai, has played in Israel something of the role of the Congress Party in India. But both are now so used to office and national leadership that they suggest a certain flabbiness in their current ways and Mr. Ben-Gurion's job was the plant-
