Elisabeth Dead at 89

Belgium Mourns Heroine Queen

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP)—One of the world's top musical talents today for Dowager Queen Elisabeth, a heroine in two worlds and one of Europe's leading patronesses of the arts.

The 89-year-old queen suffered a heart attack Nov. 4. She had another serious attack Tuesday night and died within a few minutes.

Elisabeth was the widow of King Albert, the mother of former King Leopold III and the grandmother of the reigning monarch, King Baudouin. Former Queen Marie Jose of Italy is her daughter, and Grand Duchess Josephine-Charlotte of Luxembourg is a granddaughter.

Although born a German princess, she won the hearts of the Belgians during the two wars in which her native country was the enemy.

"An iron curtain has fallen between my country and me," she said when German troops invaded Belgium in World War I. She nursed the wounded in the trenches and was awarded the French War Cross for her "courage and devotion under enemy fire."

In World War II she defied the Nazis and succeeded in staying in Belgium when the retreating Germans removed the royal family to Germany.

A violinist, pianist, painter and sculptress, she sponsored top scientific and artistic body.

HARTFORD (AP)—There'll be some changes made by Connecticut power companies as a result of the Big Blackout of Nov. 4.

The Hartford Electric Light Co. and the Connecticut Light & Power Co. have ordered auxiliary generators to back up their main generators.

These are to provide enough power to keep the main generators going during a similar power failure, or to prevent the generators from tripping if they are knocked out.

HELCO has ordered a jet-engine generator for its Middletown plant similar to the one which it has had at South Meadows since 1962.

The South Meadows emergency unit helped keep most of Hartford supplied with electricity during the blackout.

CL&P has ordered two auxiliary generators for its two largest plants, Devon and Norwalk. It also plans to install an auxiliary generator at Westville.

The Westville plant was out of action only briefly during the blackout because it was quickly cut off from the rest of the Northeast grid. It resumed production of electricity after a few minutes and kept the New London and Norwich areas from being affected by the massive power failure.

CL&P said the auxiliary generators will give it a completely self-sustaining system.

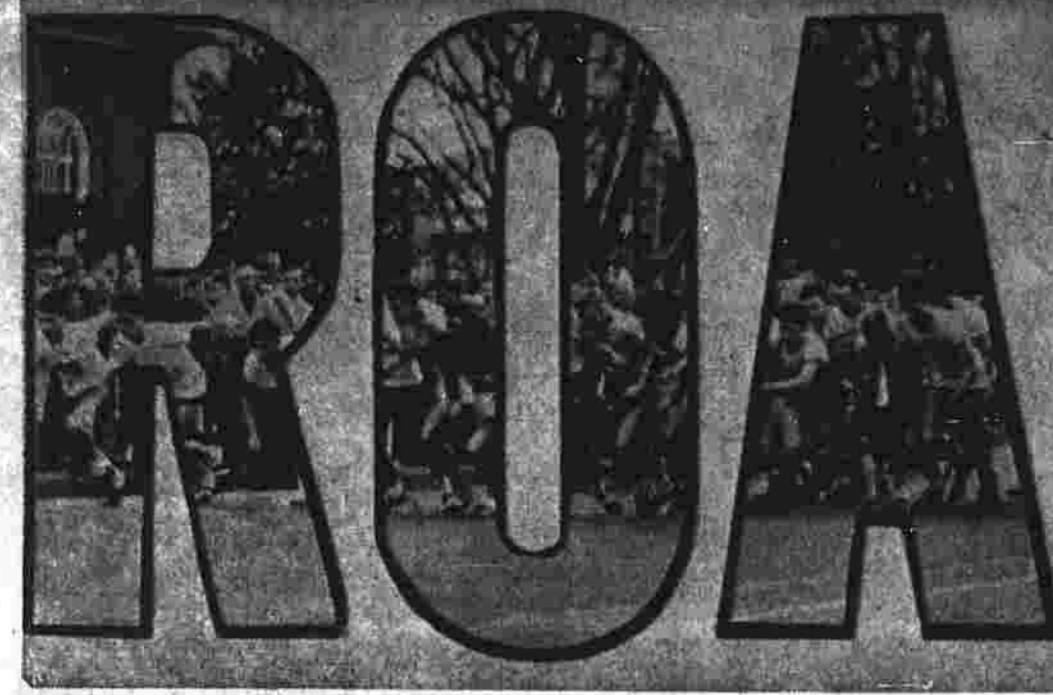

Expect over 10,000 To Watch Big Field

Starting field for the 29th annual Five Mile Road Race Thanksgiving morning in Manchester looks like a Who's Who in Eastern racing circles, with some of New York's, New Jersey's and the Midwest's top cross country and long distance runners tossed in. Tomorrow's spectacle starts at 10:30 on the lower end of Main St.—near School St.—with an expected 10,000 spectators expected to view a record number of starters.

The entry list stands at 164 today, a new all-time high for 24 hours before the big race. Last year there were 141 starters and 140 finishers, Ralph Buschmann, former University of Massachusetts ace, now with the Spartan A. C. of Brockton, Mass., winning in 23:56.2.

This marks the 10th consecutive year the entry list topped the 100 mark and the seventh in which at least 100 runners will step off the mark on Main St. The starting line will also be the finishing point.

Sponsors are Nutmeg Forest, Tall Cedars of Lebanon, with all proceeds from the 100 per cent benefit promotion, going to the Muscular Dystrophy Fund, national objective of the Cedars. While Buschmann did not get to enter, it was reported he would be on hand. The defending champion warmed up last Sunday by winning the New England AAU Cross Country Championship in Boston.

Biggest Name
The biggest name is Little Johnny Kelly, a six-time winner, who returns after an absence of one year. The Groton schoolteacher, running for the Boston A.A., has a fantastic record: the two-time Olympian and holder of more than 20 national titles, has been either first or second in his 10 appearances in the Silk Town bumper derby. He's regarded in most circles as America's premier long distance runner.

Larry Farnell of St. John's University, the Metropolitan cross country champ, will be making his first appearance. The New York collegian was undetected in cross country meets this fall.

Latest standout from Central Connecticut State College under Coach Ted Owen, Ray Crothers will be shooting for his first win. The little freckled-faced lad has done well in the past, in the top 10 the past three years. Crothers is the current New England Intercollegiate cross country champion this fall.

Jim Keefe, who just missed out making the Olympic team last year, has a fourth and two second place finishes to his credit. The former Central standout won the Martin Run at Westleyan last Sunday and appears one of the "men to beat."

Great Season
Tall Andrew Burford of Westleyan, like Farnell, will be the individual winner of each of his team's cross country meets.

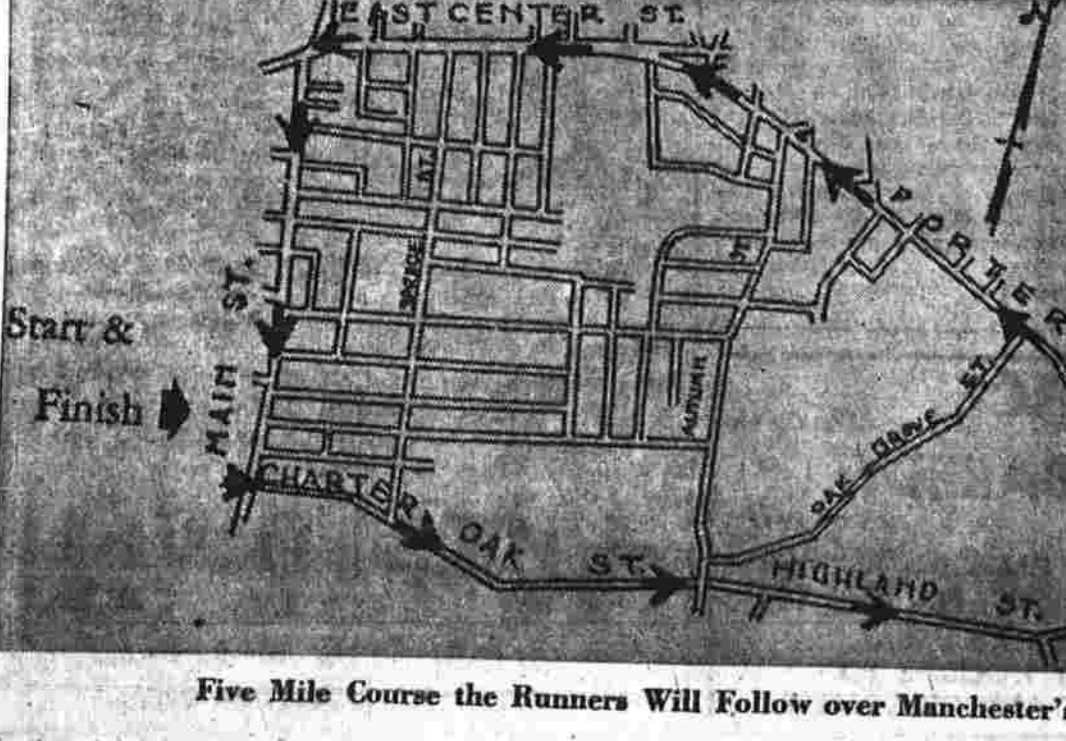

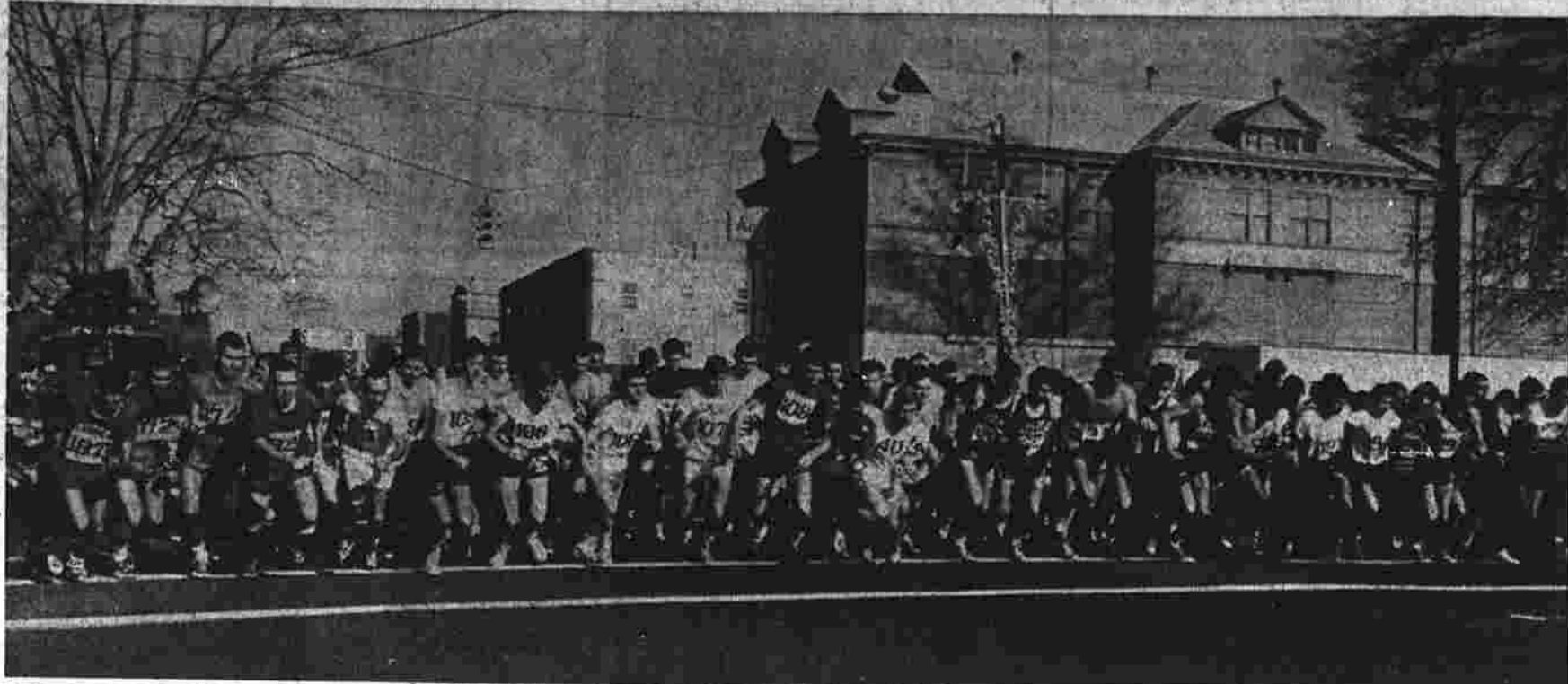
