Would Be A Favor To Us All One reason the continuing rise in the cost of living causes more concern among the professional economists than among the consuming public is that the consuming public happens to be earning more today than at any time in his-

So far as the people are concerned, so far as the price makers are concerned, and so far as politicians inclined to roll along with good times are concerned. we are now living in the greatest bonanza ever imaginable, so what does a monthly fleabite of a small percentage increase in the statistical cost of living amount to?

That part of the picture outlines the increasing economic danger in which we live. The bubble swells, the balloon ascends, and it is taking everybody up together so that everybody is coming out at least a little ahead of yesterday. That leaves it up to somebody special. to somebody supposedly clear-headed

enough not to be caught up in the fever, to be the one to move toward caution, timidity, conservatism, and some effort to control our inflationary im-That someone should, of course, be

the President, and he and his economic advisers and potential controllers should be able to move with the assurance of some intelligent support from Congress. And official efforts to damp down

our economic ascension should receive the understanding and support of all the rest of us too. For we have reached another of those periods in which just a little bit more of a good thing can blast it all in our faces. Each additional bit of additional profit for concerns already operating at record profits is now a danger signal; those wage increases which may seem doubly justifiable, both from the point of view of husiness profits and from the point of view of consumer prices, are nevertheless bits of plastic bomb being inserted into the welfare of us all.

Anybody and anything that can hold us down, pin us about where we are for a while, will be doing us all, business, wage earner, and consumer, a favor beyond calculation, saving us from our giddy selves, and creating a sounder chance that we can keep the good fortune we now possess.

The marvels of science in our time. confinue to take our breath away. And it is hard to think of anything more thrilling than the latest conquest our science has achieved

It was announced at a meeting of the American Chemical Society in New York City the other day. Thanks to new perfection in our

modern techniques for analyzing chemical combinations and the processes by which they might be achieved, we are now able to explain, at last, how Roman artisans of 1,500 years ago were able to produce rare and beautiful ornamental glass nobody else has ever since been able to manufacture.

After we perfect our scientific knowledge of how the Romans did it. we may even be able to reconstitute the nanufacturing process ourselves. Then, thanks to our modern science,

we ourselves might be able to make glass as beautiful as that our Roman ancestors manufactured quite casually 1.500 years ago. Chalk up one more miracle for mod-

ern science.

Where Will The War End?

It is only since April that Mr. Stewart

and Mr. Cabot Lodge could have ventured to list the opportunities for talks offered by Washington and rejected by Hanoi, Before then the revelation that the United States Government had ignored North Vietnamese peace feelers would have been so completely in accordance with expectation as to be scarcely newsworthy; most of all in September last year, when such an episode is said to have happened. At that time it seemed to be taken for granted that the Communists were anxious for a conference, to which, however, their 'aggression" did not entitle them. Mr. McNamara's statement last week that he believed in "unconditional discussions" in 1964 has certainly come as a surprise. Right up to March US officials reacted with marked testiness to those who urged negotiations; Saigon and Washington, for whom the war had been going badly, had first (we were given to understand) to recover their fortunes sufficiently to negotiate from strength.

That was one of the purposes of the increased American commitment (including the bombing of the North) undertaken in February. The other main purpose, we were told, was to check the movement of men and arms from North into South Vietnam. For a time there was euphoria. On April 7 President Johnson did feel able to offer "unconditional talks" (although it was clear from his speech that unconditional meant without conditions from the other side). We are soon hearing how well the civilian Prime Minister, Dr. Quat, was stabilizing the political situation in Saigon. There might be some reverses during the monsoon period, but in a few months the tide


should have turned. Some of Washington's American and foreign critics did not believe all this; not for the first time they proved right, and official Washington proved wrong. Dr. Quat was too good a man to last; most people outside Vietnam have now forgotten his premiership. Negotiations seem no nearer, and infiltrators come not as single spies, but in battalions. It is now being suggested that a full division of the North Vietnamese Army is in action in the west Central Highlands; at any rate the Americans are now facing far larger forces than ever before. And the fighting, too, has grown progressively more terrible - for both

sides, and for those in the way of it. How is if going to end? The policies President Johnson initiated in February having failed, what will he turn to now? So far as anybody can see, simply more of the same. If the sending of 160,000 American troops has only made matters worse, he will send 200,000, and so upwards. So vast are United States resources

that there is, of course, virtually no limit to this process of expansion. Since the bombing has not hitherto brought the North to its knees, influential Americans are now demanding that new targets be attacked there. One could be more confident that civilian centres would not be hit if so many humanitarian restraints had not already been sacrificed to the necessity, as Washington sees it, of winning the war. Obviously American forces have the sheer power not to be driven out; they could annihilate the whole population of North Vietnam. The question is, how far along that road will Washington be pushed, if its policies continue not to succeed? It has already gone frighteningly far much farther than anybody could have conceived a year ago. The only limit is that set by the conscience of President Johnson, his Administration, and the people he leads. Unfortunately it is the very sincerity of their conscience that drives some of them onwards. For there is almost no end to the horrors people will perpetrate when they are




