Land Of Steady Holdups In Connecticut, the happy hunting ground of the casual, amateur bank bandit, every manager and employe of every branch bank in the state has to live in constant knowledge that his or her place of business and employment Is forever being watched and "cased" by those who are calculating the time and chances for a holdup attempt. The only good thing about the general

acceptance of the inevitability of holdups which dominates Connecticut behavior is that, so far, the holdup artists are generally timid and peaceful fellows, who make no particular violence so long as somebody dutifully hands them a paper bag full of money. It is for this comparative safety to the lives of employes, and for the comparative small amounts it takes to start the holdup men in motion away from the scene, that the Connecticut banking institutions, the insurance companies which insure them, and the police authorities are apparently willing to set-

The holdup man doesn't usually shoot; he gets a relatively small amount of cash; quite often he is caught. This describes the present Connecticut situation, which nobody is in any great or drastic hurry to change.

We still venture the opinion that this is really not a comfortable situation at all, but an intolerable one. We still vate institutional policy ought to stop tolerating the inevitable branch bank holdup and try to do something to prevent it. The old-fashioned armed guard would, of course, stop it all almost immediately, but restore the possibility of violence whenever an attempt might still be made, Present robbery alarm installations, on the other hand, seem almost valueless, since they are seldom activated. The one type of installation which does seem worth while, but which has so far received little encouragement in Connecticut, is that of an automatic camera which automatically snaps everybody who enters the bank door. Disguises might hamper, but could never totally eliminate its usefulness. It might prove the permanent discouragement to the branch bank holdup and wipe out Connecticut's growing title as the holdup state. It might not cost much more than is now being lost in the holdups, and it might bring a peace of mind to bank officials and employes to which they are entitled.

Johnson, Rusk, Kennedy Yesterday, in the course of his tele-

phone address to the AFL-CIO Convention, President Johnson made what s potentially the most dramatic and threatening public utterance he has yet made on the war in Vietnam. "In the past few days," he said, "I have reviewed with my top advisers the

situation in Vietnam. We are carefully studying how we can best continue to turn back that aggression. We are determined to do all that is necessary. "At the same time, we are equally determined that every prospect for peace be exhausted before other hard steps are taken. Only this week we reviewed our efforts for peace in detail. Our efforts to communicate our desire to talk about peace were met with silence from some, shrill propaganda from others. On the crucial question of readiness to meet without conditions, the response in Hanoi and-still more in Peking-remains completely nega-

"Let us hope, however, that even at this hour reason might prevail in the minds of other men who hold the key The stern, alarming notes in this pas-

sage are its indication that the President, even while he himself now confesses himself to be considering those final decisions which would put the seal of complete hopelessness on the world's chance for survival and peace, persists blandly in the assumption that "other nen" must somehow develop "reason." This conclusion was paralleled by Secetary of State Dean Rusk who, at his press conference yesterday, said, with segard to possible war with Communist China, that "the confrontation problem to cas which Peking has to face."

Not Washington? Meanwhile, in a report from a Washington correspondent it considers important enough to publish under copyright, the Christian Science Monitor tolay reports speculation on what some of "hard steps" mentioned by the President might be. The administration. the Monitor reports, is now beginning to appraise the Vietnam war as "very very serious." Indeed! And one of the hings President Johnson has been considering, the Monitor reports, is asking Congress to declare war. There is no speculation as to what grounds such a declaration would use. There was one other prominent

statement in the news yesterday on the question of the Vietnam war, and who might be considered to hold some responsibility for the possibility of truce or peace there. Senator Robert F. Kennedy of New

York urged the Johnson administration to ask the Viet Cong guerrillas in South Vietnam to extend their 12-hour Christmas Eve truce offer into a longer kind of cease-fire.

Senator Kennedy said that the United States should take the initiative in suggesting and asking such an extension of a cease-fire.

"There could be," he said, "some kind of offer to make a cease-fire. We all have responsibilities now to explore all the positions. I think we're getting into a more dangerous situation for all

The greatest sign of danger for America and for civilization is that the courage of individuals to say what they think, to dare to advocate such a thing as a cease-fire, to try to maintain that this country still has some responsibility and should still try to exercise some choice, may not long continue to have at least some occasional champion like Senator Kennedy. There are many actions the President could take or seek before he would obtain the clear right to pronounce the case closed, and if the chief nation involved were not our own even the President would see them clearly enough.

Astonishing Charges
The revelation by Eric Sevareld in Look magazine that Hanol had twice agreed to send an emissary to Rangoon for the purpose of discussing the war in Viet Nam is as astonishing as it is no doubt true. Our government has already admit-

ted that one such event was the truth. As Sevareld put it: "When the election was over U Thant again pursued the matter (of the talks): Hanol was still willing to send its man. But Defense Secretary Robert McNamara, Adlai went on, flatly opposed the attempt. He said the South Vietnamese government would have to be informed and that this would have a demoralizing effect on them; that the government was shaky enough as it was. Stevenson told me that U Thant was furious over this failure of his patient efforts, but said nothing publicly."

Sevareid has also filled in further details on the negotiations as he reported "Time was passing, the war expanding. The pressure on U Thant, supposedly the Number One peacemaker of the globe, were mounting from all sides within the U.N. So he proposed an outright cease-fire, with a truce line to be drawn across not only Viet Nam but neighboring Laos. U Thant then made a remarkable suggestion: United States officials could write the terms of the cease-fire offer, exactly as they saw fit, and he. U Thant, would announce it in exactly those words. Again, so Stevenson said to me, McNamara turned this down, and from Secretary Rusk there was no response, to Stevenson's knowl-

"At the time of this incident, it was official American policy that the fighting would go on until North Viet Nam "left its neighbors alone, to use the phrase the State Department was then using. In other words, the Communists would have to quit first. It was not until April, in his Baltimore speech that President Johnson changed all this and announced that the United States was willing to negotiate for peace without The disclosure raised a number of in-

teresting speculations and the first of these concerns the responsibilities of a President. The American people, to put the matter in its most polite form, have been allowed to gain a false impression. The implicit message that the President has conveyed is that he has been willing to negotiate, but Hanoi has not. This appears not to be the case. At the same time this impression has been conveyed in a round-about way: the emphasis has been on U.S. efforts, and there have been many, to search out discussions since the dates arranged by U Thant. But always the suggestion has been that the initiative in terms of discussions bearing no pre-conditions,

has always been ours. It must be remembered, perhaps, that Stevenson was deeply offended by President Johnson. He was not informed that the President was going to say in his Dominican speech that we would not permit another Cuba, or that Communists were in control of the Dominican rebellion. And yet he had to defendthat intervention in the Caribbean, Sevareid also reports that when Stevenson called down to the White House to have the text of the President's U.N speech read to him "Presidential Assistant Richard Goodwin, a Stevenson friend, was unable to comply. He told Stevenson that President Johnson had

given him a flat order to show the speech to no one, specifically including Stevenson and Secretary Rusk." The assertion that President Johnson refused to reveal his speech on the 20th anniversary of the founding of the U.N. to America's chief delegate to the U.N., or to the Secretary of State, no doubt reveals a secretive mind that is apt to comment on lost opportunities of negotiating with Hanoi. This has not been the best of weeks for President Johnson, he stands accused of mis-using both the facts and the highest officers of this government. — MIDDLETOWN
