On Preventing World Wars It is one of the tortured tragedies and ifficulties of our domestic discussion of he war in Vietnam that the best arguments used by either side seem com-

detely reversible to the other. Thus, last Friday, Secretary of State ean Rusk climaxed a very vocal week by going out to San Francisco and summing up all his argument in favor of our policy in Vietnam. We are; he told AFL-CIO Convention, fighting in Vietnam in order to avoid World War

This, of course,—the avoiding of World War III-is a very fine and raiseworthy objective.

Yet the other side of the debate has

the easy option of drawing from our experience in Vietnam, as well as from a study of past history, frightening indications that what we are accomplishing in Vietnam, what we were indeed almost fated to accomplish with the means we have selected, is operating to make World War III inevitable instead of operating to avoid it.

The trouble is that the present state of civilization is located between two opposing and mutually contradictory

The theory we are following in Vietmam is the old-fashioned theory of power politics nationalism, sugar-coated with our own sincere feeling that what we are doing there we are really doing theory which, whatever special justifications it feels it possesses from instance to instance, has a history not of avoiding war but of creating and con-

What we are doing in Vietnam is, even in the minds of its supporters, a matter of moving resolutely toward World War III as our policy for avoiding World War III. And nobody, not even the supporters of this policy, can be free of the fear that we may get, instead of avoid, the thing we are moving

The other, and still by no means universally honored theory of international conduct in the face of the threat of such a possibility as World War III, sims at a different kind of practice.

It tries to find some way of meeting rouble with international law and international action instead of unilateral law and unilateral action. It holds, this second theory, that the way to avoid World War III is not to produce a rushing together of the two antagonistic forces which would be waging that war, in the hope that one or the other will be frightened away from it, but to get something in between these two great war potentials.

This theory, when it has been tried, has worked to prevent war, which is something the old power politics law of the nationalist jungle has never done. It prevented World War III in Korea, when it opposed an international flag and international opinion and interna-

tional force to an instance of aggres-It prevented World War III from developing in Suez, when it succeeded in interposing the concept of United Nations law and truce and patrol between the belligerent forces which had launch-

ed themselves an old-fashioned power politics engagement. to prevented World War III from developing over the Congo, when it rushed to that trouble spot an international presence which kept the United States and Russia from seeking and taking precisely the kind of nationalistic power politics roles the United States on one

hand and an uneasy alliance of Communist nations on the other are now playing in Southeast Asia. From such instances, there has developed the only theory, rule, and kind

of procedure this poor world has yet developed for the prevention of war. It is not to accept and increase the mutual challenge toward war. It is to interpose international presence and law and negotiation and authority between the celligerents, potential or actual. So, if a nation really wants to pre-

vent World War III, it does not necessarily rush toward ". great potential capacity to win it, or to prove to the o...

The argument, as between rushing to out out the small war before it becomes a big one, and not adding fuel to It so it inevitably becomes the big one, stands fairly equal in the world today, and it is an argument which divides Americans among themselves.

But the historical record points only one way. It points neither to old-fashloned power politics nor to Munich-type nor Manchuria-type nor Ethiopia-type

nor Spain-type appeasement, but to what all mankind had in mind when it organized the United Nations. .

The very simple reason why meetings such as that of the American Paychoanalytic Association always make news is that they at least discuss real uman problems in terms which, for all their expertness, real human beings can usually understand for themselves. The 1,200 psychoanalysts of this assoiation caught the public interest on two subjects during their recent annual

fall conference in New York City.

They discussed the question of discontentment and insecurity in modern woman. Some of them said that the unhappiness of modern woman derives from the conflict between her feeling of superiority to the male and her resentment over the fact that, for all her superiority, she is still considered the weaker sex, and then still, for all that weakness, assigned the arduous tasks of bearing children and doing the

And other psychoanalysts at this meeting said that the unhappiness of modern woman had to be assigned to some other cause, because the one deep satisfaction woman does have lies in her realization of the deep fulfilments which lie in the special duties and labors assigned to her by her sex.

If this division of opinion and analysis provides a good sample of the way these psychoanalysts can set us all off on fascinating theories of our own, they were even more stimulating when they got to their analysis of compulsive gambling.

They found, some of these experts, that the compulsive gambler is an individual who has an unconscious desire to lose, to be deprived of his posses-

And they found, others of the experts, that the compulsive gambler is a fellow who is dominated by a wish to win-"to recapture something which is unattainable-to compel fate to reverse its course and make the player omnipo-One of the experts who holds the

latter view, that people gamble in order to win, clinched his case by citing the example of a compulsive gambler who always bet both ways so that he came up with a winner no matter what happened. The moment the winning number or horse or team had been identified, this gambler had no trouble at all establishing his own happy identity with it, and achieved all the triumph of having picked a winner.

And that, we think, is indeed the true compulsive gambler - the fellow who has to win even if it costs him money
