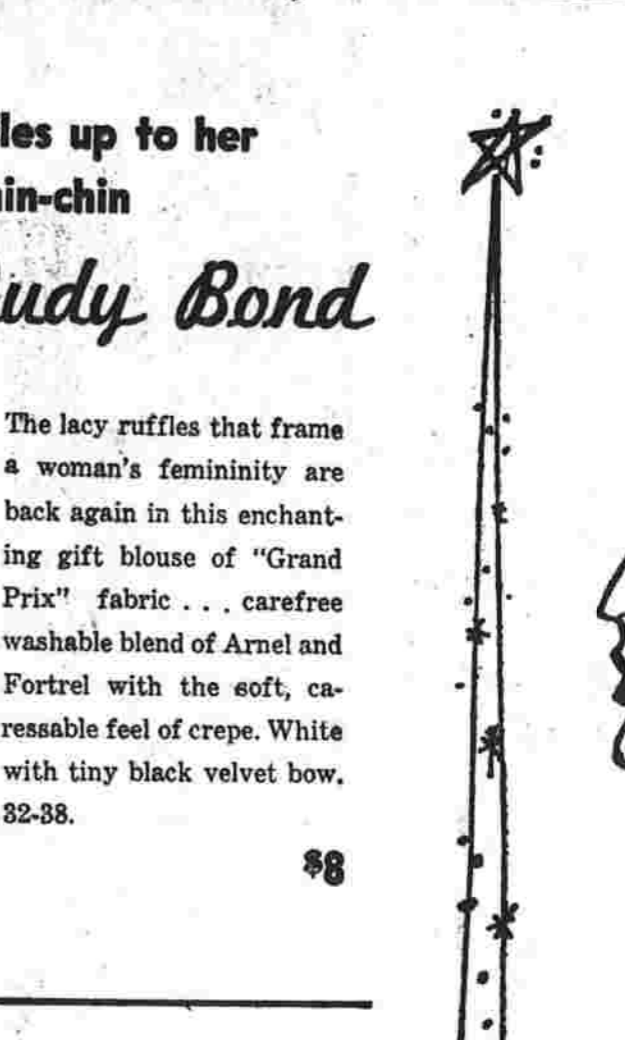

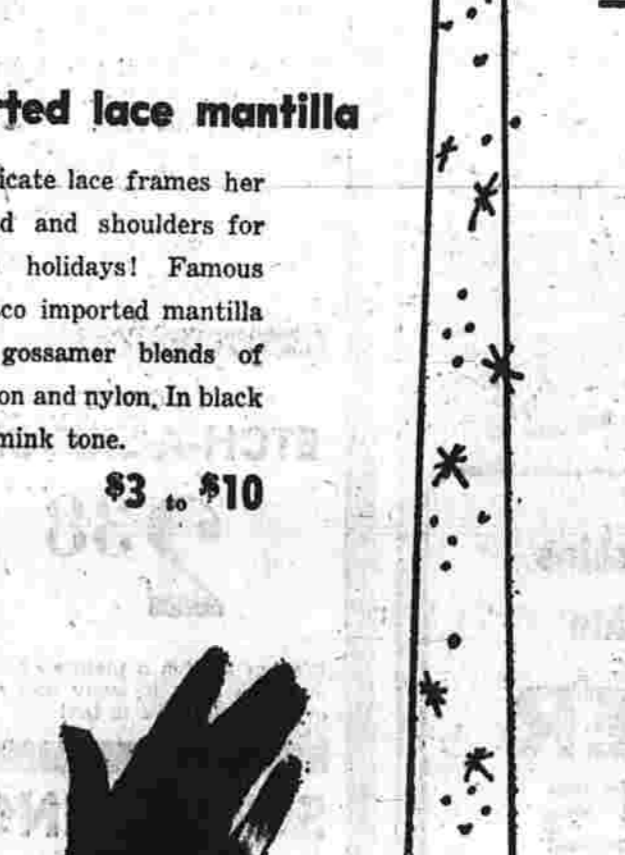

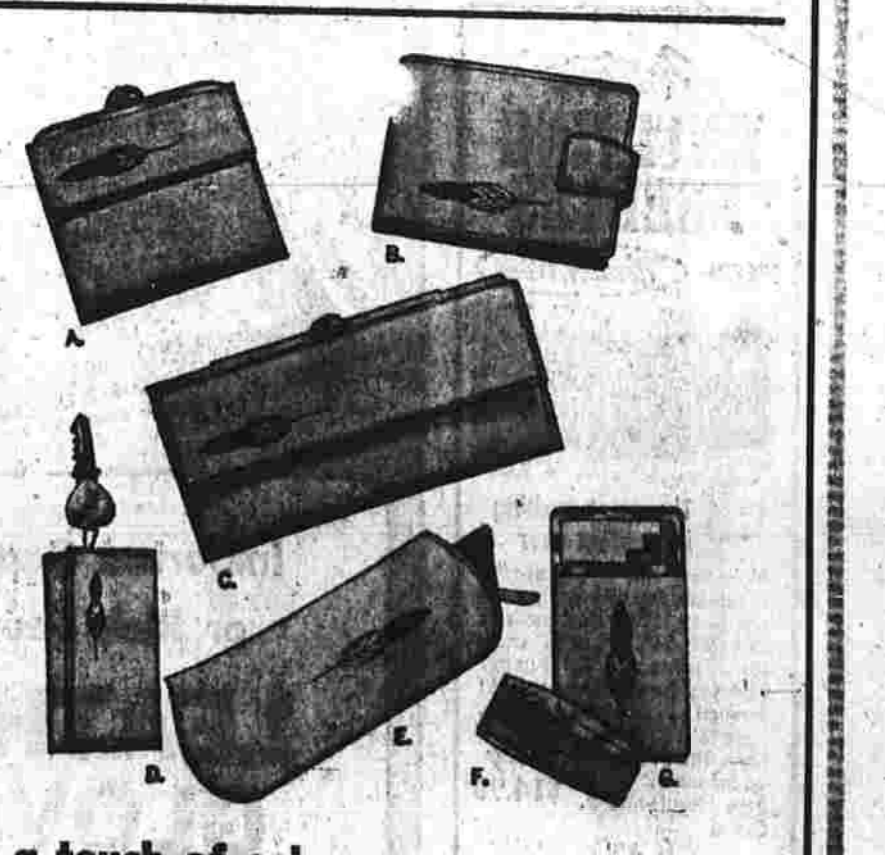

Busing Plan In Massachusetts Tests Getting State Funds

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. (AP)—School officials have proposed a busing plan, contingent upon state financing, as the key method of reducing racial imbalance in Springfield's public schools.

Mayor Charles V. Ryan Jr. said the plan is designed to end imbalance in one junior high school by busing several hundred Negro students from their district.

On the elementary school level, Ryan said, the plan calls for busing any youngsters who wish to enroll in predominantly white schools with available seats. Vacant seats reportedly are abundant.

Ryan said a poll showed that 800 pupils, 200 of them white, would be included voluntarily in any transfer plan.

The state's racial imbalance law says the Board of Education "shall supply technical and other assistance" to plans for eliminating imbalance. Ryan hopes "other assistance" can be interpreted to mean money for busing.

Ryan said that if the state provides funds, "the busing will absolutely begin in the fall."

But Ryan cautioned that the plan would not eliminate imbalance, although it would substantially reduce it. An expansion of the program each year, as more parents joined voluntarily, along with new buildings, could lead to a permanent solution, he said.

House Expected to Reject Senate-Approved Tax Bill

BOSTON (AP)—The Senate-approved 1966 budget bill either will be rejected or amended in the House, according to a conference committee and a Senate conference committee as soon as possible.

Chairman Anthony M. Sclafani, D-Springfield of the House Ways and Means Committee, said his committee recommends that the House not agree to the bill.

The committee members were not going along with the Senate changes in the House-approved tax bill. It cut out \$4.5 million in taxes on items sold by vending machines and \$500,000 in fees charged for the registration of professional persons with the state.

WASHINGTON (AP)—It's firm except calendar or pencils all right to give your postman a handkerchief, some cookies or such for Christmas in appreciation of those trudges through rain, sleet and snow to your mailbox.

A postal official said today that the department has no position regarding token gifts of appreciation — with reason.

"But we have very, very strict regulations — under no circumstances on the letter carriers solicit anything," he said.

A check around the capital showed the government has "hand's look clean" regulations about gifts to any federal employee from anybody having business or seeking business with the government.

Negro Churches Discuss Unity

ATLANTA, Ga. (AP)—Three of the nation's top Negro churches — with a combined membership of more than 2.3 million — meet today in another effort to unify.

The three denominations are the African Methodist Episcopal Church, the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church, and the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church.

They made their first attempt to unify in 1968. Until now no further efforts at unification had been made, although a meeting was held in Philadelphia on 1961, and bishops of the three denominations met in St. Louis in April of this year.

A spokesman said it is hoped the Atlanta meeting will be a milestone in getting the whole problem of unification off the ground.

However, he said that should all recommendations be favorable, it will be at least three years before anything definite is resolved.

Any recommendations passed must go back to the three General Conferences. From there, unification must be approved by a two-thirds vote of all the annual conferences of the groups.

The CME convention will be held in Miami in 1966, the AME in Philadelphia in 1967, and the AME Zion in Chicago in 1968.

"Hopefully, it can be resolved by 1970," the spokesman said.

Safety Can Avert Holiday Tragedy

BOSTON (AP)—A baby's first Christmas may be his last unless lighting decorations in holiday decorating parents take as much precaution in holiday decorations as they do in caring for their cherished youngster.

"That's the caution issued today by the National Fire Protection Association in emphasizing the hazards of improper Christmas tree decorating, particularly in the use of lights.

"Fire never takes a holiday... it even on Christmas," a spokesman for the NFPA said. "In the rush of Christmas activities, there may come a careless, thoughtless act which opens the door to deadly fire."

To buttress their warning, the NFPA cited estimates that some 1,000 U.S. homes were hit by Christmas fires last year. The NFPA is a non-profit, technical and educational clearing house for fire safety information.

"And the principal cause of defective wiring on lighting strings and other electrical fixtures," the spokesman said, "is that parents plan to 'roll up' the home for their youngsters, the NFPA offered these suggestions:

Choose a fresh tree and stand it in water from the time you buy it until you dispose of it. Don't rely on chemical preparations to "flameproof" your tree... none is truly effective.

Should you have a plastic tree make sure it is of slow-burning material.

Metal trees will conduct electricity, so use only indirect lighting strings of lights.

Never use wax candles or other decorative lighting before leaving the house or going to bed.

Use non-combustible materials — metal, glass, asbestos, etc. — for decorations, where possible.

The NFPA also advised that only safe, battery-operated electric candles be used in children's plays and church processions. Never use lighted wax candles.

In addition to dangerous decorations, there's the incident of momentary chaise-taking which could jeopardize children.

"Sometimes while doing last minute shopping," the NFPA said, "mothers may be tempted to leave small children at home unsupervised for a few moments."

"This tragic aftermath for some is to return home and find that fire has made it a place of death and destruction."

Then there's the tight about extensive outdoor lighting... if you plan to really illuminate the outside of your home, swab your pride and get a competent electrician to make sure safety rules and regulations are followed.

Paying attention to safety during the Christmas preparations is one of the best ways to assure a Merry Christmas — and a Happy New Year.

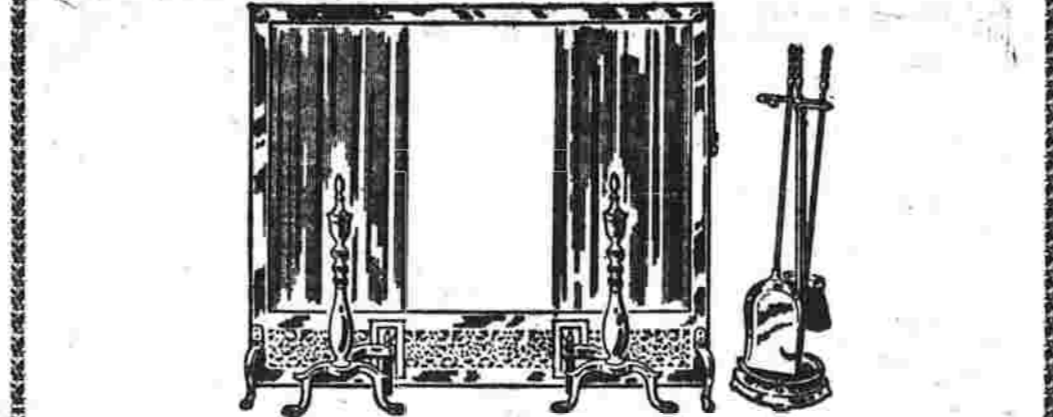

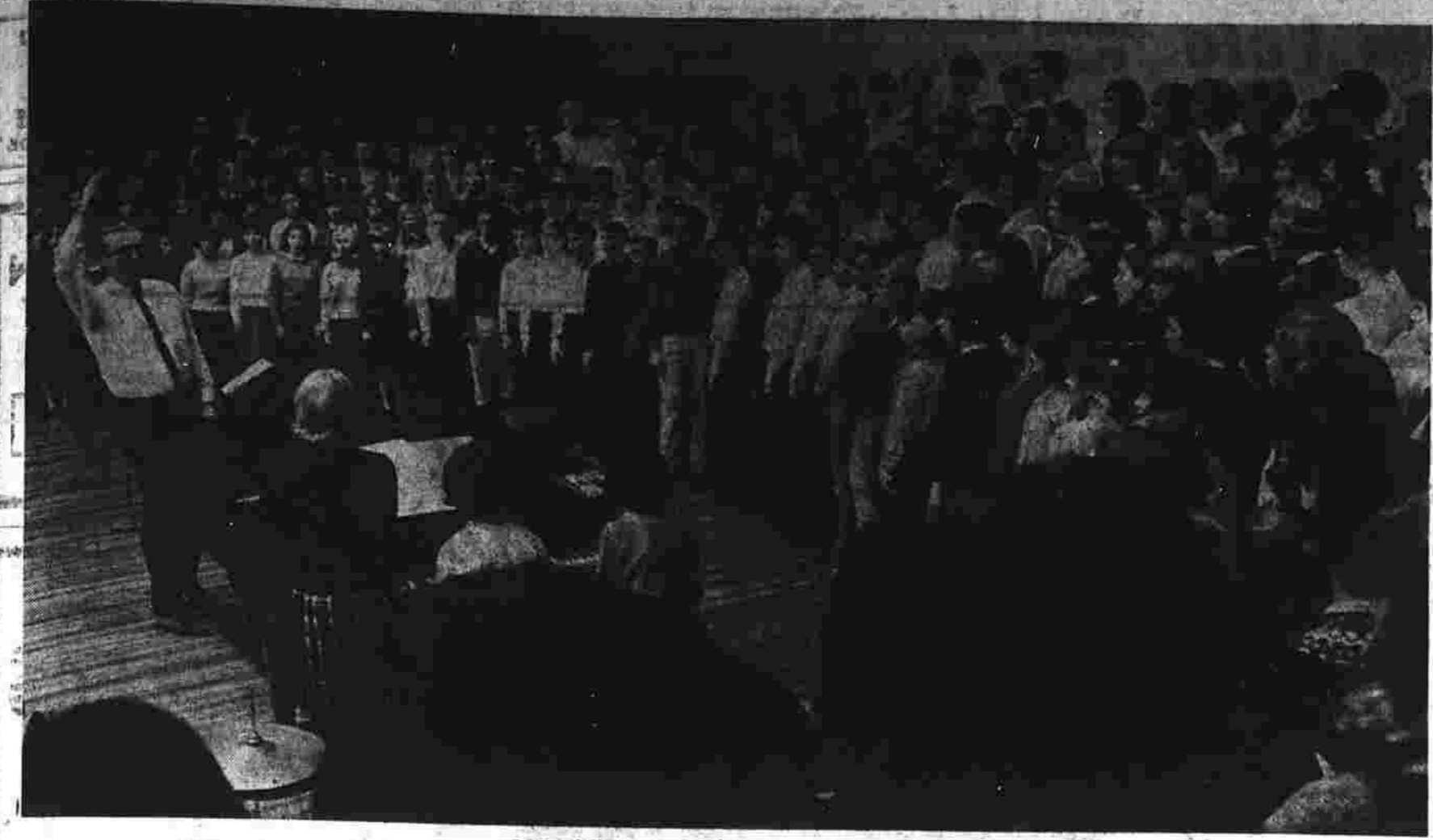

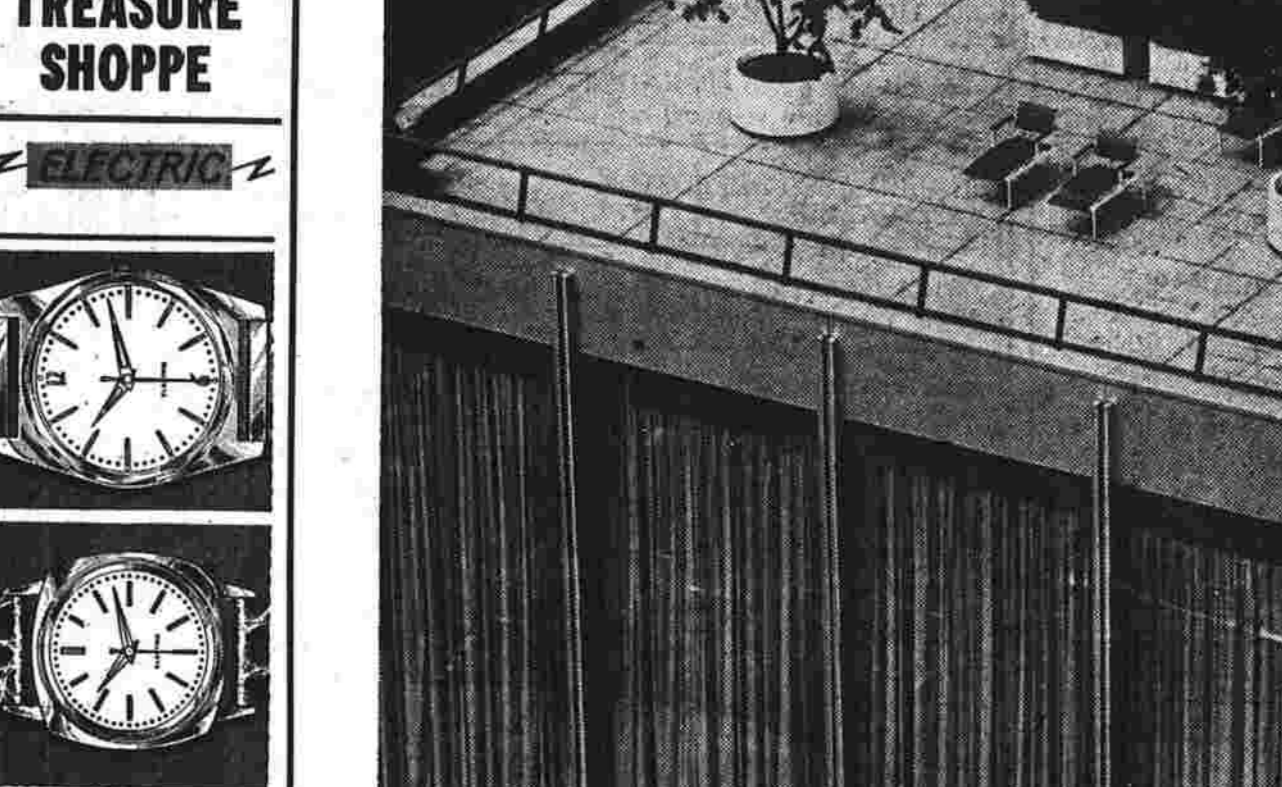

Town Follows Trend In State with Vote

Manchester voted with the state majority yesterday, and in proportionate numbers. More than 5,000 of the town's voters voted to the polls, with most of them voting for a package of constitutional changes and against a more stringent eminent domain provision.

On Question 1, the Constitution, the townwide vote was 3,749 for and 1,830 against, a margin of 4,115 in favor.

On Question 2, eminent domain, the vote was 2,161 for and 2,870 against, a margin of 709 against.

Public counters on the voting machines indicated that 5,143 voted, 21.6 per cent of the 23,028 eligible to vote. The total of yes and no votes on the first question, however, indicates that only 5,073 persons voted on it. The total on the second question indicates that 4,931 voted on it.

In Connecticut as a whole, about 20 per cent of the eligible vote. The state vote on Question 1 was 176,885 for and 84,429 against. On Question 2, it was 115,929 for and 140,086 against.

Here are the votes in Manchester's five voting districts:

District 1, East Side Recreation Center, First question, 724 for and 279 against. Second, 452 for and 543 against. Total vote 1,024, or 19.2 per cent.

District 2, Wadwell School, First question, 709 for and 288 against. Second, 473 for and 507 against. Total vote 1,080, or 19 per cent.

District 3, Community Y, First question, 741 for and 248 against. Second, 426 for and 522 against. Total vote 1,055 or 24.7 per cent.

District 4, Buckley School, First question, 596 for and 196 against. Second, 294 for and 465 against. Total vote 785 or 30 per cent.

District 5, Wadwell School, First question, 709 for and 288 against. Second, 473 for and 507 against. Total vote 1,055 or 24.7 per cent.

At an estimated cost of \$3,000 the election cost was about 70 cents for each vote cast.

Martin Says: New Center Ready For Seniors Soon

General Manager Richard Martin has estimated that the new Senior Citizen's Center at Myrtle and Linden Sts. will be in use within six weeks or less, depending on how quickly repairs and renovations can be made to the building.

His disclosure was made last night in a discussion with the board of directors of a request from the Manchester Association for the Help of Retarded Children for an allocation of about 3,000 square feet of space for a sheltered workshop use.

The MAHRC, in proposing that space be made available in the former Temple Beth Shalom, has suggested that the senior citizens might assist in the related in their programs, as good therapy for both groups.

A discussion arose among the directors last night concerning their vote in July in regard to the use of the facility. They were in doubt whether they had voted to reserve the building for the sole use of the senior citizens or whether they had left the door open for its use by other groups.

Although they were all in agreement that the MAHRC was in urgent need of a sheltered workshop facility, they agreed to wait until after the senior citizens were in the building and conducting a program before making a decision on allocating space.

In the interim, the MAHRC, if the school board gives its approval, will be offered the use of the present senior citizens facility on School St., in the old Cheney Tech building. The school board has jurisdiction over this building.

The board of directors agreed that, in the event the MAHRC was to use the School St. facility permanently, several renovations would be made, principally the addition of rest rooms.

In one discussion last night, the board tabled recommendations on a Young Adult program and on a Manchester Green fire-house site.

The latter will have to wait until after Monday, when the Zoning Board of Appeals hears a town request for a variance at

Lovell OK's Water but He's Afloat

MAUNED SPACE CENTER, Houston, Tex. (AP) — On the eve of the Gemini 7 spacecraft's launch Tuesday, pilot James A. Lovell was instructed to drink more water. His reply: "Roger, I'm floating now, but I'll drink some more."

No Joy in Mudville
Gemini 7 astronaut Frank Borman is a big fan of the Houston Oilers of the American Football League.

Nobis announced his decision Tuesday. Shortly afterward, this conversation ensued between the ground and Gemini 7: Houston: "By the way, you can tell Frank Tommy Nobis went with Atlanta."

Tons of Paper
The space agency uses literally tons of paper to keep news — and the world — informed of the progress of a space flight.

A spokesman said Tuesday the agency had already put out 800,000 words on 4,300 pounds of paper just for the Gemini 7 flight.

Minor Rocket Fire
The space agency announced Tuesday that a minor fire broke out at the base of the Titan 2 rocket engines after they were shut down and the Gemini 8 launch was scrubbed Sunday.

G. Merritt Preston, agency director for launch operations at Cape Kennedy, Fla., said the blaze was quickly extinguished and posed no danger to the two astronauts still in the spacecraft atop the rocket.

He said a small amount of fuel dropped from the flame bucket of the boosters and caught fire. He added that such a development is more or less routine as the engines are ignited.

Powell Gets \$575,000 Libel Fine

NEW YORK (AP) — A state supreme court justice, accusing Rep. Adam Clayton Powell, D-N.Y., of "a malicious defiance of the law," has imposed a new \$575,000 libel judgment on the Harlem congressman.

Justice Maurice Weid made the new award because he said Powell had dodged payment of a \$30,000 judgment awarded Esther James, a Harlem widow, in 1963 in a television interview. In 1960, Powell called Mrs. James a "bag woman," or grant collector, for the police department.

"He's like a mackerel," Weid said of Powell in making the new award Tuesday after a three-hour hearing. "He shines but he smells to high heaven."

Weid said Powell had transferred \$50,000 worth of property in Puerto Rico to relatives of his wife to avoid payment of the original libel judgment.

Mrs. James' lawyer, Raymond Rubin, told the court Powell had paid only \$15,000 of the 1963 judgment.

"It behooves a lawmaker to set an example for others to follow," Weid said. "I think a sentence in jail would do more good than a fine."

Powell did not appear in court.

Mrs. James later told newsmen: "I'm very happy the court has put Mr. Powell in his place. I think the king is still dead," she said.

In Washington, Powell's special assistant, C. Sumner Stone, said the congressman would appeal the judgment. Powell was at home in Puerto Rico and would not comment.

Board Tables Action On Personnel Rules

Despite a recommendation by General Manager Richard Martin for immediate approval of several changes in the town's personnel rules, the board of directors followed Director Robert Stone's recommendation instead, and tabled passage of the changes until after the town's new general manager takes office.

The principal changes in the rules involve the grievance clause, and in two parts. The first would provide for arbitration of grievances, to replace the present method of mediation. The second would provide for grievance rights for probationary employees, principally firemen.

The town's new firemen serve a one-year probationary period and, during that time, are excluded from the personnel rules which cover permanent employees.

Martin and the permanent firemen had a difference of opinion early in November, when the firemen voted to form a local of the International Association of Firefighters.

The general manager, who is authorized to recognize the establishment of local unions, took the position that all probationary firemen should be included as members in the union. Harold Pohl, president of the Firemen's Club, cited the International's regulations which called for their exclusion.

Because of this difference of opinion, the firemen withdrew their request for a hearing before Martin and decided to wait until after Jan. 1 and submit it to the new manager instead.

The board of directors did the same thing last night on all proposed personnel-rule changes. It will consider them so early next week, when the new manager-designate Robert B. Weiss has had time to study them.

The board tabled consideration of engineering reports on the installation of water and sanitary sewers in the Birch Mt. Rd. area until another meeting.

In the interim, Director of Public Works Walter Pium will determine the mechanics of the \$400,000 proposal, including information on funding the project.

Because last night's meeting of the board of directors was the last one which Martin will attend in his capacity of general manager, he was given the courtesy of adjourning it, sine die.

He did so and accepted the board's invitation to attend future meetings, as a taxpayer and interested onlooker.

Bullman Qudah of the village (He follows the dietary laws, but does not believe in veiling women nor bowing to Mecca) will be a guest of the Robert Gortons on Brandy St. weekends for the next five or six months.

Qudah is in the country under the Agency for International Development studying taxation policy here. The Gortons are his host family.

Qudah will be in the United States for a total of nine months and has already spent one of them at the University of Connecticut taking courses with two fellow countrymen and three Koreans.

Last week he moved to an apartment in Hartford with two Jordanians and into the sphere of hospitality of the Women's Service Bureau at G. Post's. The Service Bureau serves as clearing house for international courses with a larger apartment and a house for international students.

Seated in the Gorton living room Sunday afternoon, Qudah said he was the happiest he has been since he left home. He misses his family, he said—he has four children ranging from one to five years old. There were plenty of children at the Gorton's to make him feel at home. Members of the Bolton Outing Club were busy making skate-sails in the basement, and their outgroping were continually wandering in and out. With his warm smile, Qudah had already charmed a number of them.

In Amman, capital of Jordan, Qudah is an assessing officer in the income tax department. He says, when he says this, realizing that he is in a field equally unpopular in all corners of the world.

Qudah described his country as primarily agricultural. His government is making an effort to increase agricultural yield by irrigating, and is also trying to settle the Bedouins, who depend on animals and animal products for their normal livelihood, into farming. He said his government is also encouraging industry and is seeking foreign investment.

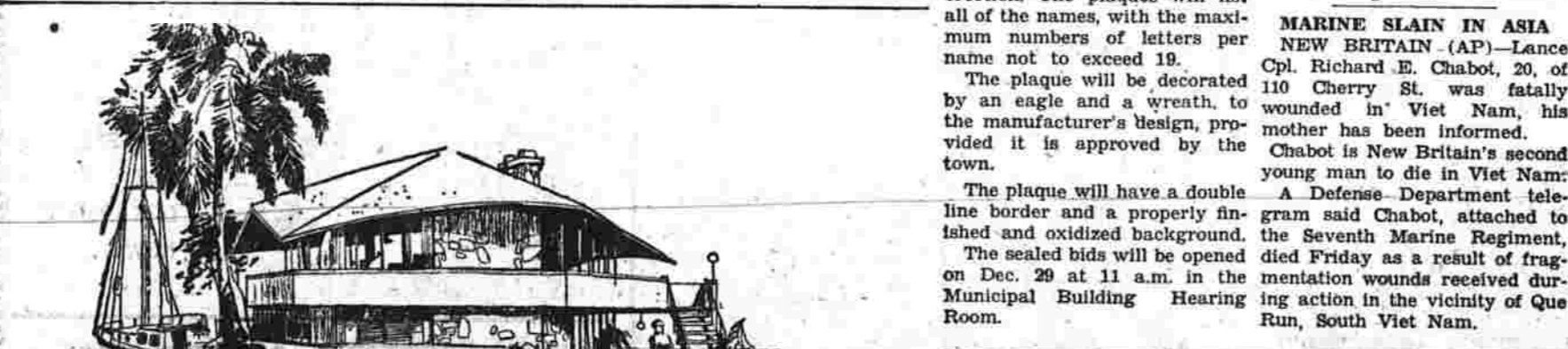

Proposed Firehouse Site Tops ZBA Agenda Dec. 20

A request by the Town of Manchester for a variance on Lawton Rd. which, if granted, would clear the way for a Manchester Green Firehouse at Lawton and Weaver Rds., heads the list of 10 applications before the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) at its Dec. 20 meeting. The meeting and public hearings will be held at 8 p.m. in the Municipal Building Hearing Room. The town is requesting a variance to diminish a parcel of land at 14-16 Lawton Rd. which an apartment complex would be built on. The special exception request is from James M. Quinn, 43-a place at 408 Tolland Pike, in the vicinity of the proposed firehouse site. The lots help fulfill zoning regulations which require that a two-family dwelling to be erected on the site. The variance requests are from: Russell Phibbrick, to erect a free-standing ground sign at 52 Pearl St. in Residence Zone B. The change would provide less floor area than is permitted by regulations. Atty. Eugene Kelly, to divide a parcel of land into two building lots to the north of 460 Vernon St. in Residence Zone AA. The two new lots each would have a frontage of about 115 feet. Regulations require a frontage of 120 feet in that zone. Rhine Chartrand, to erect an addition at 86 Green Manor Rd. in Residence Zone A. The addition would be closer to the sidewalk than regulations permit. She proposes to extend the west side of the existing dwelling 12 feet to the south.

Town Seeks Bids On Vets Plaque

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A cat named "Doris Prince Ygor," the dog's name, is pampered by a psychologist, Miss Singlet, who has helped her to overcome her fears.

"In five minutes," said Dr. Miller, "I can teach a strange dog to come to me on command."

Doctors Get into Community To Aid Neediest Families

BOSTON (AP) — Six thousand residents of a low-income housing project isolated on a peninsula in Boston have been getting a "family doctor."

The "family doctor" in this case is a team of at least 50 persons associated with a medical center.

"We think," says one of the project's directors, "that universities and medical schools ought to go out to the community instead of sitting behind the hospital doors, waiting for people to come in."

Now, Dr. Geiger adds, the cost of furniture has exceeded estimates and the women have formed, on their own, a fund raising organization, dedicating Boston business. The residents also have formed a health association which is expected to work out a payment plan. There is no charge to the individual now. The center also will give the doctors a chance to do some research into the specific health needs of such a community, how much illness there is, what it costs. A computer will be used in the research.

The rural Southern location may be announced about in a month, but the plan has generated some heat. The Mississippi State Medical Association has objected to the imposition of "a foreign pattern of medical care" on the state.

Dr. Geiger said the objection was based on an erroneous report that the center would go in Parola County. It will not, he said, and he has talked with association officials to work things out.

The reason for the two widely separated locations, Dr. Geiger says, is that "the two places where you find the poorest and the sickest are in the urban core of Northern cities and in the rural South." Also, he says, "we'll be on both ends of one of the country's biggest migrations in recent years. Perhaps we can learn to help the person who migrates."

VIENNA, Austria (AP) — government-subsidized prices in Communist Czechoslovakia's Communist regime is soothing Western Europe in search of new markets and supplies as it enters a new era of profit-making and economic decentralization.

The Prague government also is seeking to stem a wave of public buying touched off by rumors that under the economic reform plan prices of such basic foods as sugar, flour and potatoes are earmarked for sharp increases and that the currency will be devalued.

Called the "New Economic Model," the scheme has been propagated for two years by the Communist party as a long-overdue remedy for faulty planning, lack of consumer goods, and poor quality of export products which even the Soviet Union and other European Communist countries have refused to buy.

The plan virtually abolishes two traditional maxims of Communist ideology — rigid government control over the economic process from top to bottom, and
