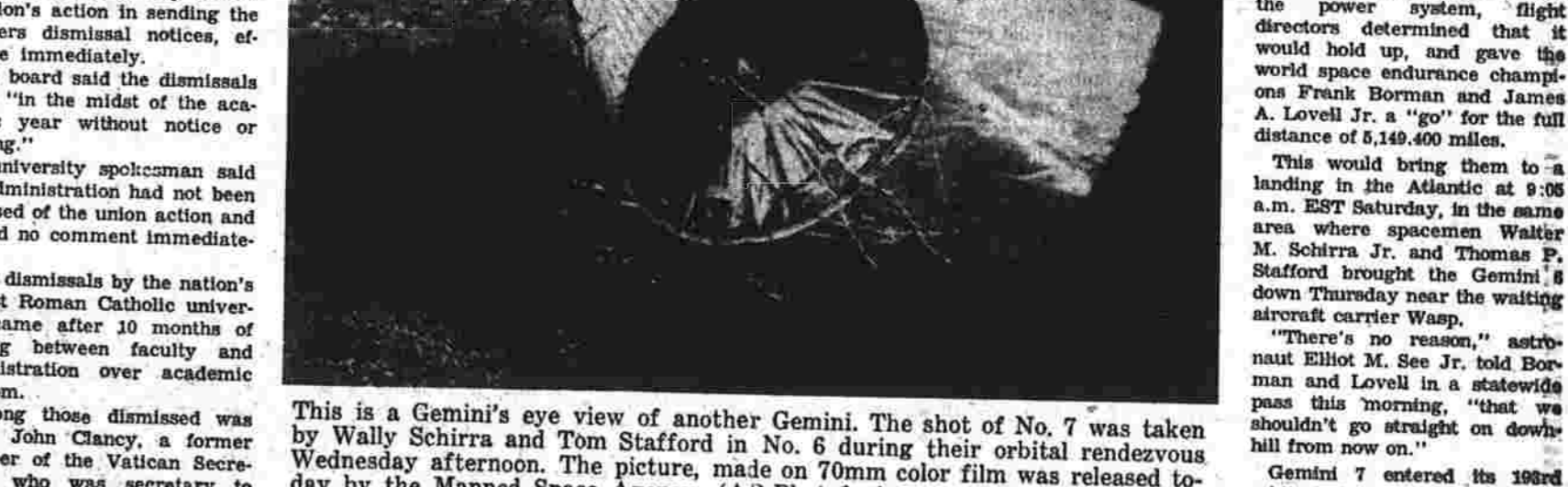

Aid Rushed To Pakistan Trouble Site

DAKKA, East Pakistan (AP)—The Pakistani government rushed relief teams and supplies today to the cyclone-devastated coast of East Pakistan where many thousands were reported dead.

The Pakistani News Agency reported that 2,000 persons were killed but other reports said the death toll was much higher. The cyclone's twisting 100 mile an hour winds, followed by a 12-foot tidal wave and heavy rains, devastated crops and villages.

The governor of East Pakistan flew from Dacca to Chittagong to direct relief operations.

The cyclone started in the Bay of Bengal, which is formed by India, East Pakistan and Burma. The storm hit at Cox Bazar, moved up the coast through Chittagong, about 200 miles east of Calcutta and then blew itself out as it moved northeast.

Naval units searched for survivors on the many small islands dotting the coast. Two hundred deep-sea fishermen were reported missing off Sonda Island.

Persons reaching Chittagong from Cox's Bazar, 40 miles down the coast, said they saw scattered bodies. The news agency said the British ship Star Pink picked up five survivors in the Bay of Bengal Wednesday.

Details of the devastation on the islands were sketchy because communications were cut with the mainland port of Chittagong.

Hundreds were homeless, and 50 per cent of the houses were wrecked in Cox's Bazar, which has a population of about 6,000. The airfield was reported under a foot of water.

Unofficial reports said thousands of persons perished on Maheshkhali Island. The cyclone reportedly destroyed 75 per cent of Sonadia's crops and houses. A great loss of livestock was feared on other islands.

It was the area's eighth cyclone disaster in recent years. The last one killed 1,700 persons in the Chittagong district last May.

Erhard Will Ask to Share A-Responsibility in NATO Events In Capital

BONN, Germany (AP)—An informed source said today Chancellor Ludwig Erhard will make concrete proposals to President Johnson on how West Germany could share nuclear responsibility within the Atlantic alliance.

The source said Erhard will not press for the proposed multilateral nuclear force—MLF—plan but he did not make clear whether Erhard wants the creation of a new nuclear force of some kind.

The source said, however, Erhard was not going to discuss any "letter projects" apparently referring to the British-proposed Atlantic nuclear force—ANF—as well as MLF.

Erhard flies to Washington Sunday and is scheduled to see Johnson Monday and Tuesday. Erhard has been acting lead-

WASHINGTON (AP)—Some two million persons will witness non-Communist statements to qualify for the new Medicare program.

A Welfare Department spokesman said the requirement was included in the bill passed by Congress.

About 17 million of them have Social Security or railroad retirement coverage.

SAMS GET 8 PLANES
WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States has lost 137 planes in action over North Viet Nam, but only a few have been felled by the surface-to-air—SAM—missiles.

Figures made available Thursday show that 390 SAM missiles have been fired, three are credited with eight kills.

Gemini Power Plant Pesky Fuel Cells Still Cause Worry

MANNED SPACE CENTER, Houston, Tex. (AP) — When the lights flickered on at the same time aboard Gemini 7 as they started around the world, they signaled that something was awry in the spacecraft's precious electrical power system.

Just what went wrong, nobody knows. Certainly there was room for concern, even though the lights had been pesky throughout the flight.

Two 60-pound fuel cells — hydrogen, flameless and smokeless — are used to generate power at supercool temperatures to create electricity needed to run the craft's equipment. They also make water.

And without electricity, Air Force Lt. Col. Francis Borman and Navy Cmdr. James A. Lovell Jr. could do very little to control their spaceship.

The light on one of the cells came on periodically throughout the flight. Knowing by the 12th day that two of the cell's three production stacks were out of commission, flight director Christopher C. Kraft Jr. ordered the cell shut down.

He said one fuel cell could have run Gemini 7 for 14 days.

But why the second warning light in the No. 1 cell system, which seemed to be working well in all three sections?

Kraft compared the warning light to a light on your automobile that says your battery is discharging.

UN's Walkout on Wilson Comparatively Mild Snub

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — The walkout that greeted British Prime Minister Harold Wilson in the U.N. General Assembly in a favorite form of rebuke that U.N. delegates have been using for nearly 20 years.

Wilson was left fuming Thursday at the empty seats of 21 delegations, 27 of them from Africa. But it was a mild snub compared to the walkout of some 70 delegations when South African Foreign Minister Biko left his government's racist policies two months ago.

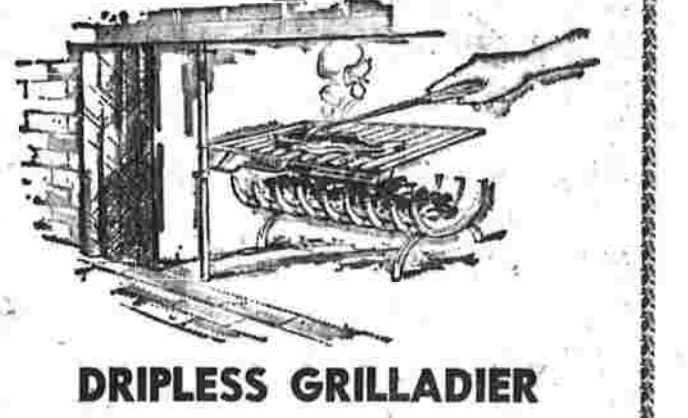

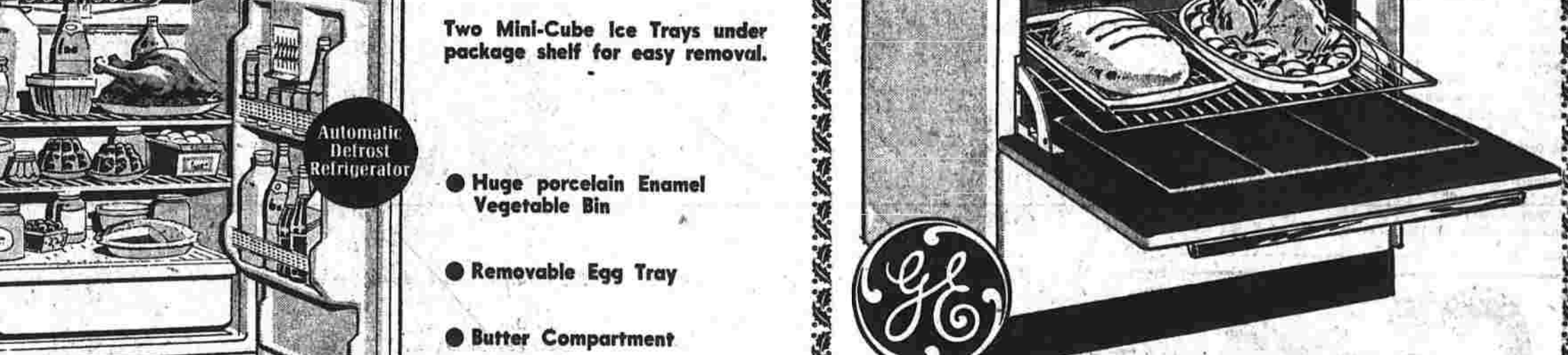

Britain has imposed economic sanctions against Rhodesia but refuses to use force to bring down the Smith regime.

Among the OAU members which have announced they will not break with Britain are two of Rhodesia's neighbors, Zambia and Malawi.

Zambia is dependent on Rhodesia's railways for access to the sea and on the Kariba Dam power station in Rhodesia for the electricity which powers its copper mines.

High-Speed Japanese Train Challenges Airline Traffic

TOKYO (AP) — Japan's super-express electric train is giving domestic airlines the blues.

The train covers the 322 miles between Japan's two biggest cities, Tokyo and Osaka, in three hours 10 minutes.

One month after the Hikari started operating Oct. 1, 1964, with a cautious experimental five-hour schedule, Japan Air Lines suffered a 38 per cent drop in the number of passengers on its Tokyo-Osaka route, compared to the same time the previous year.

Last April the train time was cut to four hours, and another 50 minutes were shaved Nov. 1, reserved only for the Hikari.

The Hikari is so smooth and silent, racing on long jointless rails, that it has surprised and killed several track workers. But not a passenger has been killed or injured.

British officials have no effective measures to counteract the rail service.

Plans to speed up the trip between city center and airport with a helicopter service were dropped because the fare would be double that of a taxi.

The airlines' disadvantage concerns only the Tokyo-Osaka stretch, a relatively short trip. Jets fly from Tokyo to Fukuoka, or to Suvarno in one hour. The express trains take more than 10 hours.

In addition to the 26 Hikari trains, making stops at Nagoya and Kyoto, there are 28 round trips by the same type train, called Kodama — Echo — with a four-hour schedule.

All 800 seats on the Hikari are booked solid.

MANHATTAN SPACE CENTER, whose cowatchers were her husband, the late Dr. Walter M. Schirra Jr., wife of Mr. III, 28, along with wives of the Gemini 6 command pilot, said she had "a feeling I can hardly describe. It was so thrilling," as she watched on television today as the spacecraft was recovered safely.

The other astronaut's wife, Mrs. Thomas F. Stafford, said: "It was just wonderful."

She added that she was "huk-junk" as she watched Stafford step out of the spacecraft hatch onto the deck of the carrier Wasp.

The astronauts had been aboard the Wasp more than an hour before their wives chatted briefly with newsmen.

Both women were surrounded by their children and friends at their homes during re-entry and splashdown. Champagne was being served, and among Mrs. Schirra's visitors were the other six wives of the original seven Mercury astronauts.

Mrs. Schirra and Mrs. Stafford also had remained close to radio and television sets during the historic rendezvous between Gemini 6 and 7. They echoed one another with the comment: "Beautiful!"

Similar vigils were held here by Mrs. Frank Borman and Mrs. James A. Lovell Jr., whose husbands have been gridding the earth since Dec. 4 in Gemini 7.

Keenly interested spectators also were the parents of the Gemini 6 pilot — Mr. and Mrs. Walter M. Schirra Sr. at their home in Point Loma, a San Diego suburb, and Mrs. Mary Ellen Stafford at Weatherford, Okla.

"Thrilled and happy beyond words" was the reaction of Mrs. Borman to the epic rendezvous of the spacecraft. At her side were the Borman's sons Frederick, 14, and Edwin, 12, and her mother, Ruth Bigbee of Tucson, Ariz.

"Needless to say, it was beautiful," said Schirra's wife, pathology work.

Maugham Estate Believed Valued At \$5.6 Million

LONDON (AP) — British newspapers estimated today that author W. Somerset Maugham left an estate of more than \$5.6 million.

Films, plays, television adaptations and reissues of his works are expected to keep royalties flowing into the estate for years.

Maugham died Thursday in his villa in Nice, France, at the age of 81. His phenomenally successful career spanned more than half a century.

His chief beneficiaries are expected to be his companion and secretary, Alan F. Searle; his daughter, Lady Glendevon; and the Royal Literary Fund, which gives grants to writers and their dependents.

Maugham tried to disown his daughter in 1962 and adopt Searle as his son. A French court annulled the adoption two years later and Lady Glendevon announced she had renewed all claims against her father's estate for a payment of \$200,000.

However, much of Maugham's estate is in France and under French law no father can disinherit his children.

Maugham lived most of his life in France. He reportedly also had assets in the United States, Britain and Switzerland.

Among his assets in France is his villa, La Mauresque, which he reportedly bought in 1927 for \$30,000. With its surrounding acres on Cap Ferrat, it may now be worth as much as \$1.4 million.

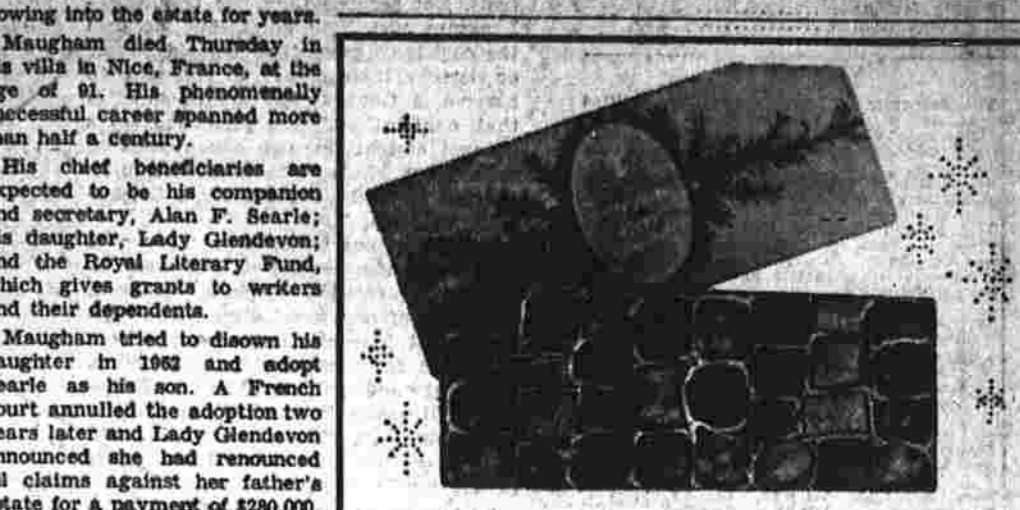
Three years ago he sold his collection of Impressionist paintings at auction in London for more than \$1.4 million.

His body will be cremated in Marseille and his ashes buried in the grounds of Kings School, at Canterbury, England, on Wednesday. He was educated at the school, which is on the grounds of Canterbury Cathedral.

Break in Dam Threatens Farms Near San Diego

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP)—Five big pumps have gone to work to reduce the threat of a break in an earth fill dam that could loose nearly 300 million gallons of water onto a border area.

The pumps were moved into Mexico from the United States Thursday to relieve the threat to about 2½ square miles of farmland in adjacent South San Diego.

Officials fear that the rising waters will break the 106-foot high dam, sending a flood crashing down the canyon and on to the U.S. side.

The earth has sagged and water is seeping through, authorities say.

About 30 families on the U.S. side have been evacuated because of the flood threat, but a few others have stayed despite warnings from the Mexican side.

The dam does not threaten structures on the Mexican side. Officials at the Navy's Great Field north of the area have moved 80 helicopters to North Island Naval Air Station as a precautionary measure.

Scientists Say Moon Coated by Fine Sand

SUNNYVALE, Calif. (AP)—The moon's surface probably is a loose layer of fine sandlike material. The stuff is at least 10 feet and possibly tens of meters deep.

But it won't cause any significant trouble for American astronauts when they attempt moon landings in their Apollo spacecraft, say Donald E. Gault and William L. Quaide, scientists at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

Compared with the tremendous speeds of meteors hurtling in from space, the secondary debris fragments move at very low velocities.

Gault, Quaide, and other NASA colleagues closely duplicated the geometry of the moon craters with low-velocity projectiles hitting into ground targets.

An accidental finding convinced Gault and Quaide that a spacecraft landing on the moon likely would not sink deeply into the loose granular surface.

New Teaching Aids Used To Help Individual Students

By ED FREEMAN Rockville High School's newest teacher is seven feet tall, 20 inches square around the waist, and so has not cost could read 300 words per minute in a book written on the seventh grade level, and comprehend about 90 per cent of what he read.

He, like other students in the course, attend a one-period class three to five times a week.

Today, after just four months, reading speed is now 600 words per minute, reading tenth grade books, and he comprehends 90 to 100 per cent.

Mrs. Roberts explained that not all of her children are from so-called "homes." Some, because of home conditions, are culturally or socially deprived, some come from good homes with intelligent parents, but have been conditioned too much or are simply ignored.

In addition to Mrs. Roberts, three other teachers led reading and English classes for students not working at the average level.

Also, reading and study skills are taught after school on two afternoons and on Saturday mornings. Students participating in the program are given special attention; some are enrolled in college-bound courses.

As for her regular pupils, Mrs. Roberts explained, "These are average kids. They are not subnormal. They just haven't had the advantages of most kids, or they haven't been exposed to academic environment. Some can't even study that home, because of problems there."

Students assigned to Mrs. Roberts are not kept from regular classes. Her students usually would be in study hall.

Mrs. Roberts' regular classes, limited to six students, limit the school's capacity.

Her lab contains six stalls, containing special audio-visual equipment and materials. The equipment is furnished by the state.

Audio-visual equipment is utilized by the school. Closed circuit television was acquired recently, and a specialist to guide its use was hired this year.

Fagan said that one administrative problem is to get teachers "thinking of using the machines. Some are slow to accept the concept, but when they see the value of it, then they go along."

In the South, American aircraft aimed at Viet Cong bases claimed 24 sampans were sunk, seven of them motorized. The latest outbreak of terrorism in Saigon came despite maximum security precautions. The blast occurred half a block from a U.S. Army intelligence compound where Viet Cong bombs injured four American Thursday.

The U.S. Army's 101st Airborne Brigade sent a noisy birthday greeting of its own to Viet Cong. On a patrol near Ben Cat, 30 miles north of Saigon, a battalion discovered a Viet Cong munitions dump with 4,000 pounds of explosives. Battalion demolition men poured the ammunition into a large hole and exploded it. The blast shook the ground for miles around in the heavily forested Viet Cong area and sent up a tower of smoke.

Officials also gave a footnote to the story of the little militia group of My Triang, which has been active since the Communist seizure of power. To the original body count of 10 Viet Cong killed in the assault were added 14 more Communist dead. The Viet Cong had forced villagers to bury these 24 men in the area.

Officials in Saigon expected more of terrorism to continue well into Christmas week, although the Communists might follow peace practice and remain quiet on the anniversary day. A police official said maximum precautions were being taken against the terrorist campaign, but he added: "You simply cannot search every Vietnamese in Saigon."

All streets around key military installations and U.S. buildings in the city of more than 4 million have been closed in a nonessential traffic. But officials expect the terrorism wave to continue well into the Christmas season. Terrorists struck twice Thursday night. A traffic policeman killed four Vietnamese civilians in a Viet Cong ambush. A grenade and a Vietnamese soldier's police guard was shot in the stomach.

A police found a flag of the National Liberation Front, the Viet Cong's political command, in a street with a bomb hidden underneath. The bomb failed to go off. U.S. Air Force officials in Saigon disclosed that Communist MIG jets, including some from Mexico, have been quietly testing American air defenses in Viet Nam and those of U.S. 7th Fleet ships in the South China Sea.

They said the prowling MIGs keep far enough away to avoid interception by U.S. jets and missiles. But the officials did not rule out the possibility of a Communist strike in the future. U.S. warplanes have been virtually unopposed by enemy aircraft over North Viet Nam since the ground fire has been heavy. The officials indicated some concern that the Communist planes, although outdated by U.S. standards, might try a demonstration at the big air base at Da Nang, 80 miles northeast of Saigon, on the 17th Parallel, Viet Nam, which includes the nuclear-powered carrier Enterprise.

MILLIONS OF ICE BALLS HONG KONG (AP) — The Hong Kong government estimated today that several million plastic ice balls were exported to the United States this year. The ice balls were banned in a number of states and cities in the United States and Canada because of their contamination with lead and other toxic substances. Officials of the Japanese-Mexican operation said the daily production will be 80 cars worth of ice balls.

Domingo Rioters Stone U.S. Convoy

SANTO DOMINGO, Dominican Republic (AP) — Small bands of rioters stoned the main east-west communications route across Santo Domingo today and stoned an American Army convoy crossing Duarte Bridge. There were no casualties. Except for the area around the bridge, a wave of strikes violence that erupted Thursday appeared to be dying down.

Moving without interference, the bands of ragged dressed youths threw up barricades across the east-west traffic line designated "military supply route" by the U.S. armed forces there. The rioters linked western Santo Domingo with its eastern suburbs and airports across Duarte Bridge. American troops remained at their quarters in the downtown area. One U.S. and one Brazilian company are stationed in what once was the rebel stronghold in the heart of the business district.

Military Police were turning back other U.S. Army vehicles seeking to enter the center of the city. There was no explosion for this but it was believed to be a precaution to avert incidents in the downtown district where the situation was nearly normal. Stores were open but traffic appeared thinner than usual.

U.S. forces moved Thursday to meet the rioters who stoned their jeeps and other vehicles. City garbage collectors, who had been on strike, moved in to clean up the litter.
