High School Yule Concert Done Well

By JOHN GRUBER The annual High School Christmas Concert and Carol Sing was held last night before a near capacity audience in Bailey Auditorium. It was a thoroughly enjoyable evening, and the audience would probably have overflowed the hall had there not been another attraction at Tilling Junior High at the same time.

The program was calculated to display the varied musical activities at MHS and it did just that. We had singing by the Sophomore, Junior, and Senior Chorus; the orchestra had been reactivated and played very well; there was a new group called "The Bandoleers" selected from the more proficient members of the band, and there was a still smaller brass choir, both of which sounded very well.

Instrumental offerings were under the direction of James E. Natale, new to the system, who gave every evidence of being an excellent musician and pedagogue. Robert C. Vater, head of the high school music department, directed the vocal offerings which sounded extremely well on the whole.

Things got under way with music by the Bandoleers who offered a number of selections ranging from a special arrangement of Adeste Fideles to a Jingle Bells Rhapsody. The brass choir was heard during this portion of the program in an "Allegro" from Henry Purcell's "King Arthur." Everything went well, and intonation was better than usual with high school groups.

The brass choir was heard later in the program in an Antiphonal by Gabriel, arranged by Anthony. This proved educational even to me. I was struck by the similarity in sound to music by Lassus and Schuetz, but I had never encountered the composer Gabriel before. Looking him up, I found he was a pupil of Lassus and that Schuetz was one of his pupils in turn.

The Round Table Singers, long a feature of these concerts, sounded very well. There was good tone, nice diction, and consistent musicality. Two excerpts from Tchaikovsky's "Nutcracker Suite" proved especially effective, particularly since they were not heard in school works and must have been difficult to sing. There was likewise an effective four-hand piano accompaniment to this, played by Carol Lawrence and Diane Asvestas, who together with Lynn Nettleton provided accompaniments throughout the evening.

The orchestra, revived under Mrs. Natale, played Three Songs for Christmas and excerpts from Humperdinck's "Hansel and Gretel." This latter went very well and offers some difficult parts for strings which were negotiated with a surprising degree of assurance.

The choir, under Mr. Vater, offered a well chosen selection of music ranging from Praetorius to the director's wife, Roberta Peck Vater. Her "Christmas Eve" was a thoroughly well-finished opus with no particular pretensions to greatness. Of the numerous offerings I enjoyed the Praetorius and the Shepherd's Chorus from Amahl and the Night visitors the most. This however was a purely subjective reaction for there was little to choose in actual performance, since everything went very well.

The program closed in the customary manner with audience and choir joining in Christmas carols.

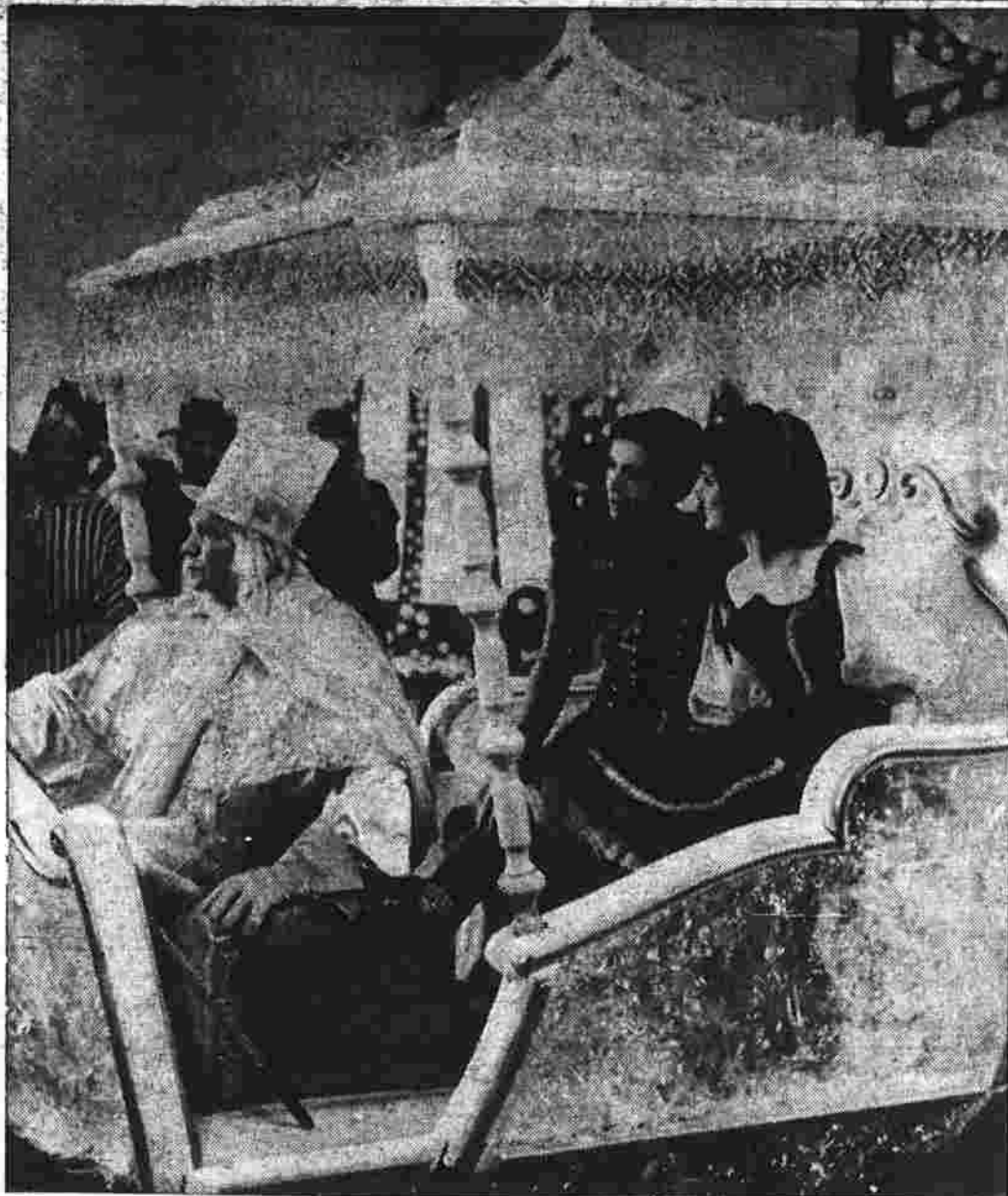

Mercy in the Jungle

A dangerous mission to rescue wildlife threatened with starvation and drowning in the jungles of Surinam is the subject of "Operation Gwamba," Sunday evening at 6 on CBS.

The broadcast focuses on John Walsh, the young Bostonian who heads a 42-man native task force engaged in the operation.

Walsh, a 24-year-old official of the Massachusetts Society for the Protection of Animals, has rescued some 9,000 animals since the project's start in August 1964.

The creatures, many in the last stages of starvation and marooned on high ground or clinging to trees, have included deer, anteaters, jaguars, bushmaster snakes, boa constrictors, monkeys, sloths and countless others left behind in the jungles as waters backed up after the construction of a hydroelectric dam on the upper Surinam River.

The flooded area covers approximately 870 square miles. Walsh's rescue mission is expected to be completed early in 1966.

"Operation Gwamba" (gwamba means animals in the native taki-taki language) follows Walsh and his skilled helpers into the jungles in power-driven dugouts. Fanning out in the dugouts, Walsh and his men wait for the animals to be flushed out by hunting dogs. The color broadcast follows the action as the men capture the terrified creatures. The newest scientific equipment, including tranquilizer guns, is used in the rescue operation.

Life at the base camp to which the animals are brought before being released is depicted on the broadcast. A segment shows Walsh operating on a jaguar; another highlight is a sequence in which Walsh shows his helpers how to handle a poisonous bushmaster and a boa constrictor.

Walsh tells how he recruited his men from among the "bravest and greatest hunters in the district," by educating them to the need of saving rather than killing animals. Walsh, who learned the native language in four months, had worked with 236 bush people before arriving at his present band of 42.

Before Baron Hugo Van Lawick met Jane Goodall to photograph "Miss Goodall and the Wild Chimpanzees" in Africa, a matchmaking friend told the bachelor Baron that Miss Goodall would make him a good wife.

"But she's too tall," Van Lawick said of Miss Goodall.

Miss Goodall's mother, meanwhile, was recommending the Baron as a possible husband to her daughter.

"But he's too short," Miss Goodall objected.

And so, in 1964, Miss Goodall and Baron Van Lawick, both five feet, seven inches tall, were wed. Their first professional product, "Miss Goodall and the Wild Chimpanzees," will be shown in color, Wednesday, evening at 7:30 on CBS.

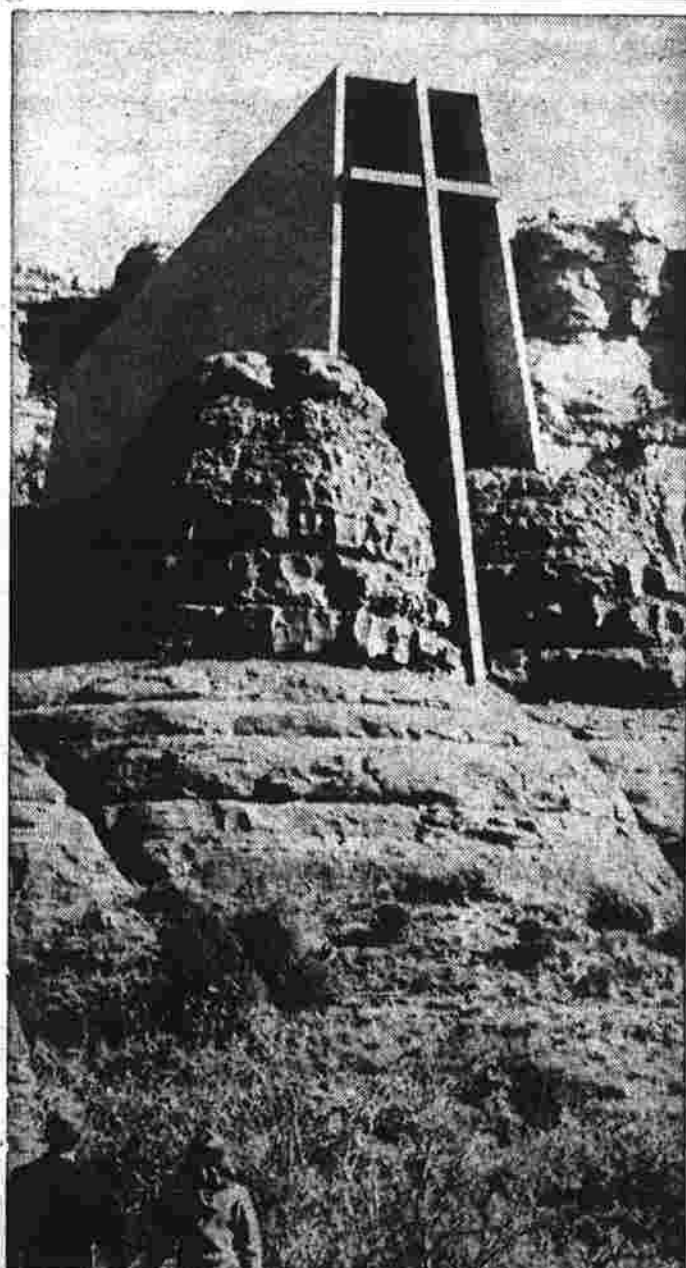
