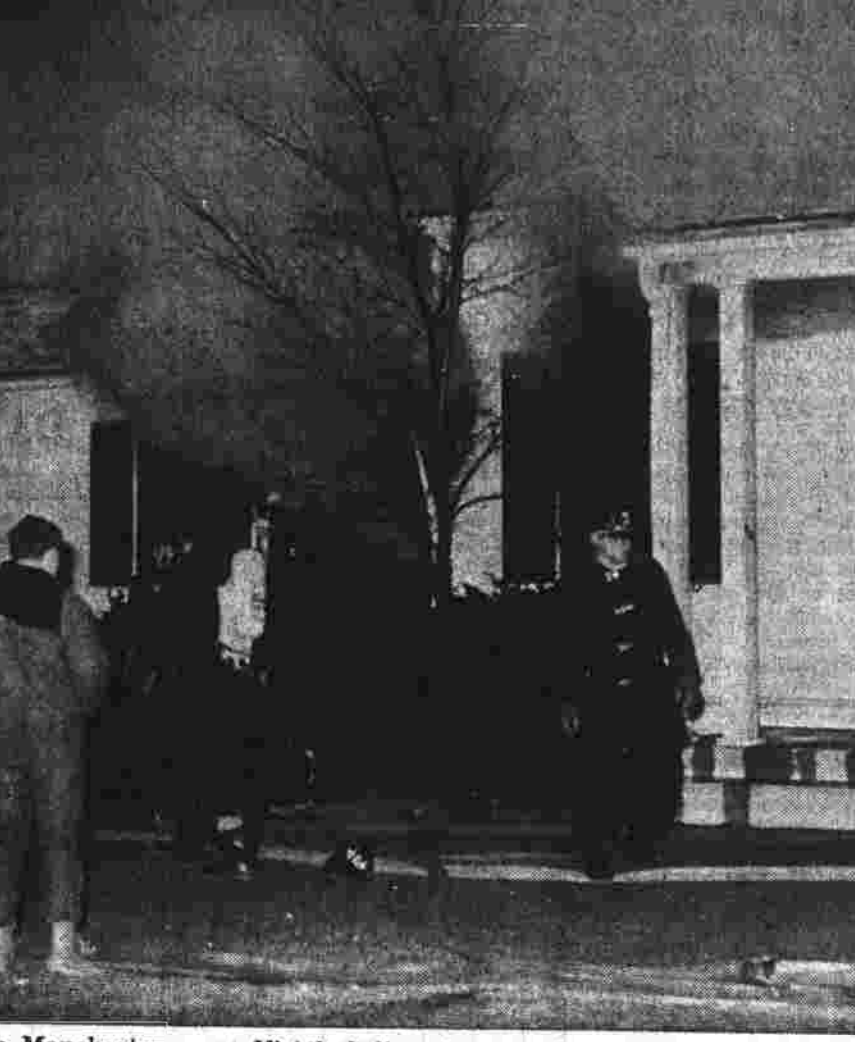

Pinney Raps 'Influence' on Proposal 2

HARTFORD (AP) — State Republican Chairman A. Scarle Pinney criticized Gov. John Dempsey Tuesday for condemning the state highway commissioner's effort to influence the vote of highway employees.

Dempsey "has put himself in the position of continuing direct political interference in the state's election process by one of his department heads," Pinney said.

The governor was asked Tuesday morning by newsmen what he thought of highway commissioner Howard E. Ives' Dec. 8 letter expressing opposition to Proposal Two in the Dec. 34 constitutional referendum.

"Certainly Commissioner Ives is privileged to express to the members of his department his views on an issue which he feels would have a vital effect on the highway operations in this state," Dempsey replied.

The governor noted that Ives had made no secret of his opposition to Proposal Two, an amendment which would have placed the burden of proving the "necessity" of land condemnation on land-labing agencies such as the highway department.

Ives' controversial letter said, "In the judgment of the administrative heads of the department, it is in the best interest of the state to oppose adoption of Proposal Two."

"It is proper for Commissioner Ives to use state funds in an effort to intimidate state employees into supporting a position that the commissioner happens to take?"

COMMISSION PLANNED LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — A Methodist Appalachian Commission is planning to coordinate the church's work in the economically depressed mountain area.

The Tories divided over the Labor government's Rhodesia policy. And Wilson's announcement that he plans to meet Soviet leaders in Moscow in February alienated critics of his own party who accuse him of too much support for the American stand in Viet Nam.

Then 50 Tory members defied Conservative leader Edward Heath and forced a vote against oil sanctions. The majority of the Tories abstained and the motion was crushed 276-50.

State to Get 'Rubber Plantation Wars' New Label for Fighting

WASHINGTON (AP) — An \$84.9 million program of airport construction and improvement in New England has been recommended by the Federal Aviation agency.

It is part of a five-year, \$1.2 billion nationwide plan to build 887 landing facilities — 762 airports, 124 heliports and one seaplane base in Alaska — and improvements for 3,219 facilities.

The FAA said its projections are based on a projected increase in both airline passengers and in private aviation.

Massachusetts projects led the list with \$44.8 million, followed by Connecticut, \$16.6 million; Maine, \$11.7 million; Rhode Island, \$6 million; New Hampshire, \$5.7 million; and Vermont \$4 million.

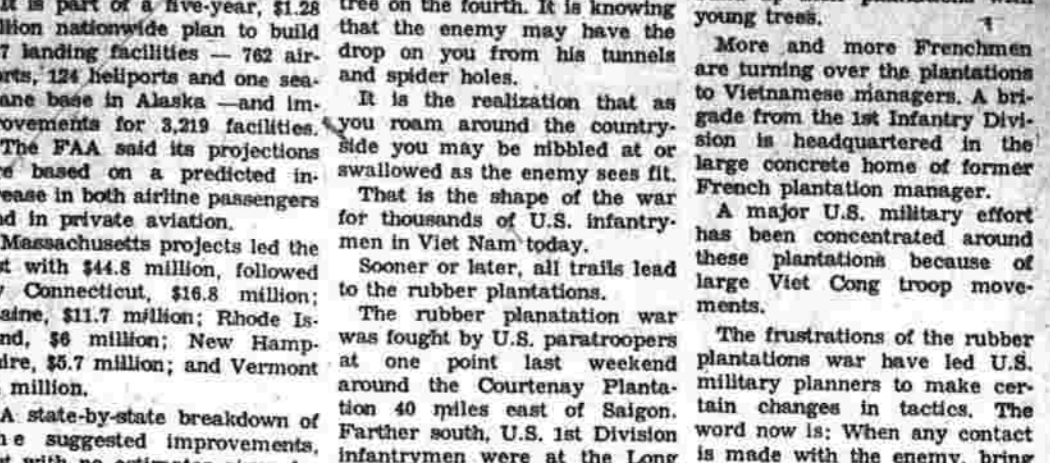

The Dangers of Truce

One must try to understand the reluctance of the Johnson Administration to get involved in the treacherous business of any Christmas truce in the fighting in Vietnam.

The Administration from its point of view, is scared to death of what the potential influence of a touch of peace might be.

A momentary spasm of relaxation in combat conditions even a day or so in honor of a great religious observance, can run the risk of wasting all the grim months and lives the Administration has spent in building up its own unrelenting toughness in the Vietnam war.

It, through its professionals in the art of waging war, has been training our young men in Vietnam to kill and to get the killed. It has good reason to be satisfied with the patriotism and courage with which young Americans in uniform have been taking all this as their duty.

And that, of course, turns into one of the reasons why the Administration is timid about even a limited Christmas truce. Having achieved the hard stance, why risk it? Heaving steeled ourselves to war, why permit ourselves any position of weakness?

Why risk the danger that a little peace might become contagious? Why expose people already in a state of tension to an illogical and irrational few moments of illusion?

Beyond what a Christmas truce might do to some of the resolutions built with such care and cost on our side, there is the possibility that it might give the enemy the impression that we have grown soft and prone to the temptations of peace.

So, when we prove reluctant to consider or take a Christmas truce, that is really because we think that in the hard-fought and the way to save lives in the end. To let a gap creep into our resolution to do the killing that must be done, to give the enemy the slightest suspicion that we would like to stop fighting before we have made our point—that would be, in the logic of this conducting a war, a folly. And that is why, if the Johnson Administration does allow the guns to fall silent, and the planes not to take off with their bombs for a few hours at the Christmas season, it will do so with the greatest fear and reluctance.

That is the way it is. And the less certain the administration conducting a war is of the amount of national resources it has behind it, the more it is uneasy about its own righteousness and about its success in persuading others of that righteousness, the greater is the necessary fear of any self-demonstrations. One can sympathize with Washington's agony, as it tries to decide how to handle the lured temptation to a few hours of Christmas truce.

A Place To Sit Down

There was, on Main St. the other day, a sight to delight all the good people who cooperated in the establishment of those fine new planter-bench combinations.

What we happened to see was the first Christmas shopper, who, burdened down with happy packages, and out of breath with the new planter-bench combinations, decided to make use of one of the new benches. The impression was that she had come to the bench just in time. Certainly, we don't think she has ever had a more grateful enjoyment of the simple pleasure of being able to sit down.

Welcome, then, to the civilized and comfortable idea of having some place on Main St. where the weary shopper can pause a moment or two to catch breath, or rest his packages, or consult the list, or recommission his acquaintances, or wait for the rest of the family to come along.

This is one of the especially appealing touches in the new planter-bench combinations which has appeared and declared its pleasing addition to the Main St. scene before the first tree has come into leaf, or the ground cover has been added to the decorative of the planter.

The new planters, with their touch of eye appeal, with their touch of human comfort in their invitation to all Main St. to relax, just a shade, and be a pleasanter place to stop in, might be viewed, we think, as a gracious and symbolic link between the spirit of the

Manchester past— that friendly and charming village we once were quite naturally—and the work plans for the Manchester future which emphasize the application of that spirit of the past to a more modern design and arrangement of our downtown facilities. The planter seen in advance takes of what renewal could be like, and they hold the advantage, being portable, of being quite ready to take their own appropriate place in the renewal itself when that arrives.

Meanwhile, for the moment, it is pleasure enough and significance enough to have one momentarily burdened Christmas shopper be able to find a place to sit down.

The Best Part Of The Cycle

There are cycles in everything, even in the great American institution of the Christmas card list. And the present turn of the cycle, a little more definite in the last few years, is toward an eventual state of affairs in which people would send Christmas cards only to people they really like or to people who especially appreciate receiving them.

The opposite peak of the cycle was reached, by our clinical observations, about seven or eight years ago. That was, we think, the height of the great Christmas card escalation. The object of this escalation was to receive a higher number of cards each succeeding year.

The recognized procedure for doing this was to engage in a mutual augmentation of lists. You preserved the record of how many cards from whom came and received in past Christmases, and made that your basic mailing list for the current Christmas. You depended upon everyone else to do the same, year after year. And, each year, you made a personal special additions to the list, with the object of snaring new potential card senders into the exchange.

And many a valuable asset in the card race would come from various commercial interests, who made more friends than they know when they added their thought offerings to the growing profusion.

The great status victory in the Christmas card scramble belonged to the family which could claim that it needed nothing less than a bushel basket to store just one year's cards until it came time to use them in making up the list for the next.

Now, it seems, the average basket can be a bit smaller, and the list grows yearly a little shorter. Some families are even dropping out of the race entirely for something they call a sabbatical. Others are beginning to send cards only to people with whom they are on first name basis. Some people, remembering when they were in the most earnest of receiving a Christmas card, have been trying to make up a new kind of list, dominated by those who are so fortunate as to be very young, or so unfortunately as to be invalids.

Through all this, President Johnson has imposed a blanket of strict diplomatic silence. With one minor exception, the amazing fact is that no American has talked to Sukarno or to Gen. Nasution since the military took over in early October. No offer has come from Washington to resume U.S. aid. Sargent Shriver's Peace Corpsmen, withdrawn last summer, which are not going back now.

Nor does President Johnson plan any immediate change in this unprecedented U.S. policy of hands off. Keeping in close touch with developments in Jakarta through a tightly-written weekly memorandum from the State Department, the President is fully aware that the slightest gesture of U.S. interest—of expression of U.S. pleasure at the turn of events—could backfire against us.

While the U.S. mutely watches as the steady progress toward the destruction of all Western influence in the Communist dominated area, the Communist disidents hiding out in central Java, north Sumatra, and Bali. This is indeed one of the choice ironies of the revolution. Soviet arms are being used to shoot down the Communist disidents.

But the revolution is rich with ironies. For example, although supposedly built from the ground up with a tightly-

WASHINGTON — Without lifting a finger, the United States has now become the beneficiary in Indonesia of political dividends undreamed of three short months ago.

The U. S. Embassy staff in Jakarta is now reduced from 1,000 to 100, the Peace Corps has been withdrawn, and the last bit-and-pieces of a once profligate foreign aid program are being cleaned out. Thus, the Johnson administration has been no more than a passive bystander in the anti-Communist revolution sweeping the world's fifth largest country (population: 185 million).

And yet this sudden U. S. inactivity (following several years of intensive but vain diplomatic courtship) has been accompanied by the greatest foreign policy defeat in the 16-year-old history of the United States' expansionist policy: the collapse of the Peking-dominated PKI (Communist Party of Indonesia), but that is just one of the dividends that the U. S. policy of intentional non-intervention luckily has fallen heir to.

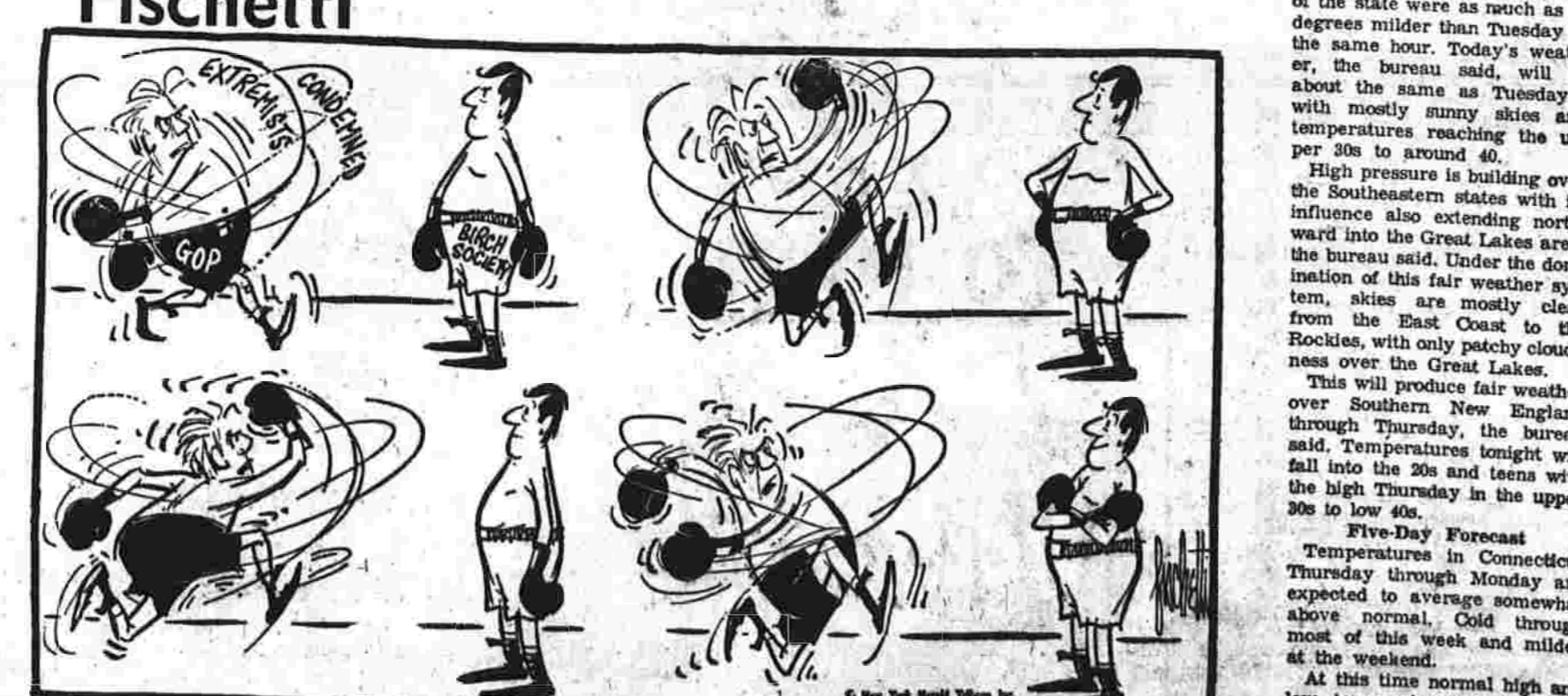
Better Anticommunism

We believe that effective anticommunism in the world will be strengthened by the latest decision of the United States Supreme Court. The court ruled unanimously with one dissent that a member of the Communist Party cannot be required to register with the government unless he chooses to do so, the court said, would be for such a person to open himself to various rights of the government, such as the right to investigate his activities, and to deny self-incrimination, that is, to deny against him.

This decision upholding traditional American freedoms will, we are certain, strengthen the anticommunist strength of the United States abroad. It will help destroy the often false picture of America as a country so obsessed with anticommunism that it is willing to deny fundamental freedoms in its struggle against that ideology at home and abroad.

This picture of America, which grew to immense proportions during the era of Sen. Joseph McCarthy, is felt by many to have lent far more aid and comfort to world communism than the actions of the American Communist Party itself. The court's ruling will help restore confidence in the United States as a land which, while firmly dedicated to repelling the Communist threat, nevertheless is determined to do so democratically.

Government Units Abandon Strongpoint Near Da Nang

By JOHN T. WHEELER SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — U. S. Marines and government troops have abandoned a district headquarters and strategic strongpoint only 28 miles from the Da Nang air base, the most heavily guarded U.S. installation in Viet Nam.

The retreat from the center of the town, under heavy Communist pressure for more than a year, was announced Tuesday when government troops were pulled out.

The town sits at the head of three valleys which are key military routes like arrows pointing toward the center of the town. Highway No. 1 and Highway No. 2, which lead to the Quang Tin Province.

The evacuation follows the retreat of Operation Harvest Moon by Vietnamese and American troops near Viet Nam, a Communist stronghold in the center of the town. The operation led to heavy casualties in two Vietnamese battalions and one U.S. Marine company. Viet Cong losses were given as 420.

The official reason for abandoning the strongpoint, ordinarily manned by two companies of marines, was that it was too remote and difficult to supply. 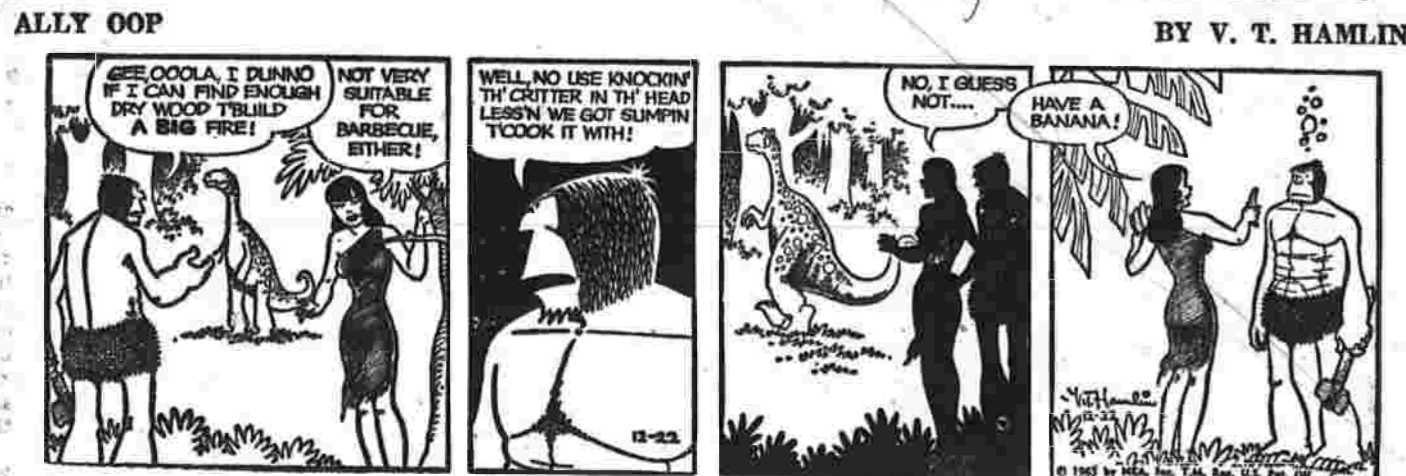

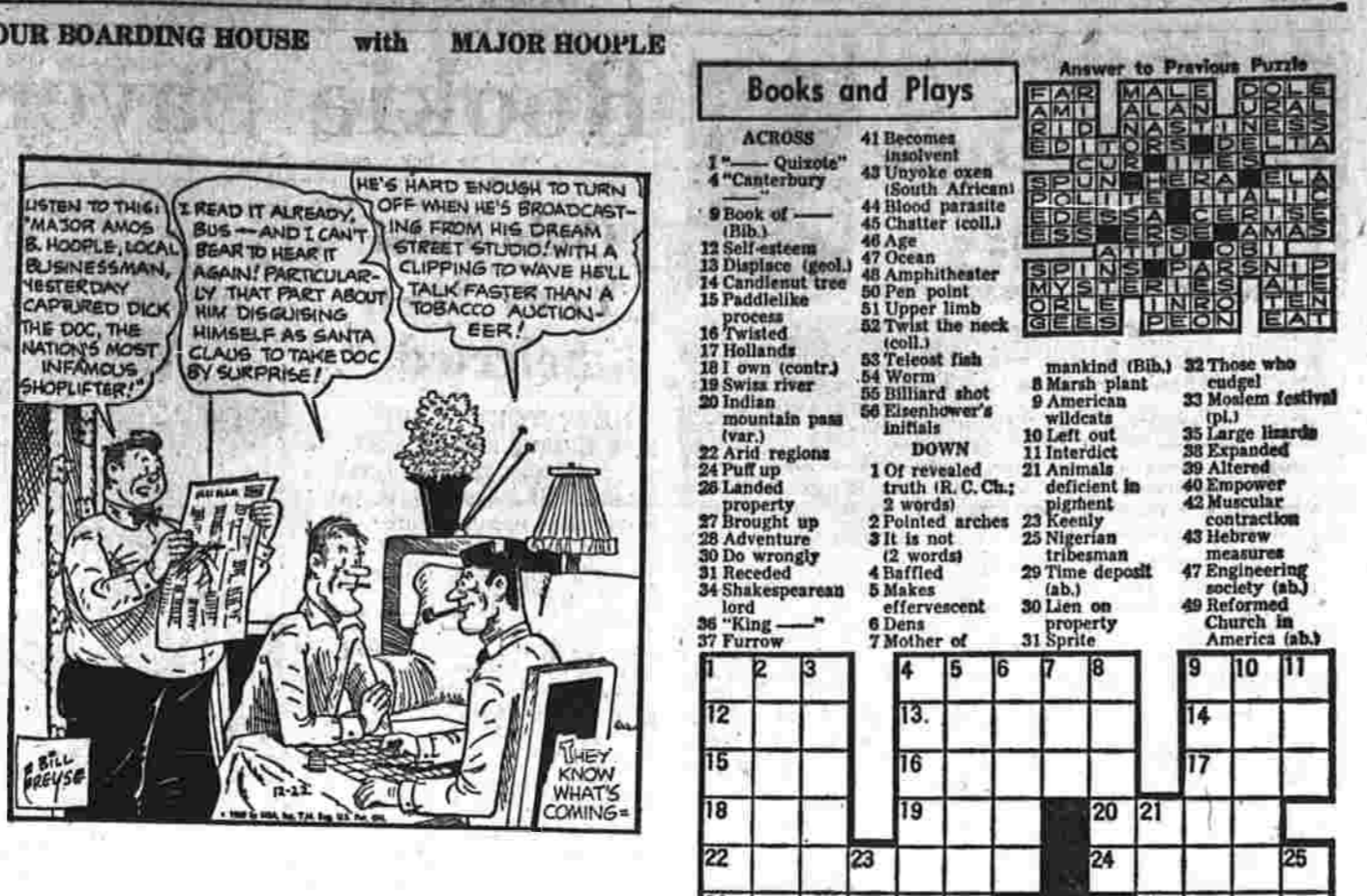

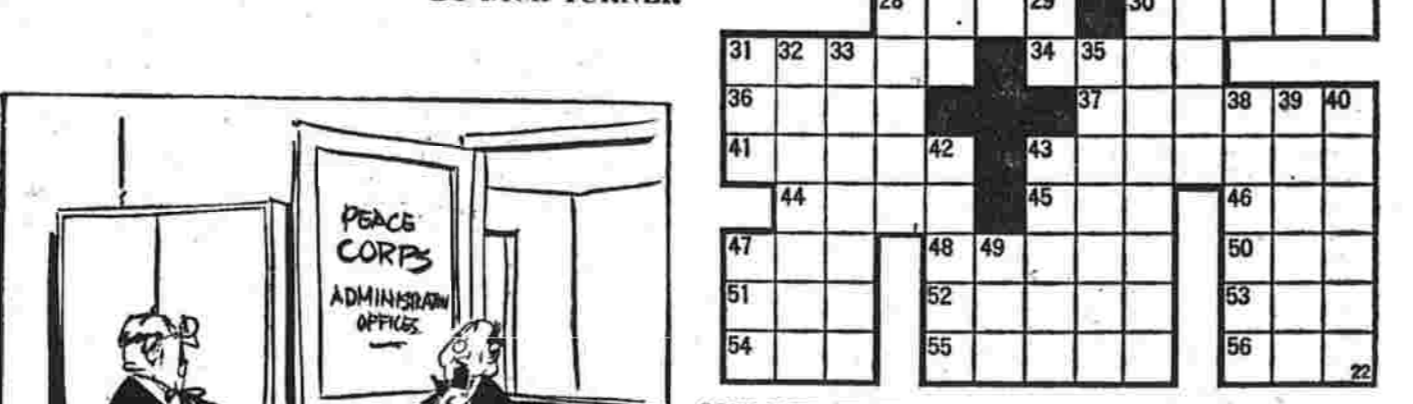
