The Wreath Makers Blessed are the makers of wreaths, for they give gifts which are beyond

People are amazed, and moved, year after year, by the particular combination of qualities it takes to make a wreath maker. First, and most vital of all, is the

capacity to settle quietly down, in the middle of the busiest and most frantic period of the year, and begin the making of a wreath in the right frame of mind. For only the wreath maker who begins by assuming that he or she has all of time for that one wreath has a chance of making even a physical finish of the task, let alone getting an artistic result. The individual who can achieve that mood can make many wreaths, all of distinction, in the time it takes the more unruly mind to louse up one.

Pardon the introduction of such a harsh word into a discussion of such a genteel activity. But that is just what the wrong psychology does to a poten-

There is much required, beyond the mood. It all comes out as integral part of the product. There is that accuracy of eye which creates the general circle, which should be perfect in the artistic rather than the geometric sense. After the basic conformity of circum-

ference and fullness has been achieved, the artist proceeds to weave in those delicate aberrational embellishments which add character and warmth. 




