A Russian Move

If it proves to be an immediate thing, the news that Russia is sending a high level mission to Hanoi is something that lies balanced precariously between the good and the bad possibilities.

It can be good news if it-ties in with one set of theories and signs. The possibilities this way go like this: The Russians have been saying repeatedly that nothing could be done about negotiations in Vietnam until the United States stopped its bombing of North Vietnam. At this precarious moment, this United States bombing has been halted since Christmas. The announcement of the Russian mission to Hanoi, then, may indicate that Russia is nov moving to bring its pressure and influence to bear upon Hanoi in the direction of truce.

Beyond the immediate possibility of truce, however, the American interest in Russian closeness to Hanoi is considerable. We would rather have the Russians dominant there, even if it means the Russians are the chief suppliers of aid to North Vietnam in the war we are fighting with North Vietnam over South Vietnam, than have the Chinese be dominant in Hanoi.

This is because we theorize that the Russians really want to limit the war in Southeast Asia, while we assume that st China is all in favor of having it drag on and on, and keep dragging us into itself more and more. These are the positive theories about the Russian move to get closer to

The negative theory doesn't find many takers at the moment, but should be given a strong chance of being valid just the same. Moscow may be proceeding according to what it can view of long range American policies, not short range truce possibilities. And its drawing closer to Hanoi may not be the move of intervention in the cause of peace, but the move of acceptance of responsibility for assistance in long range war. It could even be, at the worst, that Moscow goes to Hanoi not to edge Peking out of Hanoi, but to join Peking there. The reason such a possibility should be given strong emphasis is that it would seem almost an inevitable development if the situation in Southeast Asia should continue to progress toward a total engagement.

For immediate American thinking and policy, it doesn't happen to make very much difference which theory, the positive or the negative, we apply to the announcement of the Russian mission. Either way, it serves our own national interest-as well as the cause of civilization-to be sure that our own policy and behavior are not inside any straitjacket which denies choice to ourselves as well as to China and Russia.

Paying People To Think

Some of the results of governmental hiring of outside private research have been a little bit on the obvious and ridiculous side, as the Wall Street Journal notes when it chronicles how the Commerce Department at Washington paid an accounting firm the modest sum of \$95,000 to find out why shipping rates are lower on goods imported to the United States than on exports from the United States. The answer proved to be something very simple and obvious: that it costs more to put cargo into a vessel than it does to unload it. simply because one operation is more complicated and time-consuming than

And there was the celebrated report of another private research firm, to the Labor Department, that the main reason industry was going in for automation was to achieve larger production at smaller cost.

But the fact that an occasional piece of research may seem to be foolishly ordered and may seem to give a foolish answer to a foolish request does not alter the sad cogency of the main reason for the modern growth of the practice of government at all levels to seek outside help whenever it feels the need for deep and special study of a problem.

Labor Secretary Wirtz, down in Washington, makes this defense of the employment of outside research: "We are trying to get the ideas of those who have more time to think than we have."

That, we think, points the way to a very sad truth. It is that government is much less able than private business to give its executives and employes "time to think." The typical government executive is belabored and throttled down by red tape, by a remorseless tide of obligations both important and trivial to the public which employs him and to the political system by which he has come to office, and by the simple necessity to keep routine functions somewhere near an efficiency level. He has little time left over for asking himself those elemental why questions which lead into the fresh look and the newdirectioned analysis and perhaps into the logic and theory and practical logistics of change and improvement. It is, of course, directly in response to this condition of the executive in government that the proliferation of private research firms has taken place They dare proclaim that they hire people just to think. And they dare charge for thought and research. And, although they sometimes merely report the obvious, often enough they get underneath the obvious and come up with something only people who had time to think could discover. Some day, perhaps, the public will be willing to pay its own officials, directly, to think, and see that they get a chance to.

As faithfully as the crucial incident can be reconstructed it went like this. Joe the Bartender was about to squeeze a raw egg into Dennehy's beer. Just as his fingers were about to crush the egg, the egg slipped from his fingers and dropped into a nearby cup of very hot coffee. It was several moments before the egg was cool enough to remove. The Bartender gave it an idle squeezing gesture, to see if it might still go in the beer, and it slipped from his hand again. This time it hit solidly on the bar, and the shell cracked, but nothing ran out. Tapping idly, the Bartender unsheathed the new delicacy, doused it with a

little salt and pepper and anchovy paste and took a bite out of it, all in a sort of absentminded experimentation. In fact, he was telling one of his old jokes while he did it. Then, of course, there spread over his countenance that unatterable expression of gastronomic delight which told the waiting world that a new delicacy, to be known henceforth as the boiled egg, had been born, just in time to become the celebrated novelty for the biggest dinner party of the 1965 holiday season in the world's most sophisticated city.

Where Manly Art Ends

The last General Assembly enacted a law banning professional boxing in this State, at least until such time as this brutal sport, surrounded as it has been by unsavory characters, is placed under Federal control. The Assembly drew wide-spread praise for this act, little if any censure or criticism.

Side effects from this law now are making themselves felt, and giving rise to some questions. The next General Assembly, in our opinion, should be both swift and decisive in answering the queries thus posed.


