Appeals Board Denies Rt. 30 Service Station

Objections voiced by 15 Vernon builders Fred Ellow persons figured in the rejection of a proposed Rt. 30 gas station by the zoning board of appeals this week.

The objectors voiced their feelings at a meeting Tuesday night. The station was proposed by Eldridge and Celia Yost, of Hilltop Dr., on property they own on Rt. 30 at Vernon Ave.

Yost now has a machine shop at the site, and the station would have been added to the property.

One of the objectors, Charles Lanz, who has abutting property, appeared with Atty. Robert Kabin, who told the appeals board that the area is zoned for unit development (such as shopping centers) and that a gas station would be a hazard to the area.

Other objectors stressed the safety problem of the station, which would emit from its station, a drainage problem and feared land devaluation.

In rejecting the Yosts' application, the board stated that sufficient hardship was not shown that a gas station would be in accordance with the intent of the zoning in the area.

Another potentially controversial application, also involving a service station, was withdrawn before the meeting by Val Fiano, who was withdrawing the application for a gas station on the Howard Johnson restaurant.

Edwin M. Converse, of Ellington, had his application to continue to use used cars approved. Converse leases the Shell gas station across from Howard Johnson.

Converse's station manager, Douglas Small, explained that a six month temporary permit had been granted last year and the application actually is an extension.

South Windsor 1965 Business Building Hits \$2,793,225; New High

Commercial and industrial activity in South Windsor during 1965 reached a record high, with permits for construction valued at \$2,793,225 being issued by the town building department.

This is the first year in the history of the town that the value of commercial and industrial growth has surpassed the value of new dwelling units.

Donald McLaughlin, town building inspector, reports the 1965 total for all permits amounts to \$2,844,918.80, and reflects the largest single year of construction growth the town has ever had.

During the year, fewer dwelling permits were issued than had been in the last nine years. Dwelling permits totaling \$2,692,000 were issued for 151 new dwellings.

Particularly impressive was the gain in durable goods fabrication, the department said. Transportation equipment, machinery, electrical equipment and fabricated metals showed higher gains than they have in recent years.

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) - Comedian Bob Hope flew out of Viet Nam today after a successful Christmas tour for U.S. troops. But he left behind a ribbing he did not know about from his longtime sidekick, Bing Crosby.

HELICO Buys Land Easement
