Immeasurably In His Debt

During the administration of Governor John Lodge, when Richard Martin held the position of Director of the State Water Commission, certain policies being pursued by his department were being subjected to circuitous criticism by a prominent Connecticut citizen, who chose to direct his complaints to the Governor. When Governor Lodge reacted to this complaint by showing it to the Commission Director. the latter in turn reacted by asking Governor Lodge to try to appoint the critic to the next vacancy on the State Water Commission, whose employe the

There did come an opportunity for the appointment: the Governor did make it; the critic moved in, unaware that it had been the Director who had recommended him for the post. And, as it sometimes is with a real life story, the two men lived in some better degree of understanding and cooperation ever after, and the critic and the object of the criticism became associates in accomplishment.

That story of the Director and his critic symbolized certain rather obstinate traits and beliefs which have been the fairly consistent trademark
