

But the only reasonable immediate objective, in the opinion of a good many Presidential counselors, is a ot less absolute and a lot more modest: to bring the widening Vietnam conflict utual understanding, under which both sides would act in tandem, but without any formal agreement, to dampen the struggle."

"By this approach," Geyelin's dispatch from Washington continues, "hostilities might well drag on indefinitely; the intensity of the fighting might not even diminish much. But the direction of the war now escalating, would be changed, The U.S. and Hanol might not exchange a serious word. But they would, perhaps without even acknowledging it; ex-

change acts."

The exchange of Christmas beyons, followed by the American half in bombing North Vietnam, leaves the next, move up to Hanol.
