### Board Seeks Federal Grant For Lutz Project Outdoors

The board of education last night decided to seek a \$12,000 federal grant as a first step toward the formation of a regional natural science educational center at Lutz Junior Museum's Oak Grove Nature Center.

The board heard Mrs. Madeline McAuley, director of Lutz; Dr. Philip Sumner, its president; and Walter Schmitt, vice president, explain the concept and purpose of the proposed program.

Called "Project Outdoors," the program envisions a regional science educational center on the museum's 25-acre nature site off Oak Grove St. that hopefully will serve not only Manchester but also surrounding communities of Andover, Bolton, Columbia, Coventry, Glassboro, Hebron, Marlborough, South Windsor, Tolland and Vernon, should they wish to participate.

Plans for the planning grant, Mrs. McAuley emphasized, would be 100 per cent federally provided under Title III of the federal aid to education law, as would later funds for the construction of the program.

The purpose of such a regional center, Mrs. McAuley told the board, would be primarily to provide workshop courses and instructional materials in natural science education for teachers, who would then take their newly acquired skills and understandings back to their students and utilize them in their own school situations.

The limited size of the site would prohibit its extensive use for direct nature study by all town pupils, as well as those from area towns, Mrs. McAuley noted. In addition there would be the prohibitive costs of bus transportation. However, some direct use by selected elementary classes is planned, she said.

There was considerable discussion among board members over the advisability of putting the project on a regional, rather than a local basis. However, Mrs. McAuley explained that federal authorities give priority to regional projects because they provide better use of the limited funds available.

In line with this, she said that Willimantic State Teachers College has already been invited to participate in the proposed program and has evidenced interest in offering credit courses for its teacher trainees as well as teachers already certified.

The proposed planning grant is for the five months period starting April 1 and ending Sept. 1 and would be followed by a proposal for an operational grant to become effective at the beginning of the next fall term.

If federal authorities grant the funds for the planning grant, it is planned that an advisory board will be formed to be composed



### State Sets Hearing on Rt. 6 Willimantic By-Pass



The state will hold a public hearing on Jan. 13 on a proposed relocation route for the Rt. 6 by-pass around Willimantic. The route begins in Columbia at the intersection of Rt. 6 and Rt. 8 and runs north of past Rt. 8 through the neighborhood of Coventry, before passing north of Willimantic into Mansfield.

In Coventry, the highway would cross only Flinders River Rd. It would cross no roads in Columbia.

According to the state highway department, "All major roads encountered would be grade separated from the expressway by bridging or otherwise treated to preserve local traffic circulation."

Coventry would probably also be the site of a future extension of the multi-lane relocation route. Highway planners say they have no specific route picked for the extension, but that and interchange will be provided in the design of current project to accommodate it.

Rt. 6 is also being relocated around Manchester. The section of multi-lane highway there will end in Bolton Notch, although cross-country connector running to the south of the Notch is being considered. This would eventually connect with the section of Rt. 6 which will by-pass Willimantic.

The highway department says that engineering for the Willimantic by-pass will begin upon completion of planning for the project, although no timetable is available for the planning phase.

Right-of-way acquisition could begin in the summer of 1968, the department says. In that case, the highway would advertise for construction bids in the summer of 1969.

When right-of-way acquisition gets underway, the department says, the state will be prepared to offer relocation advisory assistance to the occupants of houses that will be taken to make way for the highway. Occupants will be referred, if they wish, to agencies maintaining lists of available houses for sale.

The Willimantic relocation was made available for the project.

The hearing will be at 8 p.m. Jan. 13 in the Mansfield Town Hall on Conn. Rt. 195 in Mansfield.

### Most Steel Firms Wary About Joining Price Boosts

WASHINGTON (AP)—Under notice that the government won't do business with the price-booster, the bulk of the nation's steelmakers showed wariness today about joining the Bethlehem Steel Corp. in its structural steel price increase.

A matching \$5 a ton increase by Inland Steel Corp. took effect today, four days after Bethlehem's announcement on price boosts for structural steel framing. A small producer, Colorado Fuel & Iron Corp., posted a \$3 increase.

But this was hardly a price parade. Other companies said they were "studying" the question, and giant United States Steel Corp. said that "it may be some time" before it decides what to do.

In an attempt to dissuade the doubtful firms — and thus perhaps to force price rollbacks by Bethlehem and Inland — top military and civilian officials issued orders calling, in effect, for a government boycott of the higher-priced steel.

There was every indication of a concerted drive by the administration and its key supporters in Congress. This raised speculation whether President Johnson was not raising his remarkably durable popularity with business leaders.

But Johnson himself was silent. And the most sensitive indicator of business psychology, the stock market, reflected neither by a government boycott of the higher-priced steel.

As if by prearrangement, five Democratic senators issued statements late Monday deploring the price boosts, endorsing the White House effort to roll them back, and calling for a congressional investigation.

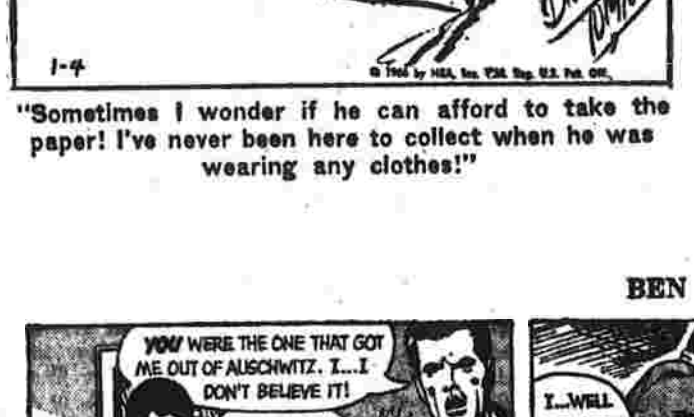
