may have plenty of time to write his memoirs, in the peaceful seclusion of some federal institution, and that the only value those memoirs may have may lie in their readability. The Federal grand jury which has been studying Mr. Baker's affairs has been fascinated with the way he was apparently able to show more assets for the purposes of bank loans than for purposes of reporting his income, and it appears to have thought it traced some of the transactions which helped a \$19,000 a year Senate employe to live and act like a millionaire in such specific and illegal detail as to warrant a series of indictments.

Tribute To Dr. Hill
Relatively few people have the opportunity to see a memorial to themselves
in stone and cement before they pass
from this life. One was G. Albert Hill, former state highway commissioner, who died in Middletown last Tuesday. For the Connecticut Turnpike is a memorial to Dr. Hill. In the 10 years that have elapsed since he left the top post in the State Highway Department, Dr. Hill had seen this superhighway, which cost nearly half a billion dollars and constitutes Connecticut's greatest single construction project, grow and

single construction project, grow and his adopted state grow with it.

True, the turnpike was not alone the creation of Dr. Hill. Many others shared in it. They included William J. Coc. Dr. Hill's predecessor as highway commissioner, who conceived it: First Selectman Herbert E. Baldwin of Westport who introduced the hill calling for it: editors, civic leaders, legislators and policical leaders, some now dead, who fought steadfastly for it; Lawrence M.
